STORYLINES

OPENING NIGHT SUCCESS

- Vanderbilt kicked off its 136th season of football with a 45-3 win over Charleston Southern in front of a sold-out FirstBank Stadium.
- The victory marked the fourth season-opening victory in a row. marking the longest stretch of wins in season openers since capturing six in a row from 1970-75.
- Vanderbilt scored a touchdown on each of its first three possessions of the night, the first time the Dores opened a game with three touchdown drives since 2017.
- Quartback Diego Pavia completed 20-of-25 passes for 275 yards and three scores to lead the victory. He added 44 rushing yards on eight carries.

NEW FACES FIND THE END ZONE

- Three of Vanderbilt's newest additions all found the end zone in Week 1 with transfer running back Makhilyn Young, sophomore running back Jamezell Lassiter and freshman wide receiver Kayleb Barnett each reaching paydirt.
- Barnett's first collegiate touchdown opened the scoring against Charleston Southern, as the speedster took a jet sweep pass in from
- Young's first TD as a Commodore came in the third quarter as the New Mexico State transfer capped a four-play, 21-yard drive with a 4-yard scamper up the middle. The touchdown was the fourth of Young's collegiate career.
- Lassiter's score completed the 45-point day for Vanderbilt as the sophomore housed his first collegiate carry on a 35-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

CONTROLLING THE SEAS

- The Commodores defense surrendered just 135 total yards to Charleston Southern in the season opener.
- The 135 yards are the eighth-lowest total allowed in the past 30 seasons by the Commodores. It's also the second-lowest output by an opposing offense in the season opener.
- The Commodore defense racked up three sacks and totaled seven stops behind the line of scrimmage.
- Bryce Cowan led the Dores' defense with five tackles, one shy of his career-best six set against Tennessee in 2023.
- Miles Capers led the black and gold with 2.5 tackles for loss, including a strip sack. The forced fumble was the fourth of Capers' career, extending his team-leading total.
- The 2.5 tackles for loss total was a career best for Capers as well.

LAST SEASON WITH THE HOKIES

- Vanderbilt toppled the Hokies in a 34-27 overtime thriller at FirstBank Stadium to open the 2024 campaign in Nashville.
- Diego Pavia, in his first game at quarterback for the Commodores. was electric going 12-of-16 for 190 yards and two touchdowns through the air while adding 104 rushing yards and a TD on the ground.
- Sedrick Alexander added 69 yards as the Dores rolled up 181 rushing yards for a pair of scores.
- Defensive lineman Glenn Seabrooks III snagged an interception off a tipped pass in the win.
- Pavia led a late six-play, 70-yard drive, capped by a TD connection with Alexander to tie the game and force overtime.
- In overtime, Pavia finished a four-play scoring drive with a 4-yard touchdown run. The Commodore defense held on 4th-and-11 from the 12-yard line to earn the victory.

NEW SEASON, NEW HIGHT

- No need to blink, that is junior Martel Hight split out at wide receiver this season. The veteran corner will play both ways for the first time in his collegiate career.
- In his first venture as a two-way player, Hight made two catches for 17 yards and added four tackles on the defensive side of the ball.
- Hight finished the 2024 campaign tied for the team lead with two interceptions, tied for second with four pass breakups and added
- Hight's explosiveness with the ball in his hands was also on display as he averaged 14.7 yards on 18 punt returns and made a 57-yard house call against Alcorn State.

CAPTAINING THE SHIP

- Vanderbilt named eight veterans as team captains for the 2025 season. Commodore captains are voted on and selected by the
- Richie Hoskins, Langston Patterson, Diego Pavia and Marlen Sewell were all selected as captains for a second-straight season. Randon Fontenette, Yilanan Ouattara, Eli Stowers and Khordae Sydnor join the leadership group for their first season as captains.

RICHARDSON REELS 'EM IN

- New Commodore Tre Richardson made an instant spark with a team-leading five receptions against the Bucs for 74 yards.
- Richardson joined the Dores after a prolific season at Washburn in the NCAA Division II ranks where he went for 981 yards on 52 catches with 11 touchdowns.

GAME NOTES

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Eli Stowers has dotted preseason All-America lists this season, garnering first team picks by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, ESPN, Sports Illustrated, Associated Press, The Athletic, The Sporting News, Athlon and Phil Steele.
- Stowers is also one of two Commodores who picked up All-SEC recognition from league coaches in advance of the 2025 season, being tabbed preseason first-team All-SEC while Martel Hight landed a spot on the third team.
- Stowers' first team prognostication is the first for the Dores since the 2013 season when Jordan Matthews, Andre Hal and Casey Spear all earned preseason honors.

 Six different Commodores have picked up preseason watch list recognition, led by Diego Pavia and Eli Stowers on five watch lists.

HOME NEVER LOOKED SO GOOD

- Saturday marked another new milestone at FirstBank Stadium as the south end zone facility made its debut.
- The state-of-the-art facility features living room boxes, loge boxes, club seating, field-level seating, founders' suites, club suites and open-air tailgate suites.

• The south end zone building also houses a new football game day locker room, and will also feature a <u>student-athlete</u> training table and dining facility for all <u>varsity teams</u>.

RELIABLE

- Eli Stowers entered the 2025 season sixth among all active tight ends with 1,004 career receiving yards. All five ahead of Stowers have played four full seasons to Stowers' three-plus at the position.
- Stowers' 12.4 yards per catch career average is tied for third nationally among active tight ends.
- His 638 receiving yards last season were the second-most by a Vanderbilt tight end since 1996. He trailed only the 774 accumulated by Jared Pinkney in 2018. Pinkney, Stowers and Steven Scheu (2014) are the only Vanderbilt tight ends since 1996 to eclipse 500 receiving yards in a season.
- In addition, Stowers is the only Vanderbilt tight end since 1996 to complete a pass in a game after he hit fellow tight end Cole Spence for a 17-yard touchdown in the win over Alcorn State.
- No SEC tight end had more than Stowers' 49.1 receiving yards per game, as he finished the year tied in the category with Texas' Gunnar Helm.
- Stowers became the first Vandy tight end since at least 1996 to have multiple games with 100-plus receiving yards in a season. He had three such games last season after totaling 110 receiving yards vs. Georgia State and 130 vs. Ball State in addition to the Alabama game.
- Stowers became just the sixth tight end since 1996 to register 100-plus receiving yards in a game vs. Alabama:

• Stowers was a semifinalist for the John Mackey Award and selected All-SEC by the league's coaches. He was Vanderbilt's first offensive player to earn first-team All-SEC honors since 2013.

THE BECKONING

- Vanderbilt's offense has been transformed under second-year offensive coordinator Tim Beck's watch.
- Vandy's ESPN FPI offensive efficiency (67.5) ranked 28th in FBS in 2024. It was Vanderbilt's best finish in offensive efficiency since 2005 when the Dores ended up 25th in the metric's first year. Prior to Beck's arrival, Vanderbilt's best finish during Clark Lea's tenure was 76th in 2022.
- The Commodores were the best in the nation at protecting the football, finishing with an FBS-low seven turnovers on the season.
- Vanderbilt also led the SEC and finished third in FBS in red zone offense, getting points on 93.3 percent of its red zone trips (42-for-45).
- Beck was named a semifinalist for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

SEDRICK THE ENTERTAINER

- Running back Sedrick Alexander picked up right where he left off in 2024, going for 83 yards on 12 carries in the season-opening win against Charleston Southern. The 83 yards propelled Alexander past the 1,000-yard mark for his career.
- Alexander also added 26 yards receiving to top 100 all-purpose yards for the first time in his collegiate career.
- Last season, he tallied a career-high 21 carries in the win over top-ranked Alabama on Oct. 5, 2024, matching his career-best with two rushing touchdowns, and was included on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Honorable Mention List for the week.
- He finished his sophomore campaign as the team's second-leading rusher, trailing only Diego Pavia, with 586 yards and six touchdowns. He became the 26th Vandy running back to eclipse 500 rushing yards in a season since 1996 and his total was second among all SEC sophomores.
- The Texan played in all 12 games as a freshman, logging 504 all-purpose yards, 371 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns.
- He led SEC freshmen in rushing yards and touchdowns and was named to the league's All-Freshman team.
- Alexander was named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List entering 2024.

BIRMINGHAM BOWL CHAMPIONS

- For just the fifth time in school history, Vanderbilt football ended its season with a bowl victory as the Commodores defeated Georgia Tech in the Birmingham Bowl to conclude a historic 2024 campaign.
- Vandy beat the Yellow Jackets, 35-27, in Birmingham to clinch its first bowl victory and first winning season since 2013. The win improved the program's all-time postseason record to 5-4-1.
- Diego Pavia was named the game's MVP after he contributed to five touchdowns, a Vanderbilt bowl record. Pavia threw for three scores and rushed for a pair, amassing 245 total yards (160 passing, 85 rushing).
- The Dores were 5-for-5 in the red zone and forced a pair of turnovers in the victory. CJ Taylor intercepted a pass, Aeneas DiCosmo recovered a fumble and Nick Rinaldi made 10 tackles with two sacks. Rinaldi earned a spot on the Associated Press All-Bowl team for his efforts.
- The Birmingham Bowl was a renewal of a rivalry with Georgia Tech which dates back to the founding of the SEC. It was Vandy's first win over the Yellow Jackets since 1941 and returned the Golden Cowbell rivalry trophy to Nashville.



GAME NOTES

DOMINANT DIEGO

- Diego Pavia didn't miss a beat to open the 2025 season, completing 20-of-25 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The 80 percent completion rate was a career best for Pavia when completing 20 or more passes and tied for the second best performance in any game of his career.
- The three passing touchdowns and 275 passing yards both matched Vanderbilt highs for Pavia.
- Pavia's 20 passing touchdowns in 2024 ranked sixth in the SEC. The 20 touchdowns were fifth-most by a Commodore in a season.
- On the ground, Pavia ran for a Vanderbilt QB record 801 yards. That total was the highest by a Power 4 quarterback last season and seventh-most among non-service academy quarterbacks in all of FBS.
- For his career, Pavia capped 2024 second among active FBS quarterbacks with 2,232 rushing yards, trailing only Army's Bryson Daily. In addition, his 6,716 career passing yards ranks 12th among active quarterbacks heading into 2025.
- He was named one of 16 semifinalists for the 88th Maxwell Award, as well as one of 16 semifinalists for the Davey O'Brien Award.
- His performance in the win over top-ranked Alabama on Oct. 5 landed him SEC Offensive Player of the Week. He was also named the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week and the Maxwell Award Player of the Week.
- He became the 13th quarterback since 2004 to defeat Alabama and Auburn in the same season and just the fourth do to so without playing in the SEC West (Stetson Bennett, Deshaun Watson, Matthew Stafford). He is the seventh quarterback in that same time frame to have at least three career wins over the Tigers and Tide, joining Jayden Daniels, Bennett, Joe Burrow, Jarrett Lee, Jordan Jefferson, Stafford and JaMarcus Russell.
- Pavia piloted a deadly efficient offense in 2023 while leading New Mexico State to 10 wins. He ranked among the top 35 in FBS in passing touchdowns, points, passing yards per attempt and passing efficiency that season. In addition, Pavia ranked fifth among FBS quarterbacks in Pro Football Focus' Elusive Rating.

FEWEST INTERCEPTIONS

- Diego Pavia's four interceptions thrown last season were the fewest by a Vanderbilt quarterback in a season with at least 200 attempts since 1996.
- He bettered the mark of five previously held by Jay Cutler (2004), Riley Neal (2019), Jordan Rodgers (2012) and Larry Smith (2010).
- With 298 attempts, Pavia hit the mark with more passing attempts than three of the four who previously held the record (Rodgers had 319 attempts).
- As a team, Vandy's four interceptions last season were the fewest on record (1946). The previous low total for interceptions thrown was five in 2004 and 2012. It was just the 13th time since 1946 that Vanderbilt has thrown fewer than 10 interceptions in a season.

A SEASON TO REMEMBER

- Vanderbilt football's historic season resulted in the Commodores collecting SEC Coach of the Year (Clark Lea) and SEC Newcomer of the Year (Diego Pavia).
- It was the first time since Warren Norman was selected SEC Freshman of the Year in 2009 that Vanderbilt has collected an SEC individual postseason award from the league's coaches.
- Lea was the first SEC Coach of the Year on West End since Bobby Johnson, Lea's own coach as a player at Vandy, in 2008. Johnson led the Commodores to a 7-6 mark and Music City Bowl win, Vandy's first bowl victory at the time since 1955. He shared the award with Alabama's Nick Saban and Houston Nutt from Ole Miss, meaning the last time a Vanderbilt coach won the award outright was in 1982 when George MacIntyre led Vandy to an 8-4 mark and berth in the Hall of Fame Bowl.
- Vanderbilt won six of its first nine games for the first time since 1982, won at Auburn's Jordan-Hare Stadium for the first time ever, defeated Alabama and Auburn in the same season for the first time since 1955, was ranked in the Associated Press poll for the first time since the conclusion of the 2013 season, played a game as a ranked team for the first time since the 2012 Music City Bowl and played a regular season game while ranked for the first time since 2008.
- Pavia collected the SEC's first-ever Newcomer of the Year award. Separate from the Freshman of the Year, Newcomer of the Year recognizes the top transfer student-athlete who has not previously competed in the SEC and is not a freshman in eligibility status.
- Named a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award and Davey O'Brien Award, Pavia threw the fewest interceptions by a Vanderbilt quarterback since at least 1996 (minimum 200 attempts) and had the second-fewest interceptions among SEC quarterbacks last season with at least 250 attempts.
- In addition to the pair of individual awards, four Dores earned All-SEC honors. Eli Stowers was named the first-team tight end, Jesse Mirco (punter) and Martel Hight (return specialist) were chosen for the second team and Brock Taylor was named the third-team kicker.

SPECIAL PLAYS, SPECIAL PLAYERS

- The Commodores return a trio of dangerous special team weapons from one of the best units in the country in 2024. Returners Martel Hight and Junior Sherrill both scored on special teams in 2024 while kicker Brock Taylor dotted his name across the Vandy record book.
- Vanderbilt's special teams efficiency of 69.7 according to ESPN's FPI ranked fifth among FBS programs and led all SEC teams.
- Vandy was third in the SEC and 11th in FBS with 14.72 yards per punt return. Hight led SEC players and was third nationally in punt return average and returned a punt 57 yards for a score against Alcorn State in 2024
- Taylor drilled a program-record 57-yard field goal at Missouri on Sept. 21, 2024. Taylor had five makes of 50 or more yards last season, giving him the career record for 50-plus-yard field goals.
- The Knoxville, Tennessee, native also finished the season with 93 points, second-most in school history. It trailed only kicker Carey Spear's 99-point season in 2013, which included a touchdown.

- Taylor was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week twice. His 18 field goals were second-most by a Commodore in a season. Taylor made his last 11 field goal attempts of the season.
- $\bullet \ In \ the \ regular-season \ finale \ vs. \ Tennessee, \ Junior \ Sherrill \ took \ the \ opening \ kickoff \ back \ 100 \ yards \ for$
- a touchdown, which marked Vandy's first kickoff return for a touchdown since Aug. 26, 2023 vs. Hawai'i.
- The 100-yard return was the longest by a Commodore since Sept. 20, 2014 vs. South Carolina. It was the first kickoff return for a score that Tennessee had given up since the 2021 season when Missouri accomplished the feat.
- Vanderbilt was one of six Power 4 programs with both a punt return and kickoff return for a touchdown in 2024 (BYU, Iowa, North Carolina, Oregon and Wake Forest).
- In addition, it was the first time since 1971 the Commodores scored on a punt return and kickoff return in the same season and just the fourth time on record Vandy scored in both varieties.

BEAR-LEA SCRATCHING THE SURFACE

- Head coach Clark Lea was named the SEC Coach of the Year after leading Vanderbilt to its first postseason appearance since 2018. He's the first Commodore coach to win the award since Bobby Johnson in 2008. Johnson was Lea's coach during his playing career at Vandy.
- Lea was also named AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the National Coach of the Year.
 He also found himself on the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year watch list after Vanderbilt's historical first half of the season.
- Many of the positive developments in the fall came after Lea retooled the coaching staff following the 2023 season. In addition to taking over defensive coordinator duties, Lea hired a new offensive coordinator (Tim Beck), director of sports performance (Robert Stiner) and chief consultant (Jerry Kill).
- With 11 new hires on the football coaching staff and over 50 new student-athletes on the roster, Lea's Commodores made history last fall.
- With victories in six of its first nine games, Vanderbilt recorded its best start since 1982, went to its first bowl game since 2018 and had its first winning season and bowl victory since 2013.
- In addition, the Commodores produced their best scoring margin since 2013 and had a positive scoring margin for just the sixth time since 1975. The 27.3 points per game were the most since 2018 and the 23.4 points allowed per game were fewest since 2015.

BROCKET LAUNCHER

- Brock Taylor continued his run of form, connecting on his lone field goal attempt of the season opener from 35 yards. The make marked Taylor's 12th-straight made field goal dating back to the 2024 sesaon.
- He finished the 2024 campaign with 18 field goals and finished two shy of matching the program record of 20 set by Carey Spear in 2012.
- Taylor made his last 11 field goal attempts of the season over the final eight games (he did not attempt a field goal in the Birmingham Bowl).
- He connected on a program-record 57-yard field goal at Missouri on Sept. 21. Taylor had five makes of 50 or more yards last season, making him the first player in school history with at least five 50-yard-plus field goals.
- Taylor was chosen SEC Special Teams Player of the Week twice this season and was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award on Nov. 19.

HIGHT OF THE RETURN

- Cornerback Martel Hight led the SEC and ranked third in FBS with a 14.72 punt return average. He also tied for the team lead with a pair of interceptions.
- In the win over Alcorn State, Hight became the first Dore with 100-plus punt return yards since Jonathan Krause on Nov. 24, 2012 at Wake Forest (110 yards). Hight's punt return for a touchdown in the game was the first since Krause's at Wake Forest in 2012.
- He became the first Commodore to have 100-plus punt return yards in a season since the 2019 campaign, reaching the mark in just two games.
- When Hight registered a 37-yard interception return for a touchdown against UNLV in 2023, he became the first Vanderbilt freshman in school history to return an interception for a touchdown and the first Dore of any age to do so since 2019.



GAME NOTES

SHERRILL STILL ROLLING

- Junior Sherrill continued his impactful play with three catches and a touchdown in the opening game of the 2025 season. The touchdown grab was the seventh of Sherrill's career to begin his junior season.
- Sherill finished his rookie year with 20 receptions for 293 yards and two touchdowns while playing in all 12 contests. He surpassed all three totals in 10 games last season.
- The Nashvillian has made at least one catch in 25 straight games.
- Sherrill received the opening kickoff vs. Tennessee and returned it 100 yards to the house for Vandy's longest kickoff return for a touchdown since 2014.
- He had a personal-best five catches for 62 yards and a receiving touchdown vs. No. 5/6 Texas on Oct. 26, 2024.
- Sherrill was rated the No. 8 freshman wide receiver in the nation by Pro Football Focus in 2023.

IMPROVEMENT VS. RANKED TEAMS

- In games against opponents in the AP Top 25 at the time of the game, Vanderbilt showed marked statistical improvement, in addition to securing its first-ever win against the No. 1 team in the nation.
- Last season, Vanderbilt averaged 28.5 points per game against ranked teams after scoring 18.0 in 2023 and 5.7 in Lea's debut 2021 campaign.
- In total scoring, Vanderbilt was outscored by just 14 points in four games against ranked teams. The 2022 Dores saw a deficit of 207 points over five games.
- Last year's Commodores allowed 32.0 points per game to ranked teams compared to 39.0 in 2023 and
- Vanderbilt averaged over 300 yards of total offense against ranked teams last season for the first time under Lea, while holding ranked opponents under 450 yards per game for the first time in that span.
- The Commodores scored 12 touchdowns in their four games against ranked teams after scoring just one offensive touchdown in three such games during Lea's initial 2021 season.
- Individually, Diego Pavia led Vandy in both rushing and passing against the top 25, averaging 63 yards on the ground and 169.3 passing yards in four games, both high-water marks for a Commodore against ranked teams the last four seasons.

- In addition, Vice Chancellor and Athletics Director Candice Storey Lee holds three degrees from Vanderbilt, where she was a member of the women's basketball team from 1996-2002.
- With the combination of Lea and Lee, Vanderbilt is one of just two Power 4 institutions where both the athletics director and football coach are graduates of their current employer. Oklahoma State athletics director Chad Weiberg and head coach Mike Gundy are both graduates of OSU.

SERIES NOTES

- Vanderbilt and Virginia Tech first met at Dudley Field in 1930, a 40-0 Vandy win.
- The sides did not play again until 1965, a 21-10 Vandy win in Nashville.
- Virginia Tech got its first win in the series the next season in Richmond, Virginia. The game at City Stadium was the Tobacco Bowl, an annual regular season game including at least one team from the Commonwealth from 1949-82. The game was held during the National Tobacco Festival.
- The teams met annually from 1982-86. Vandy took the first game in the run, 45-0, in Nashville, before the Hokies captured the next four games.
- Vanderbilt knocked off Virginia Tech in the 2024 season opener, winning 34-27 in an overtime thriller. Quarterback Diego Pavia scored three touchdowns and posted 294 yards of offense.

1965 Sid Ransom's 32-yard interception return for a touchdown was the fifth in Vandy history

COMMODORES CRUISE OVER BUCCANEERS

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt football opened the 2025 season by downing Charleston Southern 45-3 in front of a sold-out crowd at FirstBank Stadium on Saturday.

The Commodores produced 481 yards of total offense, the most since generating 601 against Hawai'i on August 27, 2022. Defensively, Yandy held the Buccaneers to 135 total yards while producing 46 tackles, six for a loss, and forcing two turnovers. The victory marks the Dores' fourth-straight season opening victory.

Multiple milestones were set against the Buccaneers with junior running back Sedrick Alexander hitting 1,000 career rushing yards while graduate quarterback Diego Pavia matched his Vanderbilt single-game high in passing yards with 275 through the air, completing 20-of-25 passes with three touchdowns.

The Dores last faced the Bucs in 2014, pulling out a 21-20 home win in the first meeting between the two programs; Saturday's matchup looked much different. Freshman wideout Kayleb Barnett Started the scoring on a nine-yard jet pass from Pavia, marking the first career touchdown for Barnett. Vanderbilt found pay dirt on its next drive as Pavia connected with junior wide receiver Junior Sherrill for a 12-yard touchdown toss. At the 3:04 mark in the first quarter, the Commodores scored again on a four-yard run from junior running back AJ Newberry, pushing the lead to 21-0. It is the first time Vandy has scored touchdowns on its first three drives of a game since September 25, 2017, against Tennessee.

Vanderbilt increased the lead to 28-0 with its final score of the half late in the second quarter, a 26-yard pass from Pavia to Alexander. The 28-0 lead at the halftime break marks the first shutout through the opening two quarters since Alcorn State in 2024. The last time the Dores scored four touchdowns in the first half was against Elon in 2022.

The Commodores continued to control the game in the second half. Junior running back Makhilyn Young nabbed his first Vanderbilt touchdown on a four-yard run with 5:47 left in the third. Junior kicker Brock Taylor drilled his one and only attempt of the contest to begin the fourth quarter, splitting the uprights from 35 yards out. The Dores added insurance on a 35-yard rush from sophomore Jamezell Lassiter to finish off the 45-3 route. The score was also Lassiter's first as a Commodore.

Vanderbilt travels to Blacksburg, Virginia next Saturday for a meeting with Virginia Tech; the Commodores used an overtime effort to oust the Hokies 34-27 in last year's season opener. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. and will air on the ACC Network.
