THE OPENING TIP

After defeating the Virginia Tech Hokies on Thanksgiving Day, the Cougars have earned a date with the 17th-ranked Vanderbilt Commodores on Saturday. The game with Vandy will be BYU's first ranked matchup since knocking off No. 20 Oklahoma State 68-64 at the Marriott Center on Feb. 15, 2025.

The last time the Cougars faced the 17th-ranked team in the AP Poll was on Nov. 29, 2021, when Lee Cummond served as acting head coach during head coach Jeff Judkins' absence, and BYU took down Florida State 61-54 on Thanksgiving weekend. Assistant coach Paisley Johnson-Harding went for seven points, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and a block in the win.

With a win, the Cougars would move to 8-0 and match the second-best start in program history. Currently at 7-0, only three teams in program history have opened the season with a better record: 2013-14 (9-0), 2005-06 (8-0) and 2021-22 (8-0).

NAVAJO DIME DROPPER

Sydney Benally is one of the best guards in the country at setting up her teammates in positions to score. The true freshman ranks 10th in the country in total assists and second among freshmen with 46 dimes in seven games. Benally also ranks 10th among freshmen in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2-to-1. The Albuquerque, New Mexico native also averages 8.4 points, 2.4 steals and 2.7 rebounds. In BYU's win over Virginia Tech, the freshman erupted for a career-high 18 points to go along with seven assists, her third game with seven or more assists this season.

GERMAN ENGINEERED EXCELLENCE

Lara Rohkohl has been an efficient scorer, a staple on defense and a key for BYU in its 7-0 start. The Hanover, Germany native has made an immediate impact, scoring 11.3 points and anchoring the Cougar defense with 7.9 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per contest. Rohkohl ranks second in the country and the Big 12, behind Iowa State's Audi Crooks, shooting 74 percent from the field. She is sixth in the conference in rebounds and blocks per game with 7.9 and 1.9, respectively. Rohkohl scored 12 points with two rebounds, a steal and a block in the win on Thanksgiving Day.

DEFENSIVE DOGS

BYU ranks 19th nationally and third in the Big 12 with 5.7 blocks per game. Rohkohl ranks 31st in blocks with 13, while Cannon and Yussuf have contributed seven and six blocks, respectively.

The Cougars sit 30th in the country and third in the Big 12 for steals with 12.4 per contest. BYU has seven players who average over a steal per game: Benally (2.4), Hamlin (1.9), Cannon (2.0), Gibb (2.0), Rohkohl (1.9), Hudgins (1.7), and Yussuf (1.1). The BYU defense also ranks 25th in the country in opponent field goal percentage, giving up only 33.1 percent shooting, good for fifth in the conference.

The Cougars were the first team to record 60 steals and 30 blocks through the first four games of a season since South Carolina in 2018-19, and the first Big 12 team since Texas in 2010-11.

PLAYING FOR EACH OTHER

Coach Cummond has been emphatic that his team will share the love, make the extra pass and make the right play. Cummond's squad has assisted on 124 assists of 192 made field goals for a 64.6 percent assist rate. The Cougars currently rank 26th nationally with 124 assists per game, an average of 17.7 per game.

Four Cougars are averaging multiple assists per game, with Sydney Benally leading the way with 6.6. Delaney Gibb, Olivia Hamlin and Ari Mackey-Williams make up the backcourt quartet with 6.0, 2.0 and 1.8 dimes per contest. Benally has recorded five or more assists in 6-of-7 games this season.

CRASHING THE GLASS

BYU is currently third in the Big 12 with 47.8 rebounds per game, also good for 27th in the country. The Cougars have six players averaging 4.0 rebounds or more per game, with four recording 5.0 or more boards. Lara Rohkohl leads the way with 7.9. The others: Bola Yussuf (6.6), Brinley Cannon (6.3), Marya Hudgins (5.1), Olivia Hamlin (4.7) and Delaney Gibb (4.0). The Cougars also rank in the 20th in defensive rebounds.

SHOT OUT OF A CANNON

Brinley Cannon has taken a huge leap forward during the first month of her sophomore season, increasing her scoring average from 4.5 points to 9.1, rebounding from 2.6 to 6.3 per game, blocks from 0.2 to 1.0 and steals from 0.7 to 1.8 per game. She has also increased her 3-point percentage from 27.7 percent from three to a 32 percent clip.

SWIFTIE'S SUCCESS

With the absence of Delaney Gibb against Montana, players would have to step up to fill the void. Marya Hudgins did just that as she led BYU with a career-high 23 points on 46.7 percent shooting against the Lady Griz last Wednesday. The redshirt junior also turned in four rebounds, two assists, two steals and went 7-of-9 from the line, including the eventual game-winning point, to lift the Cougars to a 5-0 start to the season.

She followed that up with an 11-point, five rebound performance in BYU's win over Weber State, marking her first back-to-back games with 10 or more points since December 15 and 19, 2023 as a member of the Santa Clara Broncos.

PLAY HARD, PLAY RIGHT, PLAY TO WIN

In his first meeting with the team following his hiring, Cummond emphasized that results don't come without hard work and that he was going to prioritize the team's inputs this season and let the outcomes take care of themselves. Brinley Cannon spoke on the team's mantra at Big 12 Media Day by saying, "Coach Lee has brought an emphasis on playing right, playing hard and playing to win. I think we've implemented that really well this offseason, and I'm excited to see how we can continue to grow on those gains as the season goes on."

CLIMBING THE BIG 12 MOUNTAIN

Although the Cougars are focusing on inputs rather than outcomes this season, Cummond and his team have set some lofty goals for the 2025-26 campaign. At Big 12 Media Day, Coach Cummond said, "We haven't done anything in the league in the first two years. We've been in a lot of close games, we've upset a few ranked opponents, but we've never won a game in the conference tournament. We've never finished in the top half of the league. So there are two [goals] right there that we want to strive for daily. We want to be playing late into the conference tournament and go to the NCAA Tournament as a member of the Big 12 Conference."



#2 SYDNEY BENALLY

Sydney Benally comes to BYU from Albuquerque, New Mexico, where she was named Gatorade Player of the Year in 2024 and 2025 en route to back-to-back State Championships with Sandia High School. She was the 88th-ranked player in the class of 2025 by ESPN HoopGurlz and a 2024-25 McDonald's All-American nominee.

The Sandia native averaged 20 points on 50.8 percent shooting, 5.7 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 3.2 steals per game during her senior season (2024-25) and was recruited by BYU, Princeton, Northwestern and UNLV.



Benally is of Navajo descent and participated in the Native American Basketball Invitational each of the past two summers. NABI is the largest all-Native American high school basketball tournament in the country, empowering Indigenous youth through sports, education, and community engagement. Benally helped her team, The Rezbombers, to the NABI Championship in 2024 and 2025 and was named Tournament MVP each year.

#3 BOLANLE YUSSUF

Bolanle Yussuf, also known as Bola, came to BYU from Nigeria but played high school basketball at a prep academy in Japan. The 6-foot-3 forward averaged 24.7 points and 18.9 rebounds during her senior season en route to the U18 Nissin League Championship in 2024 and 2025.

Her 24.7 points were the second most by any player in the league and her 18.9 boards led her division in rebounding. Bola was named to the All-Conference Top 5 and All-Defensive Top 5 teams following her senior campaign.

#7 OLIVIA HAMLIN

Olivia Hamlin originally committed to play college basketball at Nebraska, but flipped her commitment to play for BYU after the hiring of head coach Lee Cummmard in March 2025. Of her decision, Hamlin said, "BYU is an amazing school that I have been dreaming about attending since I was a little girl. I am so excited to play for Coach Cummmard. He is a fantastic coach who I look forward to learning from."

Hamlin is the 59th-ranked player by Prospects Nation and the 73rd-ranked player by BTN Scouting for the class of 2025. The 5-10 guard led Snow Canyon High School to back-to-back Utah 4A State Runner-up finishes in 2024 and 2025 and was named the Utah 4A Player of the Year in both seasons. Hamlin is one

of two players in Utah girls' basketball history to eclipse 2,500 career points and led all classifications in scoring in 2024 and 2025. Hamlin also became Utah's all-time leader with 465 career steals.



Hamlin was also recruited by Clemson, Harvard, Marquette, Minnesota, Nebraska, TCU, UNLV and Virginia Tech.

#8 ARIELLE MACKEY-WILLIAMS

Mackey-Williams was the third-leading scorer for BYU in 2022-23 at 8.8 points on a 41.0 percent clip. She also averaged 1.9 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game during her sophomore campaign.

The rising junior also competed for the New Zealand Tall Ferns in the FIBA 3X3 Women's Series in 2023 at the Edmonton and Montreal stops. After recovering from the knee injury that held her out of the 2023-24 season, Mackey-Williams again suited up for the Tall Ferns at the 2024 U23 FIBA 3x3 World Championship.

After returning to join summer workouts with the Cougars, Mackey-Williams suffered a knee injury that sidelined her for a second-straight season in 2024-25.

#10 KAILEY WOOLSTON

Kailey Woolston will return from serving an 18-month mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Baltimore, Maryland, in December and rejoin the team in January. Due to returning in the middle of the season, Woolston will redshirt the 2025-26 season to prepare for the 2026-27 season.

During her freshman season, Woolston ranked No. 2 in the NCAA for 3-point percentage at 46.6 percent in 2023-24. She earned back-to-back Big 12 Player of the Week honors on Nov. 20 & 27. Woolston scored a career-high 26 points at Allen Fieldhouse against Kansas (1/31/24) on 8-of-14 shooting, going 6-for-10 from downtown. She scored 10 or more points in 24 of 32 games she appeared in during her freshman campaign.

#11 DELANEY GIBB

Gibb entered her freshman campaign as the 77th-ranked player in ESPN's 2024 HoopGurlz Recruiting Rankings and exceeded all expectations as she single-handedly rewrote the BYU freshman record book en route to 10 Big 12 Freshman of the Year nods and the Big 12 Freshman of the Year designation. Gibb finished in the BYU freshman top-15 of 29 statistical

categories, set 19 top-10 marks and 15 top-5 records during the 2024-25 season.

Gibb's ultimate goal in basketball is to represent Team Canada in the Olympics, and the 5-10 sophomore is well on her way to making that dream a reality. She has suited up for Team Canada at the U16, U17, U19 and Senior National Teams levels, has collected three medals in her national team career and was selected to the Canada Basketball Senior National Team Player Pool for the 2026 FIBA World Cup.



Gibb helped Canada to a bronze medal with the Senior National Team at the 2025 FIBA AmeriCup, recording the game-winning assist to secure the bronze. She also captured bronze at the 2023 U19 World Championship and a silver medal at the 2021 FIBA U16 Americas Championship. Gibb was invited to the Canadian National Team training camp ahead of the 2024 Paris Olympics and was selected as the first alternate for the final Olympic roster. Gibb most recently suited up for Team Toronto at the FIBA 3X3 Women's Series: Edmonton Stop.

**#13 LARA ROHKOHL**

BYU is the third and final stop in the career of Lara Rohkohl, who began her career at Central Connecticut before playing her sophomore and junior seasons at the College of Charleston. She said of her decision to finish her career at BYU playing for Coach Cummond, "The coaches and the family feel of BYU is the reason I chose to play at BYU. I had a feeling on my visit that 'this is the place I want to be'"

Rohkohl appeared in 33 games, starting 32 in her two seasons at Charleston. She was the third-leading scorer and highest-scoring forward at 10.1 points per game while shooting an efficient 64.4 percent from the field. The 6-foot-3 forward led Charleston in rebounding and blocks with 9.2 boards and 1.9 blocks per contest, respectively.



The Hanover, Germany native helped Charleston to a 25-8 record and the second round of the WNIT while notching 10 double-doubles and 17 double-figure scoring performances during the 2024-25 campaign, including two games with over 20 points. Rohkohl recorded 28 games with over five rebounds, 14 games with 10 or more boards and blocked three or more shots in 10 games.

#14 KAMBREE BARBER

Kambree Barber burst on the scene during her freshman season at BYU as she appeared in 25 games, starting six in 2024-25. The Rigby, Idaho native averaged 17.5 minutes, 4.3 points on 46.7 percent shooting and grabbed 4.7 rebounds per game, with 35 percent of her rebounds coming on the offensive glass.

Barber scored a career-high 15 points and 12 rebounds while going 7-of-9 from the floor against Arizona State on Feb. 1, 2025, en route to her first-career double-double and Big 12 Freshman of the Week honors

Barber was also recruited by Boise State, Saint Mary's and Utah Valley before choosing to play for the Cougars. The Rigby High School grad was named to the 5A All-State First Team in 2023 and the 2022 Idaho 5A Player of the Year. Aside from basketball, Barber also played volleyball and was selected to the 2023 Idaho 5A All-Conference First Team.

On Sep. 28, 2025, Barber got engaged to her sweetheart, Dallas Taylor. The two are set to get married on Dec. 27, 2025, just four days before the Cougars take on the TCU Horned Frogs at the Marriott Center on New Year's Eve.

#22 BRAEDEN GUNLOCK

Braeden Gunlock comes to BYU after a successful three-sport career at Bigfork High School as a forward on the basketball and soccer teams while competing in the 100-meter hurdles,

300-meter hurdles, 4x400 relay and long jump on the track team. The 6-foot freshman was named the Montana Northwest A Offensive Player of the Year in 2024 and 2025 while earning All-State honors in 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025. Gunlock helped the Valkyries to the Montana Class B State Title in 2023, where she was named the tournament MVP.

Gunlock was also recruited by Boise State, Eastern Washington, Hawaii, Idaho, Idaho State, Montana, Montana State and Yale.

#21 HEATHER HAMSON

Heather Hamson is the third Hamson sister (Jennifer and Sara) to follow in their mother [Tresa Spaulding](#)'s footsteps by donning a BYU jersey.

Tresa was a star for the Cougars from 1983-87, with [Jennifer](#) (2010-14) earning All-American honors in 2014 and [Sara](#) played from 2017-22. Tresa (494), Sara (472) and Jennifer (340) hold the top three spots in all-time blocks for BYU with 1,306 blocks in all. For more on her family's Cougar legacy, check out her episode of [Deep Blue](#).

During the 2024-25 season, Hamson scored a career-high 11 points against No. 12 Kansas State on Jan. 11, 2025, grabbed a career-high eight rebounds against Arizona State on Feb. 22, 2025, and registered a career-high two blocks on two occasions.

#23 MARYA HUDGINS

Hudgins came to BYU last season after playing her first two seasons at Santa Clara. Hudgins played against the Cougars twice during the 2022-23 season, her freshman year.

In game one, the Broncos downed BYU 69-59 at the Marriott Center and Hudgins scored eight points, grabbed four boards and recorded a block and a steal. In the second meeting, Hudgins again scored eight, grabbed five rebounds and dished an assist.



Aside from basketball, Hudgins is a certified Swiftie and has been to four Taylor Swift concerts: the REDTour, the 1989 World Tour, the Reputation Stadium Tour and the Eras Tour.

In 2024, she listened to 25,388 minutes (423.13 hours) of Taylor Swift songs. As of Nov 1, 2025, she has consumed 23,642 minutes or 394.03 hours of T-Swift content and is on pace to break her record from last year. Hudgins streamed 2,466 minutes (41.1 hours) of Swift's latest album Life of a Showgirl in October alone.

#24 BRINLEY CANNON

Cannon prepped at Shelley High School, where she earned back-to-back 4A Player of the Year honors in 2023 and 2024 en route to winning the 2024 Idaho 4A State Championship. She is the all-time leading scorer and rebounder at Shelley High with 1,818 career points and 1,009 rebounds.



She comes from an athletic family with her brother McKay suiting up for the Cougars from 2018-20. Cannon's mother, Jennifer, played basketball at Ricks College (1991-93) and Idaho State (1993-95) while her father, Seth, played basketball at Ricks (1991-93) and College of Idaho (1993-95).

#30 MARIAM TRAORE

Traore missed most of her junior season and all of her senior season due to back-to-back knee injuries. Played her junior season at Bella Vista College Prep in Phoenix, Arizona, before transferring to Liahona Preparatory Academy for her senior year of high school.

Traore is the younger sister of former BYU men's basketball player Fousseyni Traore. Mariam Traore's best game in high school came as she scored 11 points, grabbed eight rebounds, blocked two shots and recorded a steal in a 55-47 win over DME Academy at the Grind Session Tournament (2024).

#33 HATTIE OGDEN

Ogden transferred to BYU from Buffalo where she earned 2023-24 Academic All-MAC honors and was named a CSC Academic All-District Honoree. The junior was the fifth-leading scorer (7.5 ppg) for a Bulls team that finished 19-14, reached the Mid-American Conference Championship game and was selected to compete in the WNIT.

Ogden, a native of Magrath, Alberta, Canada, played eight seasons of hockey from age four to 12 was high school rivals with now-teammate Delaney Gibb.



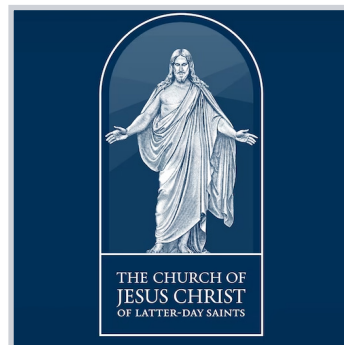
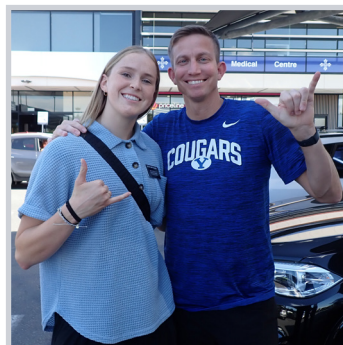
Ogden was one of 64 players in the country recognized with the prestigious Kay Yow Servant Leader Award. Recipients of the Kay Yow Servant Leader Award are student athletes who exemplify the values of leadership, selflessness, and service. These student athletes who carry forward the legacy of the legendary women's basketball coach, Kay Yow.

The award is presented annually to student-athletes who demonstrate extraordinary dedication to making a positive impact in their communities – people with a servant's spirit and a commitment to selfless leadership both on and off the court or athletic field.



Students and student-athletes come from all over the world to study and compete at Brigham Young University. Nearly 150 years after its humble beginnings, this church-sponsored institution has become one of the largest private universities in the United States. WHAT IS A MISSION? AND WHY SERVE?

Missionary service has been a staple within BYU Athletics since its inception. More than half of all BYU students serve missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. While Church members understand what a mission entails, the details of missionary service can be foreign to those not of the faith.

This page is to help our Big 12 friends, media members and others understand more about missionary service.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Latter-day Saint missionaries can be seen on the streets of major cities as well as in smaller communities around the world. Both men and women can choose to serve missions that are voluntary and self-funded. Female missionaries serve for a period of 18 months. BYU student-athletes who chose to serve missions do so out of a love for Jesus Christ and a desire to serve others.

Female student-athletes are eligible to serve missions after their 19th birthday, and often take a break from studying and competing at BYU to participate in missionary service. Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent to countries throughout the world where governments allow the Church to operate.

Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language. Due in part to the many international missionary service experiences among BYU students, more than 60 percent of the student body speaks a second language.

HOW TO TALK ABOUT MISSIONS

We request that those referring to missions do not refer to missions as "mission trips," "Mormon missions" or "LDS missions"

We request that those referring to missions use terms such as "serving a mission," "full-time mission," "18-month mission," "missionary service," "Latter-day Saint mission," and "a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints" For more information, check out [The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints' style guide](#).

WHY SERVE A MISSION?

Ultimately, missionary work is about serving God, His children and dedicating one's life to that service. Missionaries often talk about serving a mission as a small way to show appreciation to God for all that He has given them in their lives. As missionaries learn, work and serve, they also gain essential life skills in areas of study, planning, logistics, interpersonal communication, relationship building, cross-cultural competence, patience, resilience and time management. A mission can serve as an important foundation for the rest of one's life, ultimately benefiting those who serve in their future education, family life, work life and Church service.

DAY-TO-DAY LIFE AS A MISSIONARY

The overarching purpose of missionary service is to invite individuals to learn about and follow the teachings Jesus Christ. Missionaries wake up at 6:30 a.m. and spend time each morning exercising and doing religious study. They then spend the day talking to people, visiting in their homes and providing service from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Missionaries look for ways to serve and help others. Missionaries hold the title of "Elder" or "Sister" and are referred to as such, with their last names (Sister Woolston or Sister Bartholomew). Each missionary serves in a companionship with one or two other missionaries. The companionships are assigned to specific geographic areas with assignments changing at different times throughout their mission. Missionaries have a weekly preparation day to grocery shop, do laundry and complete other necessities of life. Outside of the occasional game of non-competitive basketball, missionaries have little to no sport-specific training while serving their missions.

CURRENT COUGS ON MISSIONS

In the midst of a record-setting freshman campaign, Kailey Woolston announced to her teammates on Feb. 27, 2024 that she would be putting basketball on hold to serve an 18-month mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

For the last 18 months, the second-ranked three-point shooter in 2023-24 spent her time inviting individuals to learn about and follow Jesus Christ before returning to BYU.

Sister Woolston said, "When I think about all the Lord has done for me, giving a year and a half of my time completely to Him is the least I can do. I can never come close to repaying all He has done for me, but this is one small way I can show my gratitude."

"It is the best experience of my life! I have never felt so much joy and fulfillment than the time that I have had on my mission. The changes I am able to see in people's lives when they feel the hope that Christ brings is priceless. I wouldn't trade it for the world."

Sister Bartholomew said, "'I decided to serve a mission because I know it is what God needed me to do. Now, just four months later, I have gained a greater appreciation for my family, my faith, and my relationship with God. I know this gospel of Jesus Christ is true and I have seen it soften hearts and transform lives! While the work is hard, it is so worth it. At the start, I didn't understand why God needed me, but I am realizing it was because I needed Him."

HEAD COACH || 1ST SEASON AT BYU || BYU '09

BYU director of athletics Tom Holmoe has named Lee Cumard head women's basketball coach.

Cummard has been the interim head coach since the departure of Amber Whiting on March 8. He served as associate head coach under Whiting and has been an assistant on the staff since 2019. Previous to that, Cumard was an assistant coach and graduate assistant on the men's basketball team, following a standout playing career with the Cougars.

"Lee has been an important part of our BYU Athletics family for many years," Holmoe said. "His time as a star player on the men's team, and a member of both the men's and women's basketball coaching staffs, gives him valuable experience and connection in this important position. He has displayed a loyal commitment to BYU and understands the valuable mission of our university. He will be able to retain key players and recruit those that will fit, excel and align at BYU."

Cummard, a native of Mesa, Arizona, takes the reins as the Cougars' eighth head coach in program history.

"I am extremely grateful and honored to be given the opportunity to serve as the head coach of BYU women's basketball," Cumard said. "BYU is a special place that changes lives, and I am grateful for the impact it has had on my life. This program has a tremendous history of winning and doing things the right way, with great people. I am committed to continuing that tradition, and I look forward to helping our current and future student-athletes excel both on and off the basketball court."

While on staff as associate head coach from 2022-25, Cumard helped the Cougars to back-to-back postseason appearances, the WBIT in 2024 and the WNIT in 2023. The coaching staff helped develop the 2025 Big 12 Freshman of the Year, Delaney Gibb as well as BYU's all-time leading rebounder and 2023 WCC Defensive Player of the Year, Lauren Gustin.

During this time, four players earned All-Conference honors with Gustin (2023 - WCC, 2024 - Big 12) and Nani Falatea (2023 - WCC) earning First Team Honors, Gibb (2025 - Big 12) selected to the second team and Kailey Woolston (2024 - Big 12) being named honorable mention.

Prior to serving on Whiting's staff, Cumard spent the 2019 through 2022 seasons as an assistant to Jeff Judkins. Cumard helped the Cougars to two NCAA Tournament appearances (2021 and 2022), reaching the Round of 32 in the 2021 Tournament before falling to Final Four-bound Arizona.



With the assistance of Cumard, the Cougars took home the 2022 WCC regular season title with a program-best 25 wins and went undefeated at the Marriott Center (14-0) including five ranked victories. In 2022, BYU finished with a No. 20 final ranking, spent a program-record 16 weeks in the AP Top 25 poll and set an attendance record for regular-season average and single-game attendance with 6,289 fans cheering the Cougars on to a 63-39 victory over Gonzaga.

Due to COVID-19 sidelining Judkins for a stint during the 2021-22 season, Cumard assumed the role of acting head coach for a three-game stretch. While fulfilling head coaching responsibilities, Cumard went 3-0, including a win over in-state rival Utah State and two ranked wins over No. 17 Florida State and No. 22 West Virginia to win the St. Pete Showcase.

Cummard also helped five players garner 12 All-Conference honors between 2019-22, including two-time WCC Player of the Year Shaylee Gonzales, WCC Defensive Player of the Year Sara Hamson and three-time First Team All-WCC honorees Paisley Johnson Harding and Brenna Chase Drollinger.

Before coaching the women, Cumard spent three seasons on staff with the BYU men's basketball team, one year as an assistant (2018-19) and two as a graduate assistant (2016-18) under head coach Dave Rose. While serving on the men's staff, Cumard helped the Cougars to three-consecutive 20-win seasons and two trips to the NIT. Those teams saw four players earn a combined seven all-conference honors.

Cummard suited up for the Cougars from 2005 to 2009, when he earned All-American status as a junior and senior. The 6-foot-7 guard was named an AP All-American Honorable Mention in 2008 and was named a Fourth Team All-American by FOXSports.com in 2009. Cumard was named the 2008 Mountain West Conference Player of the Year and was a three-time All-MWC honoree, earning third-team honors as a sophomore in 2006-07





and receiving first-team nods in his final two years with the Cougars in 2007-08 and 2008-09.

At the close of his four-year BYU career, Cumard ranked in the top 20 of 28 statistical categories. He ranks second in effective field goal percentage (.608), third in consecutive games played (131), fifth in 3-point field goal percentage (.431) and free throw percentage (.842). He also sits sixth in consecutive games started (102), 10th in offensive rebounds (202), blocks (106), total victories (97) and 5-steal games, 12th in games played (131), games started (116) and 3-block games.

The new head coach also ranks 13th in made threes (153), steals (129), minutes played (3,602), points per field goal attempt (1.4957), 14th in blocks per game (.809), 15th in made field goals (561), double-figure scoring games (77), 16th in points (1,569), 17th in field goal percentage (.5348) and 20th in rebounds (686).

Following his playing career at BYU, Cumard played professionally from 2009-16 in France (2009-11), Japan (2011-12) and Belgium (2012-16).

Cumard and his wife Sarah have three sons. He served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Tennessee.
