STORYLINES

BOWL SEASON

- Vanderbilt will be playing in a postseason bowl game in consecutive seasons for only the second time in program history after accepting an invitation to the ReliaQuest Bowl.
- The Commodores will meet Iowa in Tampa, the first-ever meeting between the two schools.
- Vanderbilt last met a current member of the Big Ten in 2019 when the Commodores visited Purdue.
- Vandy is 5-4-1 in bowl games, most recently defeating Georgia Tech, 35-27, last season in the Birmingham Bowl.

MAKING HISTORY

- Vanderbilt won 10 games this season for the first time in program history. Vandy's six SEC wins are also the most in school history.
- The Dores' only two losses this season came at Alabama, ranked No. 9 in the CFP Rankings, and at No. 13 Texas.
- Vanderbilt finished the regular season with the 11th-best strength of record and the 25th best strength of schedule according to ESPN.
- Vandy beat Tennessee for the first time since 2018, South Carolina for the first time since 2008, Auburn in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1949-50, and LSU for the first time since 1990, and went undefeated at home for the first time since 1982.

AWARD RECOGNITION

- With Vandy climbing into the AP top 10 this season, the Commodores are garnering attention on the awards watch lists.
- Head coach Clark Lea was named the FWAA Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Georgie Munger, AFCA, Walter Camp and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Awards after leading the Commodores to 10 wins for the first time in program history.
- Eli Stowers won the William V. Campbell Trophy and John Mackey Award and was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. He was also a semifinalist for the Lombardi Award and was named a midseason second-team All-American by SI.
- The offensive line is one of 10 units to be named a semifinalist for the Joe Moore Award.
- Diego Pavia won the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the first Commodore to do so. Pavia finished second in the voting for the Heisman Trophy and was a finalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year and Manning Awards.
- Nick Haberer was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award.

GO DIEGO GO

- Diego Pavia entered the postseason second nationally in total offense (334.8) and points responsible for (18.2). He ranks fourth in in passing efficiency (171.5), ninth in passing touchdowns (27) and 14th in passing yards (3,192).
- Pavia broke the school season records for passing yards, touchdowns and total offense. He's fourth in program history for for total yards accounted for and tied for sixth in career rushing
- He recorded 532 yards of total offense and accounted for six touchdowns in the win over Kentucky, his second game this season with six total touchdowns.
- He completed 33-of-39 pass attempts for a school-record 484 passing yards and five scores through the air. He also led Vandy on the ground with 48 rushing yards and a touchdown on 15 carries.
- It was the most total yards of offense by a Commodore since at least 1996 and the second highest total offense mark by a Power 4 player this season.
- His five passing touchdowns in a game matched the program record, a mark he also reached earlier this fall against Utah State.
- No quarterback in all of FBS enjoyed a better month of November than No. 2.

FULL STEAM AHEAD

- The Commodores are second in the SEC and eighth in the country in scoring average, posting 39.4 points per game. They have done so while facing five teams in the top 25 in scoring defense among Power 4 teams (Alabama, Missouri, Texas, LSU and Auburn).
- In program history, the Commodores have only finished three seasons with a scoring average better than 40 points: 1904, 1905 and 1915.
- Vandy has set new program season records for passing touchdowns (28) and first downs (291).
- Vanderbilt's offense ranks in the top 25 nationally in eight major categories. The Dores lead the SEC in third down conversions, completion percentage and team passing efficiency, rank second in scoring offense and third in TFLs allowed.

- No active players have more total touchdowns accounted for in FBS than Diego Pavia.
- In just two seasons in Nashville, Pavia ranks No. 4 on Vandy's career record list for total offense (7,112), No. 6 for passing yards (5,485) and is tied at No. 7 for rushing touchdowns (17).

RELIABLE

- Eli Stowers leads the nation among tight ends with 769 receiving yards in 2025. He won both the William V. Campbell Trophy and John Mackey Award and was a semifinalist for the Lombardi and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Awards.
- He ranks third among all active tight ends with 1,773 career receiving yards. Both players ahead of Stowers have played four full seasons to Stowers' two-plus at the position. He is tied for second in yards per game (44.3)
- Stowers hauled in a career-high 12 catches for 122 yards in the Week 11 win over Auburn, becoming the first Vandy tight end since at least 1996 to record double-digit receptions and the first since 1983 to register back-to-back 100-yard games.
- Stowers racked up a career-high 146 receiving yards with two touchdowns at Texas in Week 10. The 146 receiving yards are fourth most by a tight end in FBS this season and the most by a Vandy TE since at least 1996.

HOME NEVER LOOKED SO GOOD

- Aug. 30 marked another new milestone at FirstBank Stadium as the south end zone facility made its
 debut.
- The state-of-the-art facility features living room boxes, loge boxes, club seating, field-level seating, founders' suites, club suites and open-air tailgate suites.
- The south end zone building also houses a new football game day locker room, and will also feature a student-athlete training table and dining facility for all varsity teams.

- Stowers' 12.1 yards per catch career average is tied for seventh nationally among active tight ends.
- His 638 receiving yards last season were the second-most by a Vanderbilt tight end since 1996. He trailed only the 774 accumulated by Jared Pinkney in 2018. Pinkney, Stowers and Steven Scheu (2014) are the only Vanderbilt tight ends since 1996 to eclipse 500 receiving yards in a season.
- In addition, Stowers is the only Vanderbilt tight end since 1996 to complete a pass in a game after he hit fellow tight end Cole Spence for a 17-yard touchdown in the win over Alcorn State.
- No SEC tight end had more than Stowers' 49.1 receiving yards per game, as he finished the year tied in the category with Texas' Gunnar Helm.
- Stowers became the first Vandy tight end since at least 1996 to have multiple games with 100-plus receiving yards in a season. He had three such games last season after totaling 110 receiving yards vs. Georgia State and 130 vs. Ball State in addition to the Alabama game.
- Stowers was a semifinalist for the John Mackey Award and selected All-SEC by the league's coaches. He was Vanderbilt's first offensive player to earn first-team All-SEC honors since 2013.

POLL PLACEMENT

- Vanderbilt rose to No. 9 in the AP Poll and No. 11 in the AFCA Coaches Poll following its victory over Missouri in Week 9.
- The Commodores broke the top 10 in the AP Poll for the first time since 1947 and just the fifth time in program history. No. 9 was Vandy's highest ranking since reaching No. 7 in 1937.
- Vandy has three wins over three top-15 teams for the first time in program history. The four wins over ranked opponents matches the program's total from the previous 16 seasons combined.
- It's the second consecutive season the Dores have appeared in the polls, marking the first occurrence since 2012 and 2013. It is just the second time Vanderbilt has reached the top 25 in consecutive seasons since 1956 and only the sixth occurrence in the AP poll's 90-year history.
- Week 16 marks the 13th consecutive appearance in the AP poll this season. It is the first time in program history the Dores have been ranked for more than four weeks in a single season.

SEDRICK THE ENTERTAINER

- Running back Sedrick Alexander has scored mutiple touchdowns on five occasions this fall after finding the end zone three times in the win over Tennessee.
- The back leads the team with 11 rushing, and 15 total touchdowns. Alexander ranks third in the SEC and 12th nationally with his 15 TDs. He also ranks 10th in the SEC in scoring with 90 total points.
- Alexander's 26 career touchdowns is tied for third in program history. His 21 rushing touchdowns is also tied for third.
- Along with his three touchdowns, Alexander totaled 115 yards on the ground in the win at Tennessee and earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- At Alabama, Alexander accounted for 98 all-purpose yards, including a career-long 65-yard touchdown scamper.
- With a 3-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter vs. Georgia State, Alexander extended his four-game scoring streak, which was the longest of his career. He also hauled in a 10-yard touchdown catch to post a rushing and receiving touchdown in back-to-back games.
- Alexander went for 83 yards on 12 carries in the season-opening win against Charleston Southern. The 83 yards propelled Alexander past the 1,000-yard mark for his career. Alexander also added 26 yards receiving to top 100 all-purpose yards for the first time in his collegiate career.
- Alexander followed with a 73-yard, two-touchdown performance on just 10 carries in the win at Virginia Tech. The two touchdowns matched a career high for the junior. The opening two games also marked the first time in his career Alexander rushed for 70-plus yards in back-to-back contests.
- Last season, he tallied a career-high 21 carries in the win over top-ranked Alabama on Oct. 5, matching his career best with two rushing touchdowns, and was included on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Honorable Mention List for the week.
- He finished his sophomore campaign as the team's second-leading rusher, trailing only Diego Pavia, with 586 yards and six touchdowns. He became the 26th Vandy running back to eclipse 500 rushing yards in a season since 1996 and his total was second among all SEC sophomores.
- The Texan played in all 12 games as a freshman, logging 504 all-purpose yards, 371 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns.
- He led SEC freshmen in rushing yards and touchdowns and was named to the league's All-Freshman team.
 Alexander was named to the Doak Walker and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List entering 2025.

SHERRILL STRIKES

- Junior Sherrill leads the Dores and ranks fourth in the SEC with seven touchdown receptions on the season.
- $\bullet \, \text{Sherrill is second on the team with 46 catches while averaging 14.4 yards per reception in 2025}.$
- The wide out surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards with two catches for 30 yards in the win over LSU in Week 8. He registered career highs in catches (eight) and receiving yards (115) in the Week 13 win over Kentucky.
- He notched three touchdowns and 91 yards on six catches in the Week 5 victory over Utah State. All three touchdown grabs came in the first half, making Sherrill the first Commodore with three TD catches in a half since Earl Bennett in 2005.
- He registered the first rushing score of his career with an 8-yard touchdown run vs. Georgia State.
- Sherill finished his rookie year with 20 receptions for 293 yards and two touchdowns while playing in all 12 contests. He surpassed all three totals in 10 games last season.
- The Nashvillian has made at least one catch in 36 straight games.
- Sherrill received the opening kickoff vs. Tennessee last season and returned it 100 yards to the house for Vandy's longest kickoff return for a touchdown since 2014.
- Sherrill was rated the No. 8 freshman wide receiver in the nation by Pro Football Focus in 2023.



GAME NOTES

BACKFIELD CAPERS

- Miles Capers' 9.5 TFL this season already mark a career best, surpassing his eight from the 2024 season. He had 11.5 career TFL entering the season.
- His 4.5 sacks through the first seven games also eclipsed his previous season high of three from 2024. He leads the Dores and ranks 17th in the SEC with 0.4 sacks per game.
- Capers has recorded multiple tackles in all but one game this season and in 16 of the last 17 contests dating back to October 2024.
- He has made 2.5 tackles for loss in three games this season.
- Capers tied his career best with a season-high seven tackles in the win over Missouri in Week 9.

YOUNG RUNNING WILD & FREE

- Makhilyn Young is one of three Commodores over 400 yards rushing this season. With 410 yards on 45 carries, Young is averaging 9.1 yards per carry, most on the team with double-figure carries. His six touchdown runs are third on the team behind Sedrick Alexander and Diego Pavia.
- "MK" led Vandy with 86 rushing yards on four carries in the win over Missouri. He broke an 80-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter to give the Dores their first lead. It was Vandy's longest play from scrimmage this season and the longest run by a Commodore since 2022.
- Young ran for 85 yards on just six carries in the win over LSU. He added a 10-yard reception on 4th-and-1 to keep a third-quarter drive alive that led to touchdown in final minute of the period. His final carry of the day went for 43 yards, putting the Dores in the red zone and helping run out the final 3:12 of the win.
- Young burst onto the scene in his first two games with the Dores, running for 114 yards on just 11 carries. In 14 games prior to Vandy, Young had just 201 yards on the ground.
- Young carried a career-high eight times in the Virginia Tech win, racking up a career-best 95 yards on the ground. He added a 12-yard reception to lead all players in all-purpose yardage.
- The career day also include a collegiate-best 62 yard carry to help seal the win in the fourth quarter.
- 29 of Young's 95 yards came after contact, according to PFF. That mark was also a career best for the junior. In total, Young set or matched eight career highs against the Hokies.

SYDNOR GETS STOPS

- Graduate defensive lineman Khordae Sydnor has continued to make his presence felt in opposing backfields during his second season at Vanderbilt, amassing 8.5 tackles for loss.
- The 8.5 stops behind the line of scrimmage are third on the team. His 40 yards of created loss are second most behind only Miles Capers with 60.
- His 8.5 TFL are his career high after finishing with 6.5 last season at Vandy and in 2022 at Purdue.
- Sydnor owns 15.0 TFL at Vanderbilt and 24.0 over his five-year career.
- With 3.5 sacks this season, Sydnor sits tied for third on the Dores. He is second on the team in quarterback hurries, registering seven this year.

HEARD HIM

- Safety CJ Heard finished the regular season second on the team with 64 tackles while adding two sacks, five quarterback hurries, an interception, forced fumble and fumble recovery.
- He posted eight stops with a fumble he forced and recovered in the win over Missouri in Week 9. His forced fumble and recovery set up Vandy's ensuing game-winning touchdown drive.
- Heard also had a tackle for no gain and a quarterback hurry on back-to-back plays after Missouri entered the red zone, leading to a missed field goal by the Tigers late in the third quarter.
- Heard was especially impactful against Virginia Tech and South Carolina, racking up a season-high 12 tackles and adding a QB hurry to lead the Dores in the win over the Gamecocks. The 12 stops were one off his career high of 13. At Virginia Tech, Heard announced his presence with five tackles, a sack and two QB pressures.
- The FAU transfer snagged his first career interception in the season opener against Charleston Southern.

RINALDI RISING

- Former walk-on and now senior linebacker Nick Rinaldi has continued his exceptional work in 2025. After a career-best season featuring 52 tackles, 6.0 tackles for loss and five sacks in 2024, Rinaldi has piled up 7.0 tackles behind the line and 3.5 sacks this season.
- His 7.0 tackles behind the line of scrimmage are fourth most on the team.
- Rinaldi was all over the field in the win at No. 11/10 South Carolina, racking up seven tackles, 2.5 TFL and a sack. His performance earned him Burlsworth Trophy Walk-On of the Week honors.
- In the win at Virginia Tech in Week 2, Rinaldi led the Dores with six tackles, 2.5 TFL and a sack. He also added a QB hurry to the ledger.
- The back-to-back games with 2.5 TFL are tied for his career high and are the only consecutive games with multiple TFL in his career.
- Rinaldi was named the 2025 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, the first Commodore to receive the honor since its inception in 2003.

NEW SEASON, NEW HIGHT

- No need to blink, that is junior Martel Hight split out at wide receiver this season. The veteran corner is playing both ways for the first time in his collegiate career.
- Hight grabbed two interceptions in the win over Kentucky, the most in a game by a Commodore since 2023. He leads the team in picks this season with three and was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week.
- The Rome, Georgia, native was named the Paul Hornung Award national Player of the Week after finding multiple ways to contribute in the Dores' 31-7 victory at nationally-ranked South Carolina in Week 3.

- Against the Gamecocks, he finished with a career-high four catches for 33 yards. Hight threw the key block springing Jamezell Lassiter free for a 44-yard touchdown run that gave the Dores a double-digit lead for good in the third quarter,
- On the defensive side, Hight helped limit South Carolina to just 86 yards rushing.
- He grabbed his first interception of the season in Week 6 at Alabama.
- Hight finished the 2024 campaign tied for the team lead with two interceptions, tied for second with four pass breakups and added 33 tackles.
- $\bullet \ Hight's explosiveness with the ball in his hands was also on display as he averaged 14.7 yards on 18 punt returns and made a 57-yard house call against Alcorn State.$

TREMENDOUS TRE

- Tre Richardson's jump from Division II Washburn to Vanderbilt has been seamless on the football field, as the wide receiver leads the team in all-purpose yards with 1,108.
- He had a career day in the win over Kentucky, amassing a career-high 159 receiving yards with three touchdowns. He finished with 124 receiving yards on just three catches in the previous win over Auburn.
- Richardson is also third on the team with 40 receptions on the season, averaging 17.0 yards per catch. Four of his six touchdowns have come from 25-plus yards out.
- The speedster made a spectacular one-handed grab on a 26-yard, go-ahead touchdown pass in the third quarter at Virginia Tech. The score was his first as a Commodore.
- The versatile threat also has eight carries for 58 yards and 371 yards on 14 kick returns while averaging a team-high 92.3 total yards per game.
- Richardson is the first Vandy wide receiver since Darrius Sims in 2016 to go over 1,000 all-purpose yards in a season.

SPENCE SPARKS CAREER DAY

- Tight end Cole Spence had a career day in the victory over LSU with five catches for 56 yards and a touchdown.
- The five receptions and 56 yards were both career highs for Spence while the TD was his first of the season and third of his career.
- Spence led the Commodores in receptions and yardage against the Bayou Bengals. 27 of his 56 yards came after the catch.

WHITE ANCHORING THE LINE

- Graduate center Jordan White has provided an instant impact for the Commodores in his first season in the black and gold. The veteran recorded Vandy's top overall and run block grades in each of the first three weeks and leads the line on the season in overall, run and pass block grades.
- White earned SEC co-Offensive Lineman of the Week after Vandy's dominant win at Tennessee, his fourth SEC honor this season.
- He picked up his third weekly honor after the Auburn win. White received the highest overall Pro Football Focus grade on the Dores' offensive line after not surrendering a sack, quarterback hit, hurry or pressure on 43 pass-block snaps. It was the fourth time this fall that the center has earned a pass-block grade over 80 percent, and the second time he has graded out that high in the pass game against an SEC opponent.
- He earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors after helping lead Vanderbilt past No. 10 LSU on Oct. 18.
- White was named a team captain on the Friday night preceding the Utah State game in Week 5.
- White was named the SEC Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance in the win at No. 11/10 South Carolina, helping the Commodores roll up 22 first downs.

LANGSTON AND LONGWELL

- Vanderbilt's linebacker duo of Bryan Longwell and Langston Patterson have combined for 129 tackles this season.
- Longwell has registered 13 tackles twice this fall and has recorded a tackle for loss in eight of 12 games.
- He leads the team in tackles this season after also pacing Vandy last fall, finishing with 89 stops.
- Patterson has totaled five or more tackles in six of the last seven games and ranks third on the team.
 Patterson finished the 2024 campaign with 78 tackles after posting 74 in 2023.
- For their careers, Patterson has 218 tackles to his name while Longwell enters bowl season with 193.

ROCKY TOPPED

- Vanderbilt took down rival Tennessee 45-24 at Neyland Stadium to wrap up the regular season, giving the Commodores their first win over the Volunteers since 2018 and first win in Knoxville since 2017.
- The Dores amassed a season-high 314 rushing yards, the most by Vandy against an SEC school since
- Vanderbilt's 45 points were the most allowed by Tennessee's defense all season.
- Diego Pavia set a school record for most passing yards in a season (3,192) after throwing for 268 at Tennessee.
- Sedrick Alexander rushed for 115 yards and three touchdowns. He moved into a tie for third in the school record book with his 21st career rushing score.
- The Dores recorded a rushing touchdown for the 16th straight game, their longest streak in 13 years.
- Vanderbilt was selected as the Pop-Tarts Crazy Good Team of the Week.



GAME NOTES

SOARING ON SENIOR DAY

- Vanderbilt beat Kentucky 45-17 on Senior Day to close out the home campaign. The 28-point margin of victory was Vandy's third highest against an SEC opponent since 1980.
- The Dores established a program record with 539 passing yards. Diego Pavia posted a career-high 484 yards through the air, also a program record.
- Pavia's 532 total yards of offense are the most in a game for the Dores since at least 1996 and he set Vandy's season record for total offense at 3,585 yards.
- Pavia became the first FBS quarterback this season to have a game with both 480 passing yards and five touchdowns.
- Tre Richardson caught three touchdowns, the second time a Dore has recorded a hat trick this season, joining Junior Sherrill.

TIGER KINGS

- Vanderbilt won three consecutive home games against Tigers (LSU, Missouri, Auburn).
- Vandy's 45 points were the most Auburn has allowed all season. Entering the game, the Tigers were one of only three FBS teams to not give up more than 24 points in a game.
- Diego Pavia collected a then career-high 489 total yards of offense, throwing for 377 yards and adding an additional 112 yards on the ground. He became the first Vanderbilt football player to collect over 300 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in a game. Pavia earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance.

BLOCK PARTY

- Vanderbilt blocked an extra-point, field goal and punt in the Week 4 win over Georgia State.
- The last time a team blocked one of each type of kick in a game was Oklahoma State in 2014. Vandy was the first SEC program to accomplish the feat since at least 2002.
- Jamison Curtis was named SEC Co-Freshman of the Week after he blocked a GSU punt and returned it 4 yards for a touchdown.
- Emmanuel Adebi blocked a GSU field goal attempt, the eighth blocked kick of his career. Adebi set the program record at Cornell with seven blocked kicks.
- The Dores' three blocked kicks this season lead the SEC and are eighth among FBS teams.

BROCKET LAUNCHER

- Brock Taylor owns the school record for most extra points made (57) and attempted (58) in a season after converting 6-of-6 in each of the final two games of the regular season.
- Taylor has 183 points to his name as a Commodore to sit seventh on Vandy's all-time scoring list. His 90 points this season are tied for third most in program history.
- Taylor connected on a 44-yard field goal at Texas, his fourth make of 40-plus yards on the season.
- Taylor was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance vs. Utah State going 2-for-2 on field goals and 6-for-6 on extra points.
- Taylor nailed a 51-yard kick at South Carolina, giving him six makes of 50 or more yards. He is the first player in school history with at least five 50-yard-plus field goals.
- He finished the 2024 campaign with 18 field goals, two shy of matching the program record of 20 set by Carey Spear in 2012.
- Taylor made his last 11 field goal attempts of the season over the final eight games (he did not attempt a field goal in the Birmingham Bowl).
- He connected on a program-record 57-yard field goal at Missouri in 2024.
- Taylor was chosen SEC Special Teams Player of the Week twice last season and was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award on Nov. 19.

THE BECKONING

- Vanderbilt's offense has been transformed under second-year offensive coordinator Tim Beck's watch.
- According to ESPN FPI, the Dores lead the nation in offensive efficiency (93.4) and sit sixth in overall efficiency (85.5).
- For the second consecutive year, Beck was named a semifinalist for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.
- $\bullet \text{Among FBS programs, Vandy ranks eighth in scoring, third in third-down conversion percentage, fourth in passing efficiency and 11th in total offense.$
- Vanderbilt's 539 team passing yards in the Kentucky win are the most in a game in program history, as well as the most by an SEC team and second most by an FBS team this season.
- The Commodores opened the 2025 campaign with back-to-back games amassing over 475 yards of offense, marking the first time Vanderbilt has accomplished that feat since 2016 against Ole Miss and Tennessee.
- Vandy's ESPN FPI offensive efficiency (67.5) ranked 28th in FBS in 2024. It was Vanderbilt's best finish in offensive efficiency since 2005 when the Dores ended up 25th in the metric's first year. Prior to Beck's arrival, Vanderbilt's best finish during Clark Lea's tenure was 76th in 2022.
- The Commodores were the best in the nation at protecting the football, finishing with an FBS-low seven turnovers on the season.
- Vanderbilt also led the SEC and finished third in FBS in red zone offense, getting points on 93.3 percent of its red zone trips (42-for-45).

EARNING THEIR STRIPES

- Vanderbilt grinded out a 17-10 victory over Missouri in Week 9, holding the Tigers to their lowest point total all season.
- Vandy earned its seventh win before November for just the second time ever, matching the 1915 team.
- The Dores forced a turnover in the win to record a takeaway in nine of the last 10 games.
- Makhilyn Young broke an 80-yard touchdown rush, the longest by a Commodore since 2022.
- Diego Pavia scored the go-ahead touchdown late in the fourth quarter, his 20th overall touchdown on the season.
- Bryan Longwell, Miles Capers and Dontae Carter each matched or set new career marks in tackles.
- Vanderbilt is now 2-0 all-time when hosting College GameDay.

RECORD-SETTING NIGHT

- Vanderbilt defeated Georgia State 70-21 on Sept. 20 at FirstBank Stadium, breaking multiple program records in the process.
- The Dores averaged 8.9 yards per play, the most in program history. The previous record was 8.7 yards per play vs. Miami (Fla.) in 1948.
- Vanderbilt's 70 points were the most points scored since 1918 (76 vs. Tennessee).
- The Commodores' 42 points in the first half were the most first-half points scored by Vandy since at least 1996.
- On special teams, the Dores recorded their first blocked PAT attempt since 2017, returned a blocked punt for a touchdown for the first time since 2014 and registered their first blocked field goal since 2022.
- With 236 passing and 322 all-purpose yards in the first half alone, Diego Pavia eclipsed 3,000 passing and 4,000 yards of total offense at Vanderbilt.
- Brock Taylor set the school record for most extra points made in a game and matched the program record for most PAT attempts with nine.

STREAK SNAPPED

- \bullet Vanderbilt exorcized its longest active SEC losing streak with a dominating 31-7 win at No. 11/10 South Carolina in Week 3.
- For a second-straight week, the Commodores pitched a second-half shutout, outscoring the Gamecocks 17-0 down the stretch. Including their go-ahead touchdown in the second quarter, the Dores ran off 24 unanswered points against the Gamecocks.
- Vandy's defense forced four turnovers in the victory, the most for the Commodores since October 2022. Zaylin Wood and Bryan Longwell each snagged interceptions while Bryce Cowan and Randon Fontenette both forced fumbles for the first time in their careers.
- Offensively, Diego Pavia threw for 177 yards and two touchdowns, his fourth-straight game with multiple TD passes. Jamezell Lassiter and Sedrick Alexander each added rushing touchdowns for the Dores.
- The win over South Carolina was the first for the Commodores since 2008, snapping a 16-game skid against the Gamecocks. It also marked Vanderbilt's first road win over an AP-ranked foe since knocking off No. 6 South Carolina in Columbia in 2007.

EXIT SANDMAN

- Vanderbilt stole the night in Blacksburg, storming back from a 20-10 halftime deficit to defeat Virginia
 Tech 44-20
- The Dores outgained the Hokies 321-21 as part of their 34-0 second half domination. It was the largest second-half yardage disparity for the Commodores in available records dating to 2002.
- The win marked the first double-digit comeback for Vanderbilt since 2022. The 24-point margin of victory was the largest for the Dores after trailing by 10-plus points in at least 80 years.
- The victory was also Vanderbilt's first nonconference road win over a Power 4 team since taking down Wake Forest 41-7 on Nov. 26, 2011.
- Diego Pavia accounted for 254 total yards, throwing for 193 and two touchdowns while adding 61 on the ground. It marked the third-straight game with multiple TD passes for Pavia.
- Newcomer Makhilyn Young rushed for a career-best 95 yards and a touchdown. Young also busted a career-long 62-yard scamper to help Vanderbilt ice the road win.
- $\bullet \ \text{Defensively, senior Nick Rinaldi led the Dores with six tackles, including 2.5 for loss and a sack.}\\$

LET'S TALK LASSITER

- Sophomore walk-on Jamezell Lassiter broke free for a 44-yard touchdown run in the win at South Carolina, his second TD carry of the season.
- Lassiter's other TD run came from 35 yards out against Charleston Southern in the opener.
- The pair of touchdowns made him the first Commodore to score on each of his first two career carries since at least 2002.
- Lassiter is averaging 15.9 yards per carry in 2025.

OPENING NIGHT SUCCESS

- Vanderbilt kicked off its 136th season of football with a 45-3 win over Charleston Southern in front of a sold-out FirstBank Stadium.
- The victory marked the fourth season-opening victory in a row, marking the longest stretch of wins in season openers since capturing six in a row from 1970-75.
- Vanderbilt scored a touchdown on each of its first three possessions of the night, the first time the Dores opened a game with three touchdown drives since 2017.
- Quartback Diego Pavia completed 20-of-25 passes for 275 yards and three scores to lead the victory. He added 44 rushing yards on eight carries.



GAME NOTES

CAPTAINING THE SHIP

- Vanderbilt named eight veterans as team captains for the 2025 season. Commodore captains are voted on and selected by the team.
- Richie Hoskins, Langston Patterson, Diego Pavia and Marlen Sewell were all selected as captains for a second-straight season. Randon Fontenette, Yilanan Ouattara, Eli Stowers and Khordae Sydnor join the leadership group for their first season as captains.
- Jordan White earned a team captain role prior to the Week 5 contest against Utah State.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Eli Stowers has dotted preseason All-America lists this season, garnering first team picks by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, ESPN, Sports Illustrated, Associated Press, The Athletic, The Sporting News, Athlon and Phil Steele
- Stowers is also one of two Commodores who picked up All-SEC recognition from league coaches in advance of the 2025 season, being tabbed preseason first-team All-SEC while Martel Hight landed a spot on the third team.
- Stowers' first team prognostication is the first for the Dores since the 2013 season when Jordan Matthews, Andre Hal and Casey Spear all earned preseason honors.

PAVIA'S HISTORIC 2024 CAMPAIGN

- Diego Pavia's four interceptions thrown last season were the fewest by a Vanderbilt quarterback in a season with at least 200 attempts since 1996.
- He bettered the mark of five previously held by Jay Cutler (2004), Riley Neal (2019), Jordan Rodgers (2012) and Larry Smith (2010).
- With 298 attempts, Pavia hit the mark with more passing attempts than three of the four who previously held the record (Rodgers had 319 attempts).
- As a team, Vandy's Four interceptions last season were the fewest on record (1946). The previous low total for interceptions thrown was five in 2004 and 2012. It was just the 13th time since 1946 that Vanderbilt has thrown fewer than 10 interceptions in a season.
- Pavia's 20 passing touchdowns in 2024 ranked sixth in the SEC. The 20 touchdowns were fifth-most by a Commodore in a season.
- In 2024, Pavia ran for a Vanderbilt QB record 801 yards. That total was the highest by a Power 4 quarterback last season and seventh-most among non-service academy quarterbacks in all of FBS.
- He was named one of 16 semifinalists for the 88th Maxwell Award, as well as one of 16 semifinalists for the Davey O'Brien Award.
- He became the 13th quarterback since 2004 to defeat Alabama and Auburn in the same season and just the fourth do to so without playing in the SEC West (Stetson Bennett, Deshaun Watson, Matthew Stafford). He is the seventh quarterback in that same time frame to have at least three career wins over the Tigers and Tide, joining Jayden Daniels, Bennett, Joe Burrow, Jarrett Lee, Jordan Jefferson, Stafford and JaMarcus Russell.
- Pavia piloted a deadly efficient offense in 2023 while leading New Mexico State to 10 wins. He ranked among the top 35 in FBS in passing touchdowns, points, passing yards per attempt and passing efficiency.

BEAR-LEA SCRATCHING THE SURFACE

- Head coach Clark Lea was named the SEC Coach of the Year after leading Vanderbilt to its first postseason appearance since 2018. He's the first Commodore coach to win the award since Bobby Johnson in 2008. Johnson was Lea's coach during his playing career at Vandy.
- Lea was also named AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the National Coach of the Year.
 He also found himself on the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year watch list after Vanderbilt's historical first half of the season.
- Many of the positive developments in the fall came after Lea retooled the coaching staff following the 2023 season. In addition to taking over defensive coordinator duties, Lea hired a new offensive coordinator (Tim Beck), director of sports performance (Robert Stiner) and chief consultant (Jerry Kill).
- With victories in six of its first nine games, Vanderbilt recorded its best start since 1982, went to its first bowl game since 2018 and had its first winning season and bowl victory since 2013.
- In addition, the Commodores produced their best scoring margin since 2013 and had a positive scoring margin for just the sixth time since 1975. The 27.3 points per game were the most since 2018 and the 23.4 points allowed per game were fewest since 2015.

SCORING MARGINS

- Vanderbilt outscored its opponents 473-263 during the regular season, a margin of +210.
- The 307 points through the first eight games were the most scored by the program before November, passing the 2013 squad which scored 257.
- The Commodores won each of their first five games of the season by 20-plus points, marking the first time Vandy has opened the year with five-straight blowout wins since 1915.
- $\bullet \text{The} + 157 \text{ output was the largest scoring margin by a Vanderbilt team entering November in program history, surpassing the 1955 season when the Dores held a +86 edge at the end of October. \\$
- Under head coach Art Guepe, the 1955 Dores were 4-2 entering November, outscoring opponents 126-40, including shutouts of Middle Tennessee and Chattanooga.
- The '55 Dores finished 8-3 and reached the first bowl game in school history. Vandy defeated No. 8 Auburn, 25-13, in the Gator Bowl.

IMPROVEMENT VS. RANKED TEAMS

• Vanderbilt earned its fourth win over an AP Top 25 team under Clark Lea with its 45-24 drubbing over No. 18 Tennessee in Knoxville to close out the regular season. The Dores have shown remarkable improvements each season during Lea's tenure when facing ranked teams.

- This year's squad has held ranked opponents to just 21.5 points per game, less than half of what the program allowed just three seasons ago.
- Last season, Vanderbilt averaged 28.5 points per game against ranked teams after scoring 18.0 in 2023 and 5.7 in Lea's debut 2021 campaign.
- Vanderbilt averaged over 300 yards of total offense against ranked teams last fall for the first time under Lea, while holding ranked opponents under 450 yards per game for the first time in that span. This fall Lea and the Commodores increased their offensive production to 387.5 yards per game.
- The Week 8 win over No. 10 LSU was the program's second over a top-10 team in the last two seasons (No. 1 Alabama 10.5.24).

COMMODORES CRUISE OVER BUCCANEERS

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt football opened the 2025 season by downing Charleston Southern 45-3 in front of a sold-out crowd at FirstBank Stadium on Saturday.

The Commodores produced 481 yards of total offense, the most since generating 601 against Hawai'i on August 27, 2022. Defensively, Vandy held the Buccaneers to 135 total yards while producing 46 tackles, six for a loss, and forcing two turnovers. The victory marks the Dores' fourth-straight season opening victory.

Multiple milestones were set against the Buccaneers with junior running back Sedrick Alexander hitting 1,000 career rushing yards while graduate quarterback Diego Pavia matched his Vanderbilt single-game high in passing yards with 275 through the air, completing 20-of-25 passes with three touchdowns.

The Dores last faced the Bucs in 2014, pulling out a 21-20 home win in the first meeting between the two programs; Saturday's matchup looked much different. Freshman wideout Kayleb Barnett started the scoring on a nine-yard jet pass from Pavia, marking the first career touchdown for Barnett. Vanderbilt found pay dirt on its next drive as Pavia connected with junior wide receiver Junior Sherrill for a 12-yard touchdown toss. At the 3:04 mark in the first quarter, the Commodores scored again on a four-yard run from junior running back AJ Newberry, pushing the lead to 21-0. It is the first time Vandy has scored touchdowns on its first three drives of a game since September 25, 2017, against Tennessee.

Vanderbilt increased the lead to 28-0 with its final score of the half late in the second quarter, a 26-vard pass from Pavia to Alexander. The 28-0 lead at the halftime break marks the first shutout through the opening two quarters since Alcorn State in 2024. The last time the Dores scored four touchdowns in the first half was against Elon in 2022.

The Commodores continued to control the game in the second half. Junior running back Makhilyn Young nabbed his first Vanderbilt touchdown on a four-yard run with 5:47 left in the third. Junior kicker Brock Taylor drilled his one and only attempt of the contest to begin the fourth quarter, splitting the uprights from 35 yards out. The Dores added insurance on a 35-yard rush from sophomore Jamezell Lassiter to finish off the 45-3 route. The score was also Lassiter's first as a Commodore.

Vanderbilt travels to Blacksburg, Virginia next Saturday for a meeting with Virginia Tech; the Commodores used an overtime effort to oust the Hokies 34-27 in last year's season opener. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. and will air on the ACC Network.

ENTER COMMODORES

BLACKSBURG, Va. - Vanderbilt football took Virginia Tech off to never-never land on Saturdaynight, as the Commodores made the light exit out of Lane Stadium in the second half, shutting out the Hokies over the final 30 minutes to mount a 44-20 come-from-behind victory.

Vandy scored on five-straight possessions in the second half, while holding Virginia Tech scoreless over the final two quarters to turn a 20-10 halftime deficit into a 44-20 win. It is the first time that Vanderbilt has won a game when trailing by 10-plus points since Sept. 17, 2022, at Northern Illinois, and it is the largest margin of victory when trailing by 10 or more points in 80-plus seasons.

Vanderbilt moves to 2-0 for the second-straight season, while the Hokies fall to 0-2 to open the 2025 campaign.

The Commodores collected 490 total yards, rushing for 262 yards against the Hokies. Junior Makhilyn Young paced Vanderbilt's ground attack with a career-high 95 yards on eight carries finding the end zone once. Junior Sedrick Alexander ran in a pair of touchdowns in a game for the third time in his career while collecting 73 rushing yards.

Graduate Diego Pavia amassed 256 total yards, throwing for 193 while adding another 63 yards on the ground. The guarterback tossed for two touchdowns in the win, marking the 10th game that Pavia has thrown for two-plus scores, while it is his seventh contest at Vanderbilt with 250-plus

Senior Nick Rinaldi had a team-high six tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack, his first of 2025. Graduate Marlen Sewell, junior Bryan Longwell and sophomore CJ Heard each had five tackles, while Heard posted his first sack of the season.

It is Vandy's first win over Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, as the Dores are now 5-6 all-time vs. the Hokies. Coupled with last year's season-opening 34-27 overtime victory in Nashville, Vanderbilt collects back-to-back wins over Virginia Tech for the first time since winning the first two games in the 11-game series during the 1930 and 1965 campaigns.

The victory at Virginia Tech marks the Dores' first nonconference road win over a Power 4 foe since knocking off Wake Forest 41-7 on Nov. 26, 2011. The last time the Dores shut out an opponent in the second half was on Nov. 2, 2024, when Vanderbilt blanked Auburn at Jordan-Hare Stadium in

Vanderbilt remains on the road for its next contest, as the Commodores head to South Carolina on Saturday to battle the No. 10/11-ranked Gamecocks. Kickoff from Williams-Brice Stadium is set for 6:45 p.m. CT and airs live on SEC Network.

COMMODORES CAGE NO. 11 GAMECOCKS

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Graduate quarterback Diego Pavia produced another multi-touchdown game while the Commodore defense delivered a third-straight lockdown performance as /anderbilt football knocked off No. 11 South Carolina 31-7 in front of a sold-out crowd at Williams-Brice Stadium on Saturday night.

The win is the first for Vanderbilt (3-0, 1-0 SEC) in a conference opener since 2011 against Ole Miss. It also snaps a 16-game skid against South Carolina (2-1, 0-1 SEC) while the 24-point margin of victory is Vandy's largest in series history. The Dores' last road win against an AP-ranked opponent came against none other than the Gamecocks, a 17-6 victory over No. 6 South Carolina in 2007. Head coach Clark Lea has led his team to three-straight wins of 20 points or more to open the season, the first time the program has accomplished that feat

Pavia finished with two touchdowns and 177 yards on 18 of 25 passing, becoming the first Vanderbilt quarterback since Jordan Rodgers in 2012 to have four consecutive games with multiple passing touchdowns. Junior running back Sedrick Alexander added two touchdowns of his own, his second consecutive season scoring in each of the three opening games. On the opposite side of the ball, Vandy forced multiple turnovers for the fourth time in five games. The four total turnovers on Saturday are the most generated by the Commodores since securing four against Missouri in 2022.

Vanderbilt quieted the crowd on its opening drive, marching 73 yards in nine plays, capped off with an 18-yard pass from Pavia to Alexander. South Carolina quickly evened the score moments later on a seven-yard rush from Rahsul Faison. It was South Carolina's lone score of the night, as Vanderbilt's defense stifled the Gamecocks for the final 50:58 of game time.

The Commodores pushed the lead to 14-7 going into halftime after Pavia connected with iunior wideout Junior Sherrill on a five-vard out route. Vanderbilt went ahead 21-7 to open the second half after a 44-yard breakaway run from sophomore Jamezell Lassiter. Lassiter now has two rushes this season, both of which have been for at least 35 yards and have resulted in touchdowns. With 9:31 to go in the fourth, junior kicker Brock Taylor drilled a 51-yarder to make the score 24-7. Alexander added another touchdown with 5:29 remaining to finish off the scoring, his second game this season scoring multiple times.

Sophomore CJ Heard collected a season-high 12 tackles to lead the Vandy defense. Senior Nick Rinaldi paced the Dores with 2.5 tackles for a loss, including his eighth career sack, while junior Randon Fontenette added two stops behind the line of his own. Multiple defensemen set milestones against South Carolina: graduate Zaylin Wood nabbed his first interception as a Commodore, senior Bryce Cowan forced his first career fumble and senior Miles Capers and junior Jordan Matthews both had their first career fumble recoveries.

Vanderbilt moves to 3-0 for the first time since 2017. The Commodores return home to host Georgia State next Saturday with kickoff set for 6:30 p.m. and coverage on ESPNU.

DORES POUNCE ON PANTHERS

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Seven individuals reached the end zone, 11 members of the defense were credited with at least three stops and specials teams units blocked three kicks on Saturday, a balanced effort that led to No. 20/23 Vanderbilt football defeating Georgia State, 70-21, Saturday at FirstBank Stadium.

The Commodores scored touchdowns on all six first-half possessions, with Diego Pavia accounting for over 300 yards of total offense and a pair of scores in building a 42-9 advantage at the break. Sedrick Alexander had rushing and receiving touchdowns in the opening two quarters, with Pavia and Junior Sherrill adding scoring runs from 16 and 8 yards out, respectively, before AJ Newberry reached the end zone twice in a two-and-a-half minute stretch as Vandy outgained the Panthers by over 200 yards in the first half.

Makhilyn Young and quarterbacks Blaze Berlowitz and Drew Dickey added rushing touchdowns after the break while Jamison Curtis blocked a punt and returned it seven yards for a score as Vandy (4-0) reached the 70-point plateau for the first time since the

Jordan Matthews was one of six individuals with four stops for the Dores' defense, including a forced fumble that led to Vandy's third score late in the opening quarter. Bryan Longwell and Khordae Sydnor each were credited with one tackle for loss—the latter also broke up a pass and blocked an extra-point attempt—and Miles Capers matched a career high with 2½ stops behind the line. The Commodores recorded eight tackles for loss in all, with three sacks to go along with nine additional quarterback hurries.

Vandy quarterbacks found 14 different targets while combining to throw for 349 yards, with Pavia completing 18-of-24 attempts for 245 yards and a score. Eli Stowers led all players with 73 yards on a team-best five receptions, and Tristen Brown equaled a career high with three catches for 71 vards.

Pavia also paced the Commodores on the ground with 86 yards on nine carries, with Young and Berlowitz contributing touchdown runs of 40-plus yards to help Vanderbilt finished with 286 yards rushing and 635 in all.

TJ Finley finished 22-of-35 passing for 176 yards and two touchdowns for the Panthers (1-3), as Ted Hurst caught seven balls for 71 yards and DJ Riles added five receptions for 57 yards and a score. But the Vandy defense limited Georgia State to just 32 rushing yards and an average of 1.6 yards per carry.

The Panthers' Josiah Robinson made nine tackles, with one 4 yards behind the line of scrimmage, to lead all players in the contest.

Vanderbilt concludes nonconference play next Saturday against Utah State, with kickoff at FirstBank Stadium scheduled for 11:45 a.m.

COMMODORES REMAIN UNBEATEN

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Graduate quarterback Diego Pavia delivered a record-setting performance, junior wideout Junior Sherrill finished with a career-best three receiving touchdowns and No. 18/20 Vanderbilt football remained unbeaten, downing Utah State 55-35 at FirstBank Stadium on Saturday.

Pavia set career-high marks in passing touchdowns with five and completions with 26. He also threw for 321 total vards, his most as a Commodore and the second-highest total of his career. Pavia ties Johnny McCrary, Jay Cutler and Bill Wade at Vanderbilt for the most passing touchdowns in a game and moves to No. 6 on the all-time passing touchdowns list with 33. In total, Pavia finished with exactly 400 total yards of offense, the most since Kyle Shurmur generated 405 against Tennessee in 2016. Sherrill's three touchdowns, all of which came in the first half, mark the most receiving scores in a half for a Commodore since Earl Bennett caught four in the second half against Kentucky in 2005. In total, Sherrill finished with six catches for 91 yards, both of which are also career highs.

The Commodores move to 5-0, matching 2008's 5-0 start, Vanderbilt's eighth-ranked scoring offense has scored 50 or more points in consecutive games for the first time since 1915. The black and gold have manufactured 40 points or more in four games so far, the first time doing so in a season since 2012.

Utah State (3-2) struck first with an 18-yard throw and catch from Bryson Barnes to Miles Davis. Vanderbilt (5-0) responded on its next drive as Pavia found Sherrill from 21 yards out, evening the score at 7-7 to close the first quarter. The Commodores proceeded to score on their next seven drives in the game, capped off by Pavia's record-tying fifth passing touchdown on a 53-yard strike to graduate Richie Hoskins. The play gave Vandy a 48-21 lead with 1:19 remaining in the third. Junior Makhilyn Young notched the last Commodore score on a 15-yard scamper with 5:21 left in game; he now has four rushing touchdowns for Vanderbilt this season. Junior kicker Brock Taylor drilled two field goals in the contest, extending his current streak to 16 field goals made.

The Commodore defense again used a lockdown second half to close out the game, allowing just 14 points to the Aggies across the final 30 minutes. Graduate Kolbey Taylor's fumble recovery to start the fourth quarter is the seventh-straight game Vandy has forced a turnover. Graduate Marlen Sewell led the black and gold with a season-high seven tackles, his most since totaling nine against Kentucky in 2023. Three separate Commodores Graduate Miles Capers, Graduate Khordae Sydnor and Senior Linus Zunk – recorded multiple tackles for a loss; as a team, the Dores totaled eight throughout the contest.

Vanderbilt will travel to Tuscaloosa next Saturday eveing a second straight win against No. 17/16 Alabama. The game is set for a 2:30 p.m. kickoff from Bryant-Denny Stadium with coverage on ABC or ESPN.

DORES DROP RANKED BATTLE IN TUSCALOOSA

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — No. 16/17 Vanderbilt matched No. 10/11 Alabama through the first two quarters but fell 30-14 as the Crimson Tide pulled away in the second half to hand the Commodores their first defeat on the season.

Vanderbilt registered more than 300 yards on offense, but a pair of red zone turnovers proved costly with Alabama scoring 10 points off the miscues.

The Crimson Tide controlled the clock in the second half and finished the game with more than 37 minutes of possession.

Martel Hight shutdown Alabama's opening drive with an interception as the Crimson Tide went for it on fourth down in Vanderbilt territory. Vandy's defense has now forced a turnover in eight-straight games.

The Commodores' first drive began on its own 7-yard line, but Vandy went 93 yards to put the first points on the board. The score came off a 65-yard touchdown run by Sedrick Alexander, the longest play of the season for Vandy and a career-long for Alexander.

Alabama pulled even at 7-7 with just over nine minutes to go in the second quarter.

The score remained tied until inside the two-minute warning. With 1:33 to go before halftime, Alexander found the end zone for the second time, this one coming on a shovel pass from Diego Pavia.

Alexander finished with 98 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns.

Alabama quickly responded with a game-tying score with 17 seconds left in the first half, sending the game to halftime even at 14-14.

The Crimson Tide took their first lead of the game in the third quarter on a 38-yard field goal and connected on a second field goal to take a 20-14 lead into the final quarter.

Vandy's defense again held Alabama to a field goal as the home side took a 23-14 lead with a little over four minutes to go.

The Crimson Tide added a rushing touchdown with 17 seconds left to win 30-14.

Next up for the 5-1 Commodores is a bye week before hosting LSU on October 18 at FirstBank Stadium.

VANDY TAMES TIGERS

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Diego Pavia played the role of Tiger King on Saturday afternoon ata sold-out FirstBank Stadium, as the guarterback collected three total touchdowns to lift the No. 17/18-ranked Vanderbilt football team past No. 10/10 LSU, 31-24, for the first time

The No. 17/18 Commodores controlled the line of scrimmage throughout on Saturday, as Vandy held the ball for 36:33 of game time. That allowed the Dores to amass 399 total yards of offense, 239 of which came on the ground. It is the fourth game this season that Vanderbilt has posted 200-plus rushing yards.

Vanderbilt posts its first win over a team ranked inside the top 10 of the Associated Press poll since the Dores knocked off No. 1-ranked Alabama at FirstBank Stadium last season. Coupled with its victory over No. 11-ranked South Carolina earlier this season, Vandy has now defeated two AP top-15 teams in the same season for the first time in program history. Additionally, it is the first time since the 1990 season that Vanderbilt has defeated LSU, when the Dores posted a 24-21 victory in Nashville.

The Commodores move to 6-1 for the first time since 1950. The six wins make Vanderbilt postseason eligible for the second-straight season. It is the first time that the Dores have been postseason eligible in consecutive seasons since going to three-straight bowls from

Pavia tallied three scores in a game for the third time this season, as the Albuquerque, New Mexico, native ran in for a pair of touchdowns to go along with a touchdown through the air. The Vanderbilt quarterback registered 246 total yards of offense, as Pavia threw for 160 yards and rushed for an additional 86 yards, which led the Commodores against LSU. It is the sixth game this season that Pavia has had 200-plus offensive yards.

No. 17-ranked Vanderbilt returns to action on Saturday, as the Commodores host No. 16/16 Missouri. Kickoff and television designations will be set this Sunday. Check back with VUCommodores.com during the week for a full game preview.

STRIPES EARNED

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Hours after hosting College GameDay for the first time since 2008, No. 10/12 Vanderbilt moved to 7-1 for the first time since 1941 with a 17-10 win over No. 15/14 Missouri in front of a sold-out crowd at FirstBank Stadium on Saturday.

Despite both teams entering with top-25 offenses in terms of vardage, the score sat 3-3 at halftime. Vanderbilt held Missouri (6-2, 2-2 SEC) to 156 yards of total offense in the first half, the Tigers' lowest through the opening two quarters of play this season. Junior kicker Brock Taylor produced the only points of the first half for the Commodores, converting a 38-yard field goal with two minutes to go before halftime. The kick marks Taylor's 18th straight make. Heading into the game, he was tied for the fifth-longest active streak across Division 1.

Graduate quarterback Diego Pavia had a tipped pass lead to an interception to open the third quarter, giving Missouri possession in plus territory. The Tigers pushed the ball inside the Commodore 3-yard line but were held scoreless by the Commodore defense after a fourth down stop at the goal line. Mizzou again threatened to score after forcing a Vanderbilt three-and-out to set up a 29-yard field goal attempt. Freshman Robert Meyer kicked it off the left upright and the game continued tied at 3-3.

Junior Makhilyn Young generated a much-needed spark on the next snap. Young bounced a run to the outside and took it 80 yards to the house, giving the Dores a 10-3 lead with 3:51 left in the third. The carry is the longest play of the season for Vanderbilt and longest rush since 2022. Missouri answered on the ensuing drive with its first touchdown of the game, capping off a 75-yard, 12-play possession on a six-yard pass and catch from freshman Matt Zollers to freshman Jude James.

The Dores converted the go-ahead score moments later on a 1-yard rush from Pavia to grab a 17-10 lead; the drive lasted nine plays and took 5:10 off the clock. It was Pavia's 20th

Missouri made its way to midfield in the closing seconds. In the final play of regulation, the Tigers threw a Hail Mary pass that was caught by senior wideout Kevin Coleman Jr. but ruled just short at the half-yard line, sealing the Vandy win. It is the first Commodore victory in the series since 2019. Vanderbilt held Missouri to its lowest point total of the season and its fewest points scored since Oct. 26, 2024.

The Dores have defeated three AP-ranked opponents so far, marking the most in program history through the regular season. All three wins came over top-15 teams, tying Alabama for the most top-15 victories nationwide. Vandy now matches the program record for wins before November with seven, which was last reached in the 1915 season.

OMMODORE COMEBACK CUT SHORT IN AUSTIN

AUSTIN, Texas. — The Commodores' fourth-quarter comeback, powered by a career performance from quarterback Diego Pavia, was cut short on Saturday as the No. 9 Vanderbilt football team fell 34-31 at No. 20 Texas.

Pavia finished with a career-high 408 yards of total offense, 365 passing and 43 rushing. It's the most by a Commodore against an SEC opponent since 2006 (Chris Nickson, 517 yards) and a season-high passing total for Pavia. He went 27-for-38 passing with no interceptions, also accounting for four touchdowns. With his performance in Austin, Pavia moves to No. 7 in the program record books for career passing yards.

Eli Stowers led the Commodores (7-2, 3-2 SEC) with seven catches for 146 yards, the fourth-most by a tight end in the country this season. Stowers hauled in two touchdown receptions, his first multi-touchdown game of the season. Junior Sherrill and Richie Hoskins each made five receptions, a career-high for Hoskins. The Vanderbilt defense was paced by Nick Rinaldi and Marlen Sewell who each posted a season-high eight tackles.

Texas (7-2, 4-1 SEC) quarterback Arch Manning finished 25-of-33 with 328 passing yards and three touchdowns. Quintrevion Wisner led the Longhorns on the ground, amassing 75 yards on 18 carries. Emmett Mosley made a team-high seven catches for 69 yards.

The Longhorns stormed out to an early 17-0 lead in the first quarter, scoring first on a 75yard touchdown pass from Arch Manning to Ryan Wingo.

Brock Taylor put Vandy's first points on the board in the second quarter, drilling a field goal from 44 yards out. It was his 19th consecutive made field goal and fourth from 40-plus

A conversion on fourth-and-five opened the door for Vanderbilt to score on an 18-vard pass from Pavia to Stowers, making it a two-score game with 15 seconds left in the first half.

Texas was the first to score out of the locker room as Manning found Mosley on a six-yard

The Commodores marched 45 yards down the field to the Texas 30, putting Vandy in field goal range. Taylor's 48-yard field goal attempt was unsuccessful, ending his streak of 19 consecutive made field goals, which was the sixth-longest active run in the nation heading into Saturday's game.

The Commodores continued to battle back in the fourth quarter, putting up 21 unanswered points to cut the Longhorns' lead to three. Vanderbilt's onside kick attempt in the closing seconds was unsuccessful, however, and Texas held on to win the game by a score of 34-31.

Next up, the Commodores return home to host Auburn for their homecoming game. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. on the SEC Network.

TIGER TAKEDOWN

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Quarterback Diego Pavia rallied No. 15/16 Vanderbilt from a 17-3 first half deficit to a thrilling 45-38 overtime win over Auburn, earning the Commodores their eighth win of the season at a sold-out FirstBank Stadium on Saturday.

Pavia accounted for a career-best 489 yards of offense, including a career-high 377 yards passing and 112 rushing yards. He became the first Vanderbilt player to register 300 yards passing and 100 yards rushing in program history. Pavia also accounted for four touchdowns – one rushing and three passing. As an offense, Vanderbilt totaled 544 total yards - the most for the program against an SEC opponent since 2016 (608 vs. Tennessee). The 45 points were the most scored against the Auburn defense this year.

Pavia's receivers posted career numbers as well. Tight end Eli Stowers recorded a careerbest 12 receptions for 122 yards and wide receiver Tre Richardson recorded 124 receiving yards, including a 57-yard scoring strike, on only three receptions.

Auburn carried a 20-10 halftime lead before Vanderbilt came roaring back to take a 31-30 advantage early in the fourth quarter. The Tigers would equalize the score at 38 with 5:27 remaining in regulation, setting the stage for overtime.

Vanderbilt took the field first in overtime and Pavia connected with tight end Cole Spence on a jump pass from the 4-yard line to take a 45-38 lead. On Auburn's possession, the Tigers drove to the 12-yard line before failing on a fourth down pass to the end zone.

The Commodore defense was led by linebacker Bryan Longwell (12 tackles) and defensive back Randon Fontenette, who tallied a season-high eight stops. The defense accounted for five stops in the second half and overtime to secure the win.

The win moves Vanderbilt to 8-2, which is the first time registering eight wins in a season. since 2013 when the team totaled nine victories. The Commodores are 8-2 through their first 10 games of the season for the first time since 1930. Saturday's win also marked backto-back seasons beating Auburn for the first since the 1949-50 campaigns.

Vanderbilt will be off next weekend and are back in action on Nov. 22 when Kentucky visits FirstBank Stadium.

DORES SOAR ON SENIOR DAY

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - G raduate Diego Pavia saved his best performance to date for his finalhome game as a Commodore at FirstBank Stadium, as the quarterback set the school's single-game passing yards record with 484 yards through the air to lead No. 14-ranked Vanderbilt in a 45-17 victory over Kentucky on Senior Day.

The Albuquerque, New Mexico, native's 484 passing yards vs. Kentucky breaks Whit Taylor's 44-year-old program record of 464 passing yards set at Tennessee during the 1981 season. Pavia also matched his school record for most passing touchdowns in a game with five, equaling his 5-touchdown performance vs. Utah State on Sept. 27. The quarterback posted a career-high 84.6 percent completion percentage, as he connected on 33-of-39 pass attempts. The quarterback also added a team-best 48 rushing yards and a score on the ground to give him six total touchdowns against the Wildcats.

Pavia continues to stay hot to close out the 2025 regular season. He has now thrown for 350-plus yards with four-or-more total touchdowns in each of his last three contests. Since the calendar rolled to November, the quarterback has thrown for 1,226 yards with 11 passing touchdowns with only one interception, while he has added 203 yards on the ground with three rushing touchdowns. His 14 total touchdowns are the most collected by an FBS player in November.

The 28–point victory over the Wildcats pushes Vanderbilt's overall record to 9-2 and 5-2 in SEC play. It is the first time the program has won nine regular-season games since 1915, while it is the school's first 9-win campaign since 2012.

The win marks the first undefeated season at home for the Commodores since 1982, Vandy also recorded its seventh win at home to set a school record for most home victories in

No. 14-ranked Vanderbilt threw for a school-record 539 passing yards, as the Commodores collected 500-plus yards through the air in a game for the first time in program history.

Vandy's 539 passing yards are the most a Power 4 school has thrown in a single game this season, while it is the second-most at the FBS level.

The defense also shined against the Wildcats on Senior Day. Vanderbilt collected a seasonhigh three interceptions, with two coming from junior Martell Hight, making him the first Dore since De'Rickey Wright vs. Hawai'i in 2023 to have multiple interceptions in a game. The Dores held an SEC opponent under 20 points for the third time this season, marking the first time since the 2016 campaign the Dores accomplished the feat.

No. 14 Vanderbilt concludes the 2025 regular season on Saturday, as the Commodores head east to take on in-state rival Tennessee. Kickoff against the Volunteers is set for 2:30 p.m. CT and will air live on ESPN.

ROCKY TOPPED

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Graduate Diego Pavia and junior Sedrick Alexander spearheaded a dynamic rushing attack to keep No. 14 Vanderbilt's playoff hopes alive, downing No. 19 Tennessee 45-24 at Neyland Stadium on Saturday for the Commodores' first win over the Volunteers since 2018.

Both teams traded blows throughout the opening two quarters in what was the highest combined first half point total since Sept. 27 when Vanderbilt and Utah State combined for 52. After forcing a turnover, Tennessee (8-4, 4-4 SEC) opened the scoring on a 12-play, 80-yard drive capped off by a 2-yard rush from DeSean Bishop. The Dores responded on the ensuing drive behind a 28-yard touchdown run from Alexander, going 75 yards in under three minutes.

Vandy (10-2, 6-2 SEC) grabbed its first lead of the contest in just four plays to start the second quarter. The Commodores moved up 14-7 after junior Makhilyn Young rumbled in from 3 yards out. It was the first score for Young since his 80-yard burst against Missouri on Oct. 25. Bishop gave Tennessee a 21-14 advantage soon after with a 35-yard scoring scamper. Vandy made the score 21-21 in the closing seconds of the first half, going 52 yards in seven plays and finished off by a Pavia 3-yard touchdown pass to junior Tre Richardson. Richardson now has three straight games with a score.

The Commodores leaned on the run game coming out of halftime, generating 91 rushing yards across its first two drives en route to two scores. Alexander again found pay dirt for his eighth career multi-score game, and junior Brock Taylor drilled a 35-yard field goal with 2:12 remaining in the third. The black and gold have scored on the opening drive of the third quarter in three consecutive games, and in total have outscored opponents 114-40 in

Pavia took a designed run to the house from 24 yards out to give Vanderbilt a 38-24 lead with 8:55 left in the game. Vandy punched in the dagger moments later on another Alexander touchdown. His three-score performance is a career high and is tied for the third-most rushing touchdowns in a game in program history. The Vols were held out of the

Pavia outgained the entirety of Tennessee's team in yardage, throwing for 268 yards and rushing for 165 compared to the Volunteers' 382 yards of total offense. It was Pavia's career high in rushing yards. Alexander finished the day with 115 yards on the ground on just 10 carries, setting his career best in rushing yards as well. The Dores rushed for a season-high 314 combined yards, their most since going for 404 against Hawai'i in 2022 and their most against an SEC opponent since at least 1996. Vanderbilt's six SEC wins are the most in the program's record book, while the victory capped the first 10-win season for the Dores across their 135-year history.
