**Series Notes:** Alabama and Vanderbilt will square off for the 87th time when the two teams meet on Saturday afternoon inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide holds a 63-19-4 (61-20-4 NCAA) all-time series advantage, including a 17-1 mark in Tuscaloosa and a 32-6-2 record as the home team. The Tide is currently riding an 11-game home winning streak over Vandy. Alabama head coach Kalen DeBoer is 0-1 against the Commodores. Vanderbilt head coach Clark Lea is 1-1 all-time against the Crimson Tide.

**ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY:** The Crimson Tide will be making its 61st appearance overall (39-21, .650) on ESPN's College GameDay when the popular pregame show airs live from Tuscaloosa this Saturday. Including Saturday's appearance prior to the matchup with Vanderbilt, Alabama trails only Ohio State's total of 67 for the most appearances on GameDay by any one program in the show's history. The Crimson Tide's 39 wins entering Saturday stand as the second-most when appearing on the show, trailing only the 47 victories by the Buckeyes.

**THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF SABAN FIELD AT BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM:** Alabama boasts the best all-time home winning percentage in the FBS with an .844 (306-55-3) mark inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium since its opening in 1929. Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (297-63), which opened in 1970, is the next closest in second at .825.

**STREAKING AT HOME:** Alabama is currently riding a 14-game home winning streak dating back to the Tide's Sept. 23 win over Ole Miss during the 2023 season. The Crimson Tide's last loss inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium came on Sept. 9 of that '23 campaign when UA fell to 11th-ranked Texas, 34-24. Alabama's 14-game home winning streak is tied for the third-longest active home winning streak in Division I.

**BEATING THE BEST:** The Crimson Tide is 84-23 (.785) against the Associated Press Top 25 since the start of 2008. That record includes Alabama's 24-21 win at then-No. 5 Georgia on Sept. 27. The Tide had three ranked wins in 2024, including Alabama's 42-13 win over then-No. 14 LSU on Nov. 9, a 34-0 win over then-No. 21 Missouri on Oct. 26 and a 41-34 win over then-No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 28. Since 2007, Alabama has 27 wins over AP top-five teams, the most in the country. LSU has produced the next-closest win total with 13.

**DEBOER AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS:** Alabama head coach Kalen DeBoer is 16-3 across 19 career matchups with teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25, including an impressive 6-1 mark against top-10 teams. DeBoer owns a 4-1 record against AP Top 25 opponents since beginning his tenure with Alabama in 2024, including the Tide's 24-21 win at then-No. 5 Georgia on Sept. 27 as well as last season's 42-13 win over then-No. 14 LSU on Nov. 9, a 34-0 win over then-No. 21 Missouri on Oct. 26 and a 41-34 win over then-No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 28. DeBoer's first career matchup against a top-25 foe at the FBS level came at Fresno State on Sept. 4, 2021, with the Bulldogs falling at No. 11 Oregon. Following the loss to the Ducks, DeBoer-led teams at Fresno and Washington proceeded to reel off 12 straight wins against ranked foes, including six victories in 2024. The winning streak was snapped following Washington's 34-13 loss to top-ranked Michigan in the 2025 CFP National Championship Game.

**ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL:** Alabama's No. 10 ranking in the Week 6 edition of the Associated Press Poll marked the 284th consecutive week that the Crimson Tide has appeared in the poll. That streak is the longest active streak in college football. The 284 weeks more than doubles second-place Georgia with the Bulldogs appearing in the poll for 138 consecutive weeks. Alabama's 284 straight weeks tops the Crimson Tide's previous program-long streak of 105 consecutive weeks under head coach Gene Stallings in the mid-1990s.

**ALABAMA IN THE AP SINCE 2008:** Alabama began the 2008 season at No. 24 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a dominant 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in Atlanta, and since that win over the Tigers, UA has not exited the 283 polls that have followed. According to the College Poll Archive, the Tide is the only team to be represented on all 284 editions of the poll from the start of the 2008 season to the current week. The next closest team is Ohio State with 269 appearances followed by Oklahoma at 250. Alabama has spent 91.5 percent of the 18-plus years ranked in the top 10. A whopping 77.5 percent of that time Alabama has been ranked in the top five. The Crimson Tide has also been ranked No. 1 a total of 110 times since 2008. Only 14 other teams have earned the No. 1 ranking over that time, with the second-most appearances coming from Georgia at 40 and Clemson in third at 23.

**ALABAMA HAS THE MOST WINS SINCE 2008:** Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 211 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. That sum is 15 more than Ohio State who owns the next-closest win total over that stretch at 196.

**2025 TEAM CAPTAINS:** The Crimson Tide's 2025 team captains were announced after practice on Aug. 21. As selected by their teammates, Parker Brailsford, Tim Keenan III, Deontae Lawson and Ty Simpson were each named permanent team captains for the season. The honor marks the second year in a row Lawson was voted a team captain, becoming just the 16th player in program history to be named a two-time team captain.

**NOT SINCE 1931:** Head coach Kalen DeBoer produced a 9-4 record in his inaugural season at the Capstone. DeBoer's nine wins finished tied for the most by a first-year head coach at Alabama, sharing the feat with Frank Thomas, who won nine games in his initial season leading the Crimson Tide in 1931.

**YEAR TWO UNDER KDB:** Head coach Kalen DeBoer's teams have produced significant improvements in the second season of his previous coaching tenures. Following an 11-2 overall record and a berth in the semifinals of the NAIA Championship Series after his inaugural season at Sioux Falls in 2005, DeBoer advanced the Cougars to a perfect 14-0 record in 2006, winning the NAIA National Championship. After managing a 3-3 finish with Fresno State in his debut season in 2020, DeBoer proceeded to win six more games in 2021 with the Bulldogs finishing 9-3 under his watch. Most recently, DeBoer led Washington to a College Football Playoff National Championship berth in his second season with the Huskies in 2023, tallying a 14-1 overall record. Washington was 11-2 in DeBoer's initial campaign in Seattle the year prior.

**ALWAYS IN THE HUNT:** Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 200 of 206 regular season games that have had national championship implications. The final three games of the 2010 campaign and the final three weeks of the 2022 schedule marked the only six regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 17 seasons.

**ALABAMA REACHES 1K:** With the Oct. 26, 2024 victory over then-No. 21/17 Missouri, Alabama reached 1,000 on-field wins. The Crimson Tide became only the second program in NCAA Division I history to record 1,000 wins (1,003), joining Michigan (1,012). Entering the 2025 season, the Tide's record, as recognized by the NCAA, stands at 974-341-43 (.733), accounting for vacated and forfeited victories.

## ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 896 of the 1,256 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 553-140-8 (.795) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll. Alabama is also ranked in the AP Poll for the 284th consecutive week, topping its previous streak of 105 consecutive polls from 1991-97 under head coach Gene Stallings. The 284 consecutive weeks is the second-longest stretch by any program in the poll's history, trailing only Nebraska's all-time mark of 348 consecutive weeks. Alabama has started nine seasons at No. 1 (2022, 2021, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

## ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches' rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 35 seasons (1991-present) with US LBM coming on the title sponsor of the poll at the start of the 2023 season. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and seven USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) coaches poll national titles.

## OFFENSIVE NOTES

**THE DEBOER-GRUBB COMBO:** On Feb. 6, 2025, head coach Kalen DeBoer announced the hiring of offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb, a veteran play-caller and one of the top offensive minds in football. DeBoer and Grubb have worked alongside one another at multiple stops over the years, producing potent offenses. Now in their fifth season with DeBoer as head coach and Grubb as the offensive coordinator, the pair have combined to post a 40-10 (.800) record while averaging 36.1 points per game and 477.0 yards of total offense per game.

**FIRST YEAR STARTING QBs AT ALABAMA:** With the exit of two-year starter Jalen Milroe, the Crimson Tide has tabbed Ty Simpson as its starting quarterback in 2025. Since 2009, a total of nine quarterbacks have maintained their starting role for 10-plus games of a season in which they were named QB1 for the first time. The list of nine includes: Milroe (2023), Bryce Young (2021), Mac Jones (2020), Tua Tagovailoa (2018), Jalen Hurts (2016), Jake Coker (2015), Blake Sims (2014), AJ McCarron (2011) and Greg McElroy (2009). All but McCarron won an SEC Championship in their first season at quarterback while four upperclassmen (redshirt sophomore or above) won national titles - Jones (redshirt junior), Coker (senior), McCarron (redshirt sophomore) and McElroy (junior).

**TY TAKES OVER:** Ty Simpson was named the starting quarterback by head coach Kalen DeBoer on Aug. 11, replacing two-year starter Jalen Milroe, who was drafted in the third round (92nd overall) by the Seattle Seahawks in the 2025 NFL Draft. Simpson made his first career start at Florida State on Aug. 30, completing 23-of-43 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns while adding nine carries for 17 yards. Simpson became the first UA quarterback since Bryce Young in 2021 to manage a touchdown pass in the first drive of his first-ever start, finding Josh Cuevas for a two-yard score. Simpson's 254 passing yards were also the fifth-most by a UA quarterback in his first career start in program history. In his outing against Wisconsin on Sept. 13, Simpson managed 382 passing yards and four touchdowns passes, both marking new career highs.

**EPITOME OF EFFICIENCY:** Through four games, Ty Simpson has shined in his new role as the Crimson Tide's starting quarterback. In his first four starts, Simpson has completed 88-of-127 passes (69.3 percent) for 1,138 yards and 11 touchdowns while adding 21 carries for 57 yards and two scores. Below is a look at where Simpson stands in the SEC and nationally among signal-callers.

**PERFECT FROM THE POCKET:** Ty Simpson finished a perfect 17-of-17 for 226 yards and three touchdowns in Alabama's 73-0 win over ULM on Sept. 6. Simpson became just the third quarterback in SEC history to manage a perfect 100 percent completion percentage following a minimum of 10 passing attempts, as his 17 completions on as many attempts are the most by a quarterback in league history. Simpson surpassed LSU's Rohan Davey, who completed 11-of-11 passes against Western Carolina in 2000.

**CONSECUTIVE COMPLETIONS:** After a perfect weekend against ULM, Ty Simpson carried his streak of 17 consecutive completions into the following week's contest against Wisconsin on Sept. 13. Simpson completed his first pass against the Badgers to extend his streak to 18 consecutive completions before an incompleteness on his second attempt. Simpson's 18 consecutive completions trail only Mac Jones' program record of 19 consecutive completions that spanned Oct. 17-24, 2020, against Georgia and Tennessee.

**MR. RELIABLE:** Germie Bernard was one of the most consistent wideouts in college football a season ago and has maintained his form through four games in 2025. After leading all Tide receivers in receptions (50) and finishing second in receiving yards (794) last season, Bernard currently paces UA wideouts in receptions (20), receiving yards (310) and receiving touchdowns (4). The senior's 310 receiving yards are 13th-most in the SEC and are 63rd among all Division I receivers. Bernard's 77.5 receiving yards per game is the sixth-highest average among SEC wideouts while placing him 39th among all Division I receivers.

**A SWISS ARMY KNIFE:** Josh Cuevas earned a more prominent role at tight end for the Crimson Tide in 2025 and has delivered in more ways than one. Cuevas has totaled 10 catches for 91 yards and two touchdowns in four games so far this season. Cuevas has also shown his mettle as a pass protector, managing a 78.1 pass blocking grade from Pro Football Focus, the second-highest pass blocking grade among Division I tight ends.

**NO BETTER CENTER:** Alabama center Parker Brailsford continues to showcase his talent in the middle of the Tide's offensive line. Through four games, Brailsford has protected for 157 dropbacks according to Pro Football Focus, allowing just one quarterback hurry and zero sacks or quarterback hits in that span. Brailsford is responsible for an 84.4 pass blocking grade from PFF, the eighth-highest grade among centers in Division I.

**400+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE:** Alabama has gained 400-plus yards of total offense in 75 of its last 100 games, dating back to the start of the 2018 season. The Crimson Tide produced 400-plus yards of offense for the second time this season against Wisconsin on Sept. 13, amassing 454 yards of total offense. Alabama also finished with 583 total yards against ULM on Sept. 6. In the 25 instances where the offense did not go over 400 yards, Alabama is 17-8.

**500+ YARDS OF OFFENSE:** With 583 yards of offense in the 73-0 win over ULM on Sept. 6, Alabama has eclipsed 500 yards of offense in 61 games since the start of the 2015 season. The 61 instances include three games in 2024 when UA went for 500-plus against Western Kentucky (600), Georgia (547) and Mercer (508). The Crimson Tide accumulated 500-plus twice in 2023 along with seven times apiece in both 2022 and 2021. Additionally, the Tide went for 500-or-better eight times in 2020 and nine times in 2019, with the 2018 roster setting the Alabama single-season record with 500-or-more yards in 12 contests.

**600+ YARDS OF OFFENSE:** Alabama totaled 600 yards of offense in the 63-0 win over Western Kentucky to open the 2024 campaign. The 600-plus yard performance marked the 15th instance in program history that the Tide has been at or above 600 yards.

**TAKING CARE OF THE FOOTBALL:** Over its first four contests, the Alabama offense has not surrendered a turnover, joining UConn and Temple as one of just three teams entering Week 6 yet to record a giveaway. Of those three, the Tide's plus-seven turnover margin is the highest in the group.

**THIRD DOWN CONVERSIONS:** The Alabama offense has been among the most successful units in converting third downs so far in 2025. Through four games, the Tide has converted 30-of-55 (54.5 percent) third down tries, the fourth-best mark in the SEC and the 13th-best rate in the FBS. The Crimson Tide converted 13-of-19 third down opportunities in its 24-21 win at then-No. 5/3 Georgia on Sept. 27, the most third down conversions allowed by UGA in the last 30 seasons.

**RAIDING THE AIR:** The Alabama quarterback room is averaging 321.8 passing yards per game over its first four contests, the third-highest average in the SEC and the 10th-best figure in the nation.

**AERIAL ASSAULT:** Alabama saw three different quarterbacks produce seven touchdown passes in the Tide's 73-0 win over ULM on Sept. 6. The seven touchdowns through the air matched UA's program record for touchdown passes in a single game previously set against Southern Miss on Nov. 11, 1950.

**MOST PPG SINCE 2018:** Alabama has produced a scoring average of 41.2 points per game in 100 games since 2018, the highest scoring margin among all Division I teams in that span. Ohio State owns the second-highest points per game mark over that time, managing a 40.6 points per game average.

**OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** The Crimson Tide has won 60 of its last 62 games when scoring a touchdown on the first offensive possession of the game. The most recent instance came against on Sept. 27 when Ty Simpson found Germie Bernard for a six-yard touchdown pass to open the night's scoring at then-No. 5/3 Georgia. Alabama's only two losses during the current stretch occurred at Florida State on Aug. 30 earlier this season and at Texas A&M on Oct. 9, 2021.

**SCORING STREAK CONTINUES:** Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 327 thanks to Germie Bernard's six-yard touchdown reception at then-No. 5/3 Georgia on Sept. 27. The Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama owns a 262-65 (.800) record over the course of the current streak.

**BALL PROTECTION:** In the last 236 games (dating back to the start of the 2008 season), Alabama has turned the ball over only 252 times (133 fumbles, 119 interceptions) for an average of 1.06 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 234 times in 224 games (1.04/game). The 234 turnovers since 2009 includes 99 interceptions in 5,986 attempts (one interception every 60.4 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 33 lost fumbles in 5,741 carries (one fumble lost every 173.9 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

**HUBBARD NAMED SEC DEFENSIVE POTW:** Bray Hubbard was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 15 following his standout performance against Wisconsin on Sept. 13. Hubbard collected five total tackles and two interceptions against the Badgers, helping limit Wisconsin to just one offensive score and only 209 yards of total offense. The league honor was the first of Hubbard's Alabama career. Hubbard was also named the Panini Senior Bowl Defensive Player of the Week as well as the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award Defensive Back of the Week for his efforts against Wisconsin.

**THIS IS THE BRAY:** Bray Hubbard has been a force for the Tide defense through four games so far in 2025. The junior safety owns 22 total tackles, including one and a half for loss for loss (-3 yards), to go with two interceptions, one forced fumble, one quarterback hurry and one pass breakup. Hubbard's 22 tackles are second-most among all Alabama defenders, while he is responsible for three of the Tide's seven takeaways.

**JJ ALL THE WAY:** Linebacker Justin Jefferson has taken on an elevated role at the second level of the Crimson Tide defense in 2025. Jefferson enters the matchup with No. 16 Vanderbilt with 21 total tackles, a half tackle for loss (-1 yard), one interception, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry in his first four games. Jefferson has succeeded mightily in coverage, owning an 86.8 coverage grade from Pro Football Focus, the fifth-ranked coverage grade among all linebackers in Division I.

**ON THE MARGINS:** Alabama has created seven turnovers over its first four games, including four fumbles and three interceptions. As a result, UA is one of only five Division I programs responsible for at least a plus-seven turnover margin so far in 2025. More specifically, Alabama's 1.75 turnovers per game mark is tied with Maryland for the top figure in the nation.

**MAKING IT TOUGH:** The Tide defense has been difficult to maneuver over its first four outings, allowing just 274.0 total yards per game to begin the 2025 season. The 274.0 total yards allowed stands as the fourth-best mark in the conference and the 19th-best figure in the country.

**YOU SHALL NOT PASS:** The Crimson Tide has been stout in its pass defense through four games so far this season. Alabama has allowed an average of just 113.5 passing yards over its first four contests, the best figure in the SEC and the second-best mark in the NCAA.

**GETTING OFF THE FIELD:** Alabama has surrendered just 60 first down conversions through four games, the fifth-fewest allowed in the SEC and the 18th-fewest among all Division I defenses.

**BACKFIELD BARRAGE:** The Alabama defense tallied 12.0 tackles for loss (-31 yards) in the Tide's 73-0 win over ULM on Sept. 6. The 12.0 tackles for loss were the most by a UA defense since Nov. 27, 2021, when Alabama recorded 15.0 tackles for loss (-70 yards) at Auburn in a four-overtime affair. The Tide's 12.0 tackles for loss against the Warhawks are the most recorded in regulation since Nov. 13, 2021 against New Mexico State when Alabama matched the total with 12.0 tackles for loss (-44 yards).

**TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS:** Alabama has forced at least one turnover in 126 of the last 143 contests (dating back to the start of the 2015 season). During the current run, Alabama has forced 229 turnovers (145 interceptions, 84 fumbles) and returned 43 of those miscues for touchdowns.

**SHUTOUTS SINCE 2007:** Since 2007, Alabama has recorded 29 shutouts, including 13 in Southeastern Conference play. The Crimson Tide most recently kept ULM off the scoreboard in its 73-0 win on Sept. 6, the largest margin of victory in a shutout in program history, surpassing the previous best margin of 66-0 against Cal on Sept. 15, 1973. Alabama produced two shutouts in 2024, including a 34-0 win over then-No. 21/17 Missouri on Oct. 26 and a 63-0 win over Western Kentucky on Aug. 31. The Crimson Tide defense has 13 more shutouts than its nearest competitor, with Ohio State's 16 shutouts the next-closest total in that span.

**HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE:** Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 402 touchdowns over the last 225 games. That is 48 fewer than second-place Iowa (450).

**TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND:** Alabama's defense has been a force in the run game since 2007. More recently, the Tide has given up just 110 rushing scores in the last 143 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season). Since 2007, UA has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the nation at 166, a total that is 22 fewer than second-place Iowa (188).

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

**A FRESH START ON SPECIAL TEAMS:** Following the graduations of punter James Burnip, long snapper Kneeland Hibbett and placekicker Graham Nicholson, the Crimson Tide was tasked with replacing all three specialists this season for the first time since 2010.

**PUNT RETURN PROWESS:** The Crimson Tide has excelled at defending punts early on in 2025. Alabama's 3.00 yards per punt return average sits as the fourth-lowest mark in the SEC and is the 32nd-best number in the country.

## SERIES NOTES

**THE ALABAMA-VANDERBILT SERIES:** Alabama and Vanderbilt will meet for the 87th time in series history when the two teams square off on Saturday afternoon inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide holds a 63-19-4 (61-20-4 NCAA) advantage over the Commodores, including a 17-1 mark in Tuscaloosa, and is currently riding an 11-game home winning streak over Vandy.

## GENERAL NOTES

**ALABAMA DEGREES:** Alabama has seen significant success on the field over the last 17 seasons and that success has coincided with the Tide's efforts in the classroom. The 2025 squad is no exception as the Crimson Tide entered the season with 16 student-athletes who already had their degree in-hand. The list of student-athletes who entered 2025 with an SEC Graduate patch include: Parker Brailsford, Prince Butler, MJ Chirgwin, Josh Cuevas, Blake Doud, Nikhai Hill-Green, Justin Jefferson, Tim Keenan III, Peter Knudson, Jah-Marien Latham, Deontae Lawson, Danny Lewis Jr., Jam Miller, Jaeden Roberts, Ty Simpson and Geno VanDeMark.

**CHAMPIONS IN THE CLASSROOM:** Alabama's achievements in the classroom have been most impressive during national title seasons. Those six squads (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) included 139 student-athletes who had earned their degrees prior to game time.

**APR SUCCESS:** According to the most recent Academic Progress Rate (APR) numbers that were announced by the NCAA in May of 2025, figures that cover the four-year period extending from the 2020-21 through 2023-24 school years, the Crimson Tide continued to score well above the national cutoff standard. The Crimson Tide boasted 10 teams that led their respective sport in the SEC in APR numbers with 12 UA squads setting or tying all-time program-high marks for the four-year average. Altogether, it adds up to an average APR score of 994.9 across the university's 21 sports. In fact, this year's report marks the fourth consecutive year Alabama's overall average score rated over a 992. A total of seven Alabama teams led the nation in APR rankings (men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, softball, women's tennis and volleyball), with women's golf earning the honor for the 14th consecutive year.

**VERTON NAMED TO WUERFFEL TROPHY WATCH LIST:** Alabama defensive lineman LT Overton was one of 116 candidates named to the 2025 Allstate Wuerffel Trophy Watch List, the Wuerffel Foundation announced July 31. Widely regarded as college football's premier award for community service, the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy celebrates student-athletes who use their platforms to serve others and create positive change. Overton has grown into a consistent volunteer since arriving in Tuscaloosa, using his platform to benefit the community and underprivileged youth. The Georgia native has made frequent stops at the Tuscaloosa Juvenile Detention Center to mentor at-risk children, also appearing at local schools in town to speak to students regarding the importance of academics. His service commitments also include the Boys & Girls Club and the Two Roads Autism Center, with Overton sponsoring a student at his alma mater, Milton (Ga.) High School, providing equipment funds for multiple sports. Former Crimson Tide offensive lineman Barrett Jones stands as the lone recipient of Wuerffel Trophy, earning the honor in 2011.

**SABAN TO THE HALL:** Former Alabama head coach Nick Saban was selected as part of the 2025 College Football Hall of Fame class, the National Football Foundation announced on Jan. 10. A seven-time national championship coach, Saban is the fifth Alabama coach to be elected to the College Football Hall of Fame and the 27th inductee in program history. He completed his Hall-of-Fame career at the conclusion of the 2023 season, winning six national championships with Alabama and seven overall with his first title coming at LSU in 2003. A nine-time National Coach of the Year, Saban coached collegiate football for 28 seasons, producing a 297-71-1 (.806) record, including a 206-29 (.877) mark in Tuscaloosa. His teams at Alabama won nine SEC Championships while he captured 11 SEC titles in his career (2001 and 2003 at LSU).

**222 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 236 GAMES:** The Crimson Tide's matchup at then-No. 5/3 Georgia last weekend was the Tide's 222nd nationally televised or streamed game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of 2014.

**ALABAMA vs. No. 1:** Alabama owns the NCAA record for the most wins all-time against the Associated Press Poll's No. 1 team since the poll was introduced in 1936. The Crimson Tide has compiled 11 wins against the AP's top-ranked team in program history, most recently against then-No. 1 Georgia in the 2023 Southeastern Conference Championship Game. Prior to that, the Tide downed the top-ranked Bulldogs in the 2021 SEC Championship Game.

**AGAINST THE TOP 10:** Alabama owns an 87-80-1 (.516) all-time record against teams ranked in the top-10 of the Associated Press Poll, including the Tide's 24-21 win at then-No. 5 Georgia on Sept. 27. Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 38-14 (.730) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 23-8 (.741) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff.

**ALABAMA-U.S. NAVY PARTNERSHIP:** The University of Alabama announced on Sept. 3 a significant partnership with the U.S. Navy's Maritime Industrial Base (MIB) Program to expand workforce development opportunities across Alabama and strengthen America's shipbuilding industrial base. As part of the initiative Build Giants Alabama, Crimson Tide fans will notice the program's logo featured on Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium during all home football games this fall as well as in-venue messaging featuring former Alabama head football coach Nick Saban on the importance of the Build Giants Alabama initiative. The visibility highlights a larger effort to connect Alabama's statewide talent with a critical workforce development program for the state and the country.

## BAMA IN THE NFL

**LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL:** As of the 2025 NFL Draft, Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 17 drafts (140) than any other program in the nation. The list of 140 features 16 Super Bowl champions, 44 Pro Bowl selections and 20 First Team All-Pro members along with one Defensive Player of the Year, one Offensive and one Defensive Rookie of the Year.

**2025 NFL DRAFT:** The Crimson Tide saw seven former players selected in the 2025 NFL Draft, including two first-rounders in offensive lineman Tyler Booker (No. 12, Dallas Cowboys) and linebacker Jihaad Campbell (No. 31, Philadelphia Eagles). The third round featured quarterback Jalen Milroe (Seattle Seahawks), while the fourth round saw defensive back Malachi Moore (New York Jets) and linebacker Que Robinson (Denver Broncos) selected by their respective franchises. Day three concluded with the Seahawks adding tight end Robbie Ouzts (fifth round) before defensive tackle Tim Smith was picked by the Indianapolis Colts in the sixth round.

**QUICK HITS ON ALABAMA'S NFL DRAFT SUCCESS:** Below is a look at some of Alabama's recent success in the NFL Draft.

- Over the last 17 NFL Drafts, Alabama has produced 140 total picks which is more than any other program in the nation. Of those 140, an impressive 49 (35.0 percent) have been first-rounders.
- Since 2000, the Crimson Tide has produced an NCAA-leading 51 first-rounders, a number that is nine better than the next closest school Ohio State (42)
- Since 2010, Alabama has had an NCAA-best 48 players selected in the first round, a number that nearly doubles the next closest school in OSU (29).

- With the selection of Tyler Booker in the 2025 NFL Draft, Alabama has had at least one player selected in the first round of 17 straight drafts (2009-present) to set the new NCAA record. The Crimson Tide passed Miami (1995-2008), who owned the old mark of 14 consecutive first-rounders.
- Alabama has produced multiple first round picks in 14 of the last 17 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.

**CRIMSON TIDE IN THE NFL:** Alabama entered Week 4 of the 2025-26 NFL regular season with 69 players on rosters (including reserve/practice squad) and is represented on 26 of the league's 32 teams. Alabama had 69 total players (including reserve/practice squad) overall and 62 on an active 53-man roster in Week 1 of the 2025-26 regular season, the most of any program in college football. The next closest schools for active players were Georgia and Ohio State with 57 followed by Michigan at 44 and LSU and Notre Dame with 39 apiece to round out the top five. **LEADERS IN THE LEAGUE:** Every year, the National Football League allows each of its 32 teams to name up to eight team captains. The start of the 2025-26 season featured eight former Crimson Tide players who were selected as one of the permanent captains for their respective squads. The list of captains to start the year included Will Anderson Jr. (Texans), Bradley Bozeman (Chargers), Jalen Hurts (Eagles), Calvin Ridley (Titans), Tua Tagovailoa (Dolphins), Quinnen Williams (Jets), Mack Wilson Sr. (Cardinals) and Bryce Young (Panthers). Despite featuring Alabama players on their rosters, the Commanders, Cowboys, Packers, Ravens and Seahawks all do not name permanent team captains for the season or select captains on a game-by-game basis.

**75 IN A SEASON:** A total of 75 former Crimson Tide players appeared in a game and recorded at least one snap through all 18 weeks of the 2024-25 regular season, setting a new NFL record. The 75 topped the previous mark of 71, which was also set by UA during the 2023-24 campaign. Prior to that, the Tide became the only program to have 70 former players see game action in any regular season in league history during 2022-23 season. The number of former Alabama players to play in an NFL regular-season contest has now increased each year for eight consecutive seasons starting with 38 in 2016. The 2017 season saw 44 former players earn game action, breaking Alabama's previous record of 40 in 1987, and was followed by 52 in 2018. The total moved to 62 in 2019, followed by 64 in 2020, 68 in 2021, 70 in 2022 and 71 in 2023.

**POSTSEASON TIDE:** Alabama was well-represented in the 2024-25 NFL Playoffs with a league-high 38 former players spotting 12 of the 14 rosters. The Tide's postseason players were as follows: six apiece on both the Eagles (Dickerson, Hurts, Ricks, D. Smith, Steen, By. Young) and Texans (Anderson Jr., Averett, C. Harris, Metchie III, Smith Jr., To'oTo'o); four apiece on the Chargers (Bozeman, Eboigbe, E. Jackson, Scott), Lions (Arnold, Branch, Gibbs, Ja. Williams) and Ravens (Armour-Davis, Dalcourt, Henry, Humphrey); three apiece on the Commanders (Allen, Payne, Robinson Jr.) and Vikings (Reichard, C. Robinson, Turner); two apiece on the Bills (Cooper, K. Jackson), Packers (Jacobs, McKinney) and Steelers (Fitzpatrick, N. Harris); and one total on the Broncos (Surtain II) and Buccaneers (Braswell).

**ALL-PRO DBU:** Alabama had three defensive backs selected to the 2024 All-Pro Team, as voted on by the Associated Press. The trio included Patrick Surtain II (cornerback), Xavier McKinney (safety) and Marlon Humphrey (slot corner). Surtain II received the most votes of any defensive player with 49 first-team votes and one second-team selection out of the 50 total voters. Additionally, Derrick Henry was selected to the All-Pro Second Team at running back.

**CERTAINLY SURTAIN:** Former Alabama defensive back Patrick Surtain II was named the 2024 Associated Press NFL Defensive Player of the Year on Feb. 6, becoming just the second Denver Broncos player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first former UA player to be named Defensive Player of the Year since the award was created in 1971. Surtain is just 10th player in NFL history — joining the likes of Hall of Famers Lawrence Taylor and Reggie White — to earn Defensive Player of the Year and a pair of first team All-Pro selections in his first four NFL seasons. In addition to tying a career high with four interceptions and posting double-digit passes defended, Surtain II ranked at the top of the league in nearly every advanced metric. Among cornerbacks with at least 400 coverage snaps, Surtain II ranked first in fewest yards allowed (306), fewest yards allowed per coverage snap (0.6), lowest target rate (10.9 percent) and fewest air yards per target (7.1), according to Next Gen Stats.

- Kalen DeBoer has produced unprecedented results at every stop of his coaching career. His hard work and dedication to his craft has shaped one of the most impressive resumes in college football after just 10 years as a head coach.

- DeBoer's coaching philosophy stresses the importance of class, integrity and academic success. He has a passion for bringing people together while building the total program. DeBoer believes in creating an environment that allows his players to thrive. He holds a deep commitment to developing the young men in his program and investing in them both on and off the field as they prepare for their next steps in life.

- DeBoer and his staff believe in developing players athletically, academically, socially and spiritually so that they leave the program as better men. Beyond winning football games, it is about building a culture within the program that is contagious and producing a team that loves each other and are willing to play for each other.

- There are three non-negotiables in DeBoer's program that have stood the test of time and resulted in stunning success: family, accountability and toughness.

- During his 27 years in coaching, he has consistently prospered at multiple levels and in different roles, helping to build and revitalize programs while establishing a diverse network of contacts across the country, in both coaching and recruiting. In his first 10 seasons as a head coach, DeBoer accumulated a record of 113-16, which includes a 25-3 record in his previous stop with the Washington Huskies and three NAIA National Championships at Sioux Falls.

- Entering 2025, DeBoer owned a 15-3 record against top-25 teams across his five combined seasons at Fresno State, Washington and Alabama. He also boasted a staggering 26-8 record in one-score contests across his first 10 years as a head coach.

- DeBoer took on an unprecedented challenge in his first season in Tuscaloosa, replacing arguably the greatest coach in the history of college football. The 2025 campaign saw the Crimson Tide finish 9-4, including a 3-1 record against ranked teams. DeBoer's nine victories matched Frank Thomas (1931) for the most wins by a first-year head coach in Alabama history.

- In 2023, he led Washington to the College Football Playoff National Championship Game with a victory over Texas in the Sugar Bowl. DeBoer's '23 group won the Pac-12 Championship and recorded the most wins in a season in program history (14). Additionally, he won the 2023 Associated Press, AFCA, Eddie Robinson, George Munger, Walter Camp, Sporting News and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards.

- DeBoer became the first Washington coach to win 11-or-more games in consecutive seasons after going 11-2 in 2022 and 14-1 in 2023 and the first to win a bowl game in his first season with the Huskies. That success resulted in back-to-back Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors. His Washington squads also went 10-1 against ranked teams, and he is 18-3 in playoff games as a head coach, including his stint at Sioux Falls.

- In his first year at UW, he led the Huskies to an 11-2 overall record after Washington finished 4-8 the previous year. They posted a 3-0 mark against ranked teams and a win over Texas in the Valero Alamo Bowl. His Huskies swept their three Northwest rivals and finished in a tie for second in the Pac-12, while he was named Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year.

- Prior to his time at UW, DeBoer spent two seasons at Fresno State, which included the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs made great strides on both sides of the ball, posting a combined 12-6 record. Fresno was 4-8 in 2019 prior to DeBoer's arrival.

- In 2021, Fresno State went 9-3 under DeBoer. The 2020 season saw the Bulldogs finish at 3-3 overall.

- Prior to Fresno, DeBoer was on staff at Indiana University as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He helped guide the Hoosiers to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl. IU's eight victories in 2019 matched their highest wins total in 26 seasons, and IU ranked No. 3 in the Big Ten in total offense. Indiana averaged 432.8 yards of total offense per game, throwing for 302.4 yards per contest while rushing for 130.4.

- DeBoer joined then-head coach Jeff Tedford as the Fresno State offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2017. In two seasons in that role, DeBoer helped the Bulldogs to overall records of 10-4 (2017) and 12-2 (2018), along with two division titles, two bowl game victories and the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2018.

- After the 2009 season, he took a job at Southern Illinois as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2010 through 2013. He moved to Eastern Michigan as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2014 through 2016, helping the Eagles to their third-ever bowl-game berth in 2016. plays (99).

- A school-record setting wide receiver at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), DeBoer later led his alma mater to three NAIA National Championships in five seasons as head coach, winning titles in 2006, 2008 and 2009, while also finishing as runner-up in 2007 and making the semifinals in his first season as head coach in 2005. During his five seasons at Sioux Falls, DeBoer compiled a 67-3 overall record, including a 49-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference play. He was NAIA National Coach of the Year in each of his three championship seasons at USF.

- A 1998 graduate of Sioux Falls with a degree in secondary education, DeBoer was a record-setting football and baseball student-athlete. During his football career, he compiled 3,400 yards and 33 touchdowns on 234 career receptions — all school records at the time — and played on the 1996 NAIA Division II National Championship team.

- He also played baseball for the Cougars, batting .520 (still a school record) as a senior in 1998. His career average of .492 is tops in USF history, as are his 37 career homers and .944 slugging percentage.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** — No. 21/20 Alabama earned the win in its home opener, taking down ULM 73-0 in front of a sold-out crowd inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

The Crimson Tide totaled 583 yards of offense in the victory while limiting the Warhawks to just 148 total yards. Quarterback Ty Simpson finished a perfect 17-of-17 passing with 226 yards and three touchdowns. Fellow quarterbacks Austin Mack and Keelon Russell also saw time at signal-caller, with Mack completing 8-of-10 passes for 80 yards and two touchdowns, while Russell closed with 65 passing yards and two touchdowns on 4-of-6 passing.

AK Dear paced the Tide backfield, managing 76 rushing yards on five carries, highlighted by a 56-yard touchdown run. Kevin Riley contributed 11 attempts for 69 yards with Richard Young adding six carries for 19 yards and a touchdown. Germie Bernard paced the Alabama receivers with three catches for 67 yards and two touchdowns. Including Bernard, six Alabama receivers recorded at least one touchdown reception.

Defensively, the Crimson Tide defense managed 12 tackles for loss and forced three turnovers, including two forced fumbles and one interception. James Smith led the defensive effort, contributing four total tackles, including three for loss (-7 yards). Dre Kirkpatrick Jr. and QB Reese each forced a fumble while Justin Jefferson picked off a pass.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** — The No. 19/18 Alabama football team earned its second straight victory, defeating Wisconsin, 38-14, in front of a sold-out crowd inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

The Crimson Tide totaled 454 yards of offense, largely attributed to its passing attack. Quarterback Ty Simpson finished the day 24-of-29 passing with 382 yards and four touchdowns while leading all Alabama players with 25 yards on the ground as the result of six carries. The Tide leaned on its receiving corps on Saturday, led by Ryan Williams, who totaled five catches for 165 yards and two touchdowns in the win. Germie Bernard continued his run of form, securing four catches for 62 yards and a touchdown, adding a two-yard rushing score on his lone carry. Isaiah Horton contributed five catches for 48 yards and a touchdown as well.

The Crimson Tide defense managed four sacks and forced two turnovers, highlighted by two interceptions from Bray Hubbard. Deontae Lawson led the defensive effort, contributing nine total tackles, including three solo stops. The Tide consistently forced pressure up front, as LT Overton, Yhonzae Pierre, Qua Russaw, and London Simmons each managed one sack apiece. The Alabama defense surrendered just 209 total yards of offense, limiting the Badgers to only 92 rushing yards.

**ATHENS, Ga.** — The No. 17/16 Alabama football team handed No. 5/3 Georgia its first loss of the season, defeating the Bulldogs, 24-21, Saturday night inside Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium. The Crimson Tide's victory snapped the Bulldogs' 33-game home winning streak, a streak that began in 2019.

Ty Simpson finished 24-of-38 through the air, throwing for 276 passing yards and two touchdowns. The dual-threat quarterback also ran five times for six yards and a touchdown. Isaiah Horton led the Tide receiving corps with five receptions for 65 yards and a touchdown, while Germie Bernard hauled in five catches for 35 yards and a touchdown. Bernard also contributed four rushes for 26 yards.

In his season debut, Jam Miller paced the Tide with 16 carries for 46 rushing yards, as the senior chipped in three receptions for 19 yards, including the game-sealing third down conversion to allow Alabama to run out the remainder of the clock.

Bray Hubbard was the catalyst for the Tide defense, managing nine total tackles, including a half tackle for loss, one forced fumble and one pass breakup. LT Overton and Edric Hill combined to record the lone sack on the night, while the entirety of the Alabama defensive unit totaled six tackles for loss and three pass breakups.
