THE FAST BREAK

■ **No. 11 Oklahoma (17-5, 5-4 SEC)** is set for its sixth top-10 test of the season, and its fifth over its last seven games, facing **No. 7 Vanderbilt (22-2, 8-2 SEC)** on Monday at Memorial Gymnasium. Tip in Nashville is set for 8 p.m. CT on ESPN2 with **Courtney Lyle (play-by-play)** and **Stephanie White (analyst)** on the call. Fans can listen on the Sooner Sports Radio Network (107.7 FM) with **Brian Brinkley** and **Tyler Neal**, or in Spanish on Los Sooners Radio (1560 AM) with **Luis Rendon**, with both broadcasts streaming on the Varsity App.

■ Oklahoma is **seeking its third ranked win of the season**, which would add to a neutral-site victory over then-No. 23 Oklahoma State (92-70) and an overtime win against then-No. 2 South Carolina on Jan. 22 (94-82). The Sooners also own a top-30 NET win over NC State in Norman on Dec. 3. All five of OU's losses have come against AP top-20 opponents, including four against teams then ranked inside the top 10.

■ Monday night features two of the nation's top offenses as Oklahoma **ranks third nationally in scoring offense (88.0 PPG)**, a mark that would set a program record, while Vanderbilt ranks 11th in PPG (84.7). OU's starting five has been one of the most productive units in the country, ranking second nationally at 69.0 PPG with all five starters averaging double figures. The Sooners also rank near the top nationally across several offensive categories, including pace (78.4, 1st), scoring offense (88.0, 3rd), second-chance points (16.8, 3rd), fast-break points (17.8, 4th), assists (20.7, 4th) and paint points (43.7, 8th).

■ While Oklahoma's offense often draws the spotlight, the Sooner defense has been the engine behind this season's success. OU ranks third nationally and leads the SEC in opponent field goal percentage (33.2%) and **ranks seventh nationally in defensive rating at 79.5 points allowed per 100 possessions**. The Sooners hold opponents 12.0 points below their scoring average and 10.7% below their season field goal percentage. Only three teams this season, Florida State, NC State (in OT) and Auburn, have scored above their season scoring average against OU.

■ Both Wooden Award midseason finalists, freshman guard **Aaliyah Chavez** and senior All-America center **Raegan Beers**, form one of the nation's most productive duos and are both top-10 finalists for their respective positional Player of the Year awards. The pair combines to average 34.5 PPG, ranking 10th among Power Five tandems and third in the SEC. One of the two has led Oklahoma in scoring in 15 games this season, with the Sooners going 13-2 in those contests. When Chavez and Beers combine for at least 35 points, OU is 11-1, with the lone loss coming to No. 18 Ole Miss.

NOTE OF THE NIGHT

■ Monday's marquee matchup comes in the backcourt as Oklahoma freshman star Aaliyah Chavez faces 2025 SEC Freshman of the Year Mikayla Blakes. Chavez, the nation's No. 1 recruit in 2025, has earned six SEC Freshman of the Week honors this season, third most in SEC history behind Blakes (7) and Rhyne Howard (8). **Chavez and Blakes are two of three underclassmen guards nationally averaging at least 18.5 PPG and 4.0 APG while committing 3.0 turnovers or fewer per game**, joining Ohio State's Jaloni Cambridge.

LAST TIME OUT

■ Oklahoma (17-5, 5-4 SEC) fell on the road to No. 4 Texas, 78-70, at the Moody Center in Austin on Sunday. The loss snapped 10th-ranked OU's winning streak at three as all of OU's five losses this season have come to ranked teams, with four of the five to top-10 foes. The Sooners struggled offensively in the first half, finishing with 24 points, their second-lowest point total in a half this year. Trailing by 16 entering the break, OU battled back in the third, cutting the deficit to nine at three different points in the frame. The Sooners made their last run in the fourth, cutting the Texas lead to seven points with 7:15 remaining in the game but Texas answered with a 9-0 run that iced the game.

■ Payton Verhulst led the way with 18 points, hitting three 3-pointers, including a buzzer-beating shot from behind half court to close the first half. The guard added a team-high four assists and also pulled down two rebounds. The guard now has 14 double-digit scoring games this season and has reached 10 points in five of her last six contests. Raegan Beers logged her nation-leading 61st career double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds. The center continues to lead the country with 16 double-doubles this season. The All-American center has posted 10 double-doubles against ranked teams since joining the Sooners in 2024-25, and has done so four times this year.

■ The teams have met just once before in Nashville, as Vandy knocked off Oklahoma 78-66 on Nov. 26, 2011.

■ Raegan Beers scored a career-high 30 points shooting 11 for 13 and grabbed a season-high 14 rebounds and 16th-ranked Oklahoma beat Vanderbilt 101-81 in Norman. The Sooners led by six (43-37) at halftime, but shot 61% (22 of 36) in the second half to win by 20. Oklahoma reached 100 points for a program record fifth time this season, eclipsing the four 100-point games reached by the 1984, 1986 and 1992 Sooner teams.

WHAT'S ON THE LINE

■ A win would give Oklahoma its 19th ranked win under Baranczyk and its first road win over a top-seven team since the Sooners beat then-No. 4 Baylor, 56-51, in January 2009. OU has dropped 23 straight in road games vs. top-seven teams.

■ A win would move OU to 4-1 since 2021 when wearing its Play 4 Kay pink uniforms. The Sooners have not worn the pink kits on the road under Jennie Baranczyk but will do so Monday to help raise awareness in the fight against cancer and honor survivors and fighters as Vanderbilt hosts its Pink Game.

■ A win would prevent OU from dropping back-to-back games, something it has done just seven times since Jennie Baranczyk arrived in Norman. The Sooners endured a three-game losing streak earlier in conference play but are 26-7 following a loss since 2021.

■ OU is 30-8 over the last five seasons on five days or more of rest (4-2 this season) - OU will enter Monday on seven days of rest.

THIS WEEK IN THE CITY OF NORMAN

■ Aaliyah Chavez and Raegan Beers each earned spots as top-10 finalists for their respective positional player of the year awards. Chavez was named to the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year top-10 list while Beers earned a spot on the top-10 list for the Lisa Leslie Center of the Year trophy. The center was a finalist for the award in each of the last two seasons.

■ The two are both Wooden Award midseason watch listees, given annually to the national player of the year. The Wooden Award names their top-20 candidates next week.

STACKED SEC

■ The Southeastern Conference is once again proving why it's the premier league in women's basketball. Half of the preseason AP top 10 featured SEC teams, including the then-sixth-ranked Sooners. **In the latest AP poll, the SEC landed nine teams in the top 25, including six of the top 15.** In ESPN's latest bracketology, the league lands 11 teams in the Big Dance with seven teams as a top-four seed and hosting.

- Under Jennie Baranczyk, Oklahoma has met or exceeded its preseason placement in the league's preseason poll in each of her four seasons in Norman. Across her 13 full seasons as a head coach - nine at Drake and four at OU - her teams have done so 11 times. **OU was picked fourth in this year's SEC coaches preseason poll and fifth by the league's media.**
- Five of the 12 players on the preseason AP All-America list hail from the SEC, including OU's Raegan Beers (honorable mention). **All five All-SEC First Team selections (including Beers and Vandy's Mikayla Blakes) helped Team USA win gold at the 2025 FIBA AmeriCup, where Jennie Baranczyk served as an assistant coach.**
- Last season, the SEC set a conference record with 24 total basketball teams earning NCAA Tournament bids, 14 on the men's side and 10 on the women's, breaking the previous mark of 16 set in 2024.

PULSE OF THE POLLS

- Oklahoma moved to No. 11 the Feb. 2 AP Poll and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll after wins over Texas A&M and a loss at No. 4 Texas. A new AP poll comes out at 11 a.m. CT before Monday's game.
- OU opened the season at No. 6 in the AP poll, its highest preseason ranking since 2009-10. The Sooners have appeared in the final AP poll in each of the last four seasons, including a No. 11 finish last year - their best since 2009-10. This year marked OU's seventh preseason top-10 ranking (2002, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2024, 2025).
- **Oklahoma carries a 42-week active streak in the AP poll (6th longest in NCAA), the third-longest run in program history and the program's longest stretch since a 59-week span from 2000-03.**
- OU's streak of 34 straight weeks inside the top 20 is also the sixth-longest active run in the nation.
- The Sooners are No. 12 in the NET, 22nd in the Wins Above Bubble metric and No. 11 in Bart Torvik's ranking.

STAR-STUDDED ROSTER

- Oklahoma features one of the nation's most talented rosters based on recruiting rankings. Four of OU's five starters were five-star prospects and McDonald's All-Americans, while the lone non-five-star starter, Zya Vann, was a top-50 recruit in ESPN's rankings.
- **The four McDonald's All-Americans in OU's starting lineup are the program's most in a season since 2017-18. The Sooners are one of nine teams in the country have had the same starting five in every game this season.**

■ All nine of OU's American players were top-100 recruits in either ESPN or 247Sports rankings: Aaliyah Chavez (No. 1), Raegan Beers (No. 10), Payton Verhulst (No. 12), Sahara Williams (No. 23), Zya Vann (No. 46), Keziah Lofton (No. 50), Brooklyn Stewart (No. 66), Caya Smith (No. 72) and Beatrice Culliton (No. 96).

THE CRIMSON AND CREAM SCORING MACHINE

■ If you want to see one of the fastest and most prolific offenses in the country, watch OU basketball. The Sooners are the only team to average at least 82.0 points per game over the last five seasons (Baranczyk era) and set the school record last year with 84.7 PPG. This season, they're **on pace to shatter the school record again and average 88.0 points per game.**

■ **Oklahoma's 88.0 points per game rank third nationally and are powered by 20.7 assists per game (4th NCAA).** The Sooners play fast - leading the nation in adjusted pace (Torvik) at 78.4 possessions/game, and ranks among the national leaders in multiple offensive categories, including second-chance points (16.8, 3rd), fast-break points (17.8, 4th), assists (20.7, 4th) and paint points (43.7, 8th).

■ Baranczyk's teams are built for offense and the numbers back it up. Under her leadership, **Oklahoma has scored 90+ points 51 times (2nd most in NCAA since 21-22) and is 48-3 in those contests**, with all three losses coming against top-15 opponents. The Sooners have reached the 100-point mark 17 times under Baranczyk, the third-most nationally since 2021, including a program record six times this season.

SOONER STOPPERS

■ Oklahoma boasts one of the nation's elite defenses and is **ranked third in the country in opponent FG% at 33.2%**. That figure would shatter the program record of 33.7% set in 2006-07. Only three opponents have scored above their season average against the Sooners, who are holding teams 10.7% below their normal shooting clip and 12.0 points under their typical output. **On the year, OU ranks seventh nationally in defensive rating (79.5), per CBB Analytics.**

■ OU's defense has elevated in conference play as the Sooners rank second in the SEC in field goal percentage defense in league games (36.6%) and lead the conference in 3-point percentage defense (22.9%), nearly four percentage points better than the next closest team. Oklahoma also ranks third in defensive rating in SEC play at 86.6.

■ The Sooners pressure at every level, sitting 15th nationally in blocks per game (5.4 BPG) and force nearly 11 steals per game. They held Maryland Eastern Shore to 17.9% shooting - the second-lowest mark by an OU opponent ever - and held Mississippi State to 20% on Jan. 4, the lowest ever opponent FG% in a conference game in OU history.

■ **Oklahoma is one of four teams nationally to hold at least 81% of its opponents under 40% shooting this season (18 of 22), joining UConn (23 of 25), TCU (20 of 24) and LSU (20 of 24).** Under Jennie Baranczyk, the OU defense has improved each season, with the percentage of opponents held below 40% steadily increasing year over year. Oklahoma has not held 65% of its opponents under 40% shooting, let alone 80%, in at least 16 seasons.

■ One of the nation's premier paint defenses, Oklahoma allows opponents to score just 34.7% of their points inside the lane, third nationally, and only 22.12 paint points per game overall, ranking 11th in the NCAA. Sooner opponents shoot just 35.8% from inside the arc, the second-lowest mark in the country. **Anchored by National Defensive Player of the Year midseason watch listee Raegan Beers, OU is holding teams to only 47.0% shooting at the rim, fifth best nationally.** The Sooners are 14-2 when limiting opponents to fewer than 30 paint points and have recorded seven games with at least seven blocks this season, including a Baranczyk-era high 12 against NC Central on Dec. 22.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

■ Over the last four seasons, Oklahoma has been at its best when defending at a high level. The Sooners are **70-3** under Jennie Baranczyk when holding opponents under 70 points and **86-4** when scoring at least 80 on the other end. When scoring fewer than 80, OU is 32-35 since 2021. **OU has won 70 straight games dating back to 2015 when holding opponents under 60 points.**

■ The clearest recipe for success has come through efficiency. **OU is 102-5 (.953) under Baranczyk when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (won 26 of last 27)** and is 85-6 when holding opponents under 40% from the field since 2021.

■ Since 2021, Oklahoma is 43-10 (.811) when turning it over 15 times or less and 9-1 in 2025-26.

BOARD WOMAN GETS PAID

- OU ranks second nationally in rebounds per game (49.18) and pulls down a nation-leading 33.5 defensive boards per contest. The Sooners own a +11.5 rebounding margin, good for fifth in the country.
- Under Baranczyk, Oklahoma is 44-1 when grabbing 50 or more rebounds, with the only loss coming to Kentucky on Feb. 2, 2025. OU has posted 50+ rebounds 25 times since the start of the 2024-25 season - the most in the country during that span.
- Since the 2021-22 season, Oklahoma is 93-17 when winning the rebounding battle and had won 21 straight such games before losses to Ole Miss and Kentucky despite outrebounding both opponents. **In conference games only, OU boasts a rebounding margin of +7.78, good for second in the league.**
- Earlier this year, the Sooners posted 60+ rebounds in three straight games for the first time in program history, totaling 60 vs. NC Central, 63 vs. Texas A&M and 64 vs. Mississippi State. **Overall, OU leads the nation with five 60-rebound games, the most by any team in a season since Troy recorded seven in 2022.**

SOONER MAGIC COMEBACKS

- The Sooners have used famous Sooner Magic to **come back from double-digit deficits and win 18 times** in the Baranczyk era, including seven times vs. ranked opponents.
- Oklahoma is no stranger to winning close games - it is **16-1 in games decided by one possession** (3 pts or less) under Baranczyk, winning on a last-possession shot five times.
- Since the beginning of the 2021-22 season, Oklahoma has a **35-15 record in contests decided by single digits but is 2-3 this season.**

- Fourteen of OU's 15 wins this year have come by 15 points or more (8th most NCAA), with the only exception being a five-point win over NC State in overtime. The Sooners have seven wins by 40 points or more (5th most NCAA) on the campaign.

HERE FOR BEERS

- **Raegan Beers**, Oklahoma's All-American and All-SEC center, has continued her dominance in the paint and solidified herself as one of the nation's top players. She scores **16.0 points per game** on **59.8% shooting** and adds **10.7 rebounds per game**. In 22 games, **she has recorded 16 double-doubles (leads NCAA), including seven with 20 points**.

■ Last season, Beers delivered a dominant debut at Oklahoma, earning Honorable Mention All-America honors, All-SEC First Team recognition and Lisa Leslie Award finalist status. She started all 33 games, averaging 17.3 points and 9.4 rebounds on a program-record 63.4 percent shooting, while recording 15 double-doubles and 13 20-point games.

■ Raegan Beers has been the most efficient post player in the country since the start of the 2024-25 season. **She is the lone player nationally with 900+ points and 530+ rebounds in fewer than 1,300 minutes, posting 29.1 points and 17.0 rebounds per 40 minutes. All other posts reaching those totals have needed at least at least 275 more minutes played.**

■ Beers collected her 1,000th rebound on 12/11 against Little Rock, becoming the fourth active Division I player to eclipse 1,000 career boards. **She is the only player in the country with 1,850 career points and 1,100 career rebounds** and is attempting to become the third Sooner ever (C. Paris and M. McGuire) to reach 2,000 career points and 1,000 career rebounds.

■ The anchor of Oklahoma's elite defense, Raegan Beers was named to the **Naismith Trophy Defensive Player of the Year midseason watch list** on Jan. 27. **No player in the country makes a bigger impact for her team defensively than Beers, whose presence creates a 33.2-point per 100 possession swing compared to when she is off the floor, the largest differential in the nation.**

WELCOME TO THE CHAVEZ SHOW

■ The nation's **No. 1 overall recruit per 247Sports, USA Today and Prospects Nation** - and the unanimous 2025 national high school player of the year - **Aaliyah Chavez** arrived at Oklahoma as one of the most decorated signees in program history. A two-time Gatorade Texas Player of the Year, McDonald's All-American and Jordan Brand Classic and Nike Hoop Summit pick, she averaged 34.9 points, 9.1 rebounds, 4.3 assists and 3.7 steals as a senior while leading Monterey High School to a 5A Division II state title. She finished her prep career with 4,796 points, ranking 14th in ESPN's all-time scoring records, and became the **first No. 1 recruit ever to sign with OU**.

■ **A Wooden Award Midseason Top-25 Finalist, Chavez leads OU with 18.5 points per game - the top scoring mark among all true freshmen nationally and the only true freshman ranked inside the top 100 nationally in scoring (she ranks 41st).** She also leads the Sooners in assists (4.1 APG), adds 3.6 rebounds per game and **ranks fourth in the SEC in made 3-pointers (64)** and has made a 3-pointer in every game to open her career, setting an OU record for consecutive games with a 3PM to open a season.

■ Chavez is one of only seven players, and the only freshman, nationally averaging at least 18.5 points, 4.0 assists and 3.5 rebounds with 3.0 turnovers or fewer per game. **She is on pace to join Hannah Hidalgo, Paige Bueckers, Caitlin Clark, Chennedy Carter and Kelsey Mitchell as freshmen since 2009 to average 18.5 PPG, 4.0 APG and 3.5 RPG. Chavez and Bueckers would be the only two to do so while turning it over 3.0 times or less per game.**

■ In Oklahoma's upset win over No. 2 South Carolina, Chavez poured in 26 points and handed out a career-high eight assists. She took over in overtime, scoring 15 of the Sooners' 19 points and knocking down four 3-pointers in the five-minute frame to will OU to the victory. Chavez became the first freshman since Caitlin Clark in 2021 to record at least 26 points and eight assists against a top-25 opponent, while her 15 overtime points set a school record.

■ A league-high **six-time SEC Freshman of the Week** honoree and two-time National Freshman of the Week honoree, Chavez is chasing history. Courtney Paris set the OU record with nine FOTW selections, and Chavez's six are the second most in OU history. Her six SEC FOTW honors are tied for the third most in SEC history, trailing only Mikayla Blakes (7) and Rhyne Howard (8).

■ Chavez is the only freshman guard in the country with three 29-point games (29 vs. KC; 29 vs. FSU; 33 vs. NCST) this season. Her 29-point, seven 3-pointer, six-assist showing vs. Florida State made her the first freshman since Caitlin Clark in 2021 to hit those marks.

■ With at least seven games remaining to play this season, Chavez is already inside the top five of a few OU freshman records: points per game (18.5, 2nd); 3-pointers made (64, 3rd); 3-point attempts (184, 3rd); free throw percentage (89.7%, 2nd).

■ She was named to the preseason watch lists for the Tamika Catchings National Freshman of the Year Award, Naismith Trophy National Player of the Year, Wooden Award and Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year Award.

THE COMPLETE GUARD: PAYTON VERHULST

- One of the most complete guards in the country and a candidate for the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award (nation's best shooting guard), **Payton Verhulst** has continued her strong play in her final season. She averages 11.6 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.1 assists, 1.5 steals and 0.8 blocks per game - **one of six players nationally to hit that mark**. Last season she ranked **third nationally** among all shooting guards in DRAPM (Defensive Regularized Adjusted Plus/Minus) at **3.7**, and this year the Sooners rank in the **99th percentile in defensive rating** when she is on the floor.
- The vet has been on a tear over her last five games. Over OU's last five, Verhulst has led the team in scoring (16.2 points) and is shooting 48% from the field and 47% from deep, all while average over 3.0 assists and rebounds per game.
- Verhulst, a preseason All-SEC Second Team selection, built on her 2024 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and All-America honorable mention campaign with another standout season last year. She averaged 14.9 points, 5.7 rebounds, 3.9 assists, and 1.4 steals in 2024-25, becoming one of just two players nationally to average at least 14.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, and 4.0 assists in under 30 minutes per game.
- One of the nation's top perimeter shooters, Verhulst has logged 26 games with three or more 3-pointers since the start of the 2023-24 season. Her 83 made threes ranked second in the SEC last year, highlighted by a career-high 38-point outing vs. Missouri that included six triples.
- A versatile playmaker and one of OU's four McDonald's All-Americans, Verhulst notched a 29-point, 10-rebound, 10-assist triple-double against No. 13 Duke last season, becoming one of just two players (joining Caitlin Clark) since 1999 to post a 25-point triple-double vs. a ranked opponent.
- Verhulst isn't just excelling on the court, the redshirt senior was named to the **Kay Yow Foundation's 2025-26 Servant Leader Class**, an honor recognizing student-athletes who embody leadership, selflessness and service. She wears a Kay Yow Servant Leader patch on her jersey, signifying her place among just 64 women's basketball players nationwide to earn the distinction. Her younger sister, Addie, battled and beat a rare ovarian germ cell tumor in 2024.
- The guard was a five-star prospect in high school and a decorated USA Basketball gold medalist, earning MVP honors at the 2019 FIBA Americas U16 Championship and winning gold again at the 2021 FIBA U19 World Cup. She comes from a strong basketball lineage, as her mother, Robin, played women's basketball at Duke, her father, David, played men's basketball at Rockhurst, her sister Ashton played women's basketball at UCF, and her sister Kirston is a freshman at Middle Tennessee State.

THE SAHARA SPARK

- Former five-star recruit in the 2023 class **Sahara Williams** has elevated her play this season and is having a career year, averaging career highs in points (12.3), rebounds (7.9), assists (4.0), steals (1.1) and blocks (0.7). **Williams is one of two Power Five players (Sarah Strong) in the country to average 12.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.0 steals per game**.
- The forward enters Monday night just 19 points away from 1,000 career points. She would become the 40th Sooner to eclipse 1,000 career points in an OU uniform.
- Williams has started every game of her career and averaged 10.6 points, 4.8 rebounds and 2.2 assists last season. She elevated her play in SEC action in 2025, scoring in double figures 13 times over the final 20 games. **Dating back to last season, she has scored in double figures in 29 of her last 38 games overall**.
- In the win over East Texas A&M on Nov. 19, she joined Raegan Beers as the only Sooners in the last 15 seasons to record a 20-point double-double with 4+ assists while shooting 80%. Williams posted 22 points on 8-for-9 shooting (2-for-2 from deep) with 11 rebounds, four assists and a block.
- Williams has starred on the international stage, winning gold medals with Team USA at the 2022 and 2023 FIBA 3x3 U18 World Cups. She competed with the 2025 USA Women's National 3x3 Team at the FIBA 3x3 World Cup and helped the U.S. to a runner-up finish in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, during the 2025 Women's 3x3 Series.

UP NEXT

- OU faces a quick turnaround after the late Monday night game as it hosts Florida at Lloyd Noble Center on Thursday night at 6 p.m. CT. Following that contest, OU heads to Tuscaloosa for a ranked matchup at Alabama on Sunday afternoon.
- The Sooners beat Florida by 24 points in Gainesville last season.

LLOYD NOBLE CENTER



HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

- Lloyd Noble Center opened in 1976 and has earned a reputation as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball. It has been home to countless Sooner legends including Stacey Dales, Aaryn Ellenberg, Courtney Paris, Danielle Robinson and Phylesha Whaley who helped shape the rise of Oklahoma women's basketball.
- The arena is where Oklahoma set a school record with 26 consecutive home wins during a three year stretch from 1984-86. For more than 50 years, the Lloyd Noble Center has served as the foundation for the program's remarkable growth.
- Nearly five million fans have entered the Lloyd Noble Center since its doors first opened, all expecting to witness a Sooner victory. Oklahoma owns a 486-177 (.733) all-time record at the venue, a mark that reflects true home-court dominance.
- The facility received a major renovation in 2024 that added a world class locker room, improved recovery spaces and enhanced team areas to give student athletes a championship level environment.
- Under head coach Jennie Baranczyk, the Sooners are 66-12 at the arena and have multiple 10-game winning streaks, including a 14-game winning streak that stretched from the end of the 2024-25 season into the 2025-26 campaign.

Jennie Baranczyk was named the ninth head coach of the Oklahoma women's basketball program on April 10, 2021. She is in her fifth season in Norman in 2025-26 after leading the program through four of its most successful seasons.

Baranczyk (**pronounced buh-RON-check**), a 14-year head coaching veteran, spent nine seasons at Drake before beginning her tenure at Oklahoma in 2021-22. In four seasons with the Sooners, she has restored the program's national standing, guiding OU to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments, a 2025 Sweet 16 appearance and two conference championships.

Her teams have posted 20-win seasons in 10 of the last 11 years, including four straight in Norman. She has led her teams to seven total NCAA Tournaments and coached 36 all-conference selections over the last 13 seasons.

In 2025, Baranczyk led Oklahoma through its first season in the Southeastern Conference. The Sooners went 27-8, earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the program's first Sweet 16 since 2013. OU went 11-5 in league play, tying for fourth in the SEC and advancing to the conference tournament semifinals.

She brought in the nation's top transfer, Raegan Beers, who earned first-team All-SEC and All-America honors. Payton Verhulst added second-team All-SEC recognition and the staff secured the No. 5 recruiting class for 2025, highlighted by top-ranked prospect and Gatorade National Player of the Year Aaliyah Chavez.

In 2023-24, Baranczyk led Oklahoma to a second straight Big 12 regular season title and the program's first outright championship since 2009. The Sooners went 15-3 in league play and 23-10 overall. Baranczyk earned Big 12 Coach of the Year honors and was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year award. OU earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the second round.

Skylar Vann became OU's first Big 12 Player of the Year since Courtney Paris in 2009, while Payton Verhulst was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. Vann and Verhulst both earned All-Big 12 First Team and All-America honors. Additionally, Nevaeh Tot and Sahara Williams earned All-Big 12 honorable mentions.

In her second season, she guided the Sooners to a share of the 2022-23 Big 12 regular season title with a 14-4 league mark and 26-7 overall record. OU reached the NCAA Tournament for a second consecutive year, earning a program-record six sweeps in conference play and posting the program's most Big 12 wins in 13 seasons.

Madi Williams earned unanimous All-Big 12 First Team honors, while Taylor Robertson and Ana Llanusa were named to the second team and Skylar Vann earned honorable mention. Vann repeated as Big 12 Sixth Player of the Year and Beatrice Culliton made the Big 12 All-Freshman Team. Williams became OU's first WNBA Draft pick since 2013 and joined Robertson on the AP and WBCA All-America lists.

In her first season, Baranczyk orchestrated one of the nation's top turnarounds. She led the Sooners to a 25-9 record and an NCAA second-round appearance, improving the program by 13 wins from the previous season. She was named a WBCA National Coach of

the Year finalist as the team reached 20 wins faster than all but two teams in program history and rose to No. 12 in the AP Poll.

She became the only first-year head coach in OU history to sweep Baylor and Oklahoma State and added a win over Texas. Her four top-25 victories were the most by a first-year Sooner head coach and the most for the program since 2010.

Robertson and Williams were unanimous All-Big 12 First Team picks, the first OU duo to accomplish the feat since 2012. Vann was named Big 12 Sixth Player of the Year and Kelbie Washington earned All-Freshman honors. Robertson earned All-America honorable mention, becoming OU's first All-American since 2014.

Prior to Oklahoma, Baranczyk went 192-96 at Drake, where she led the Bulldogs to three NCAA Tournament appearances, six straight 20-win seasons and back-to-back undefeated Missouri Valley Conference regular seasons. A two-time MVC Coach of the Year and the 2017 ESPNW Mid-Major Coach of the Year, she produced 24 all-conference selections and oversaw one of the most dominant three-year runs in league history with a 53-1 record from 2017-19.

She began her coaching career with stints as an assistant at Kansas State, Marquette and Colorado, helping each program to postseason play and a WNIT championship at both Kansas State and Marquette.

A standout at Iowa from 2000-04, Baranczyk was a three-time All-Big Ten selection and helped the Hawkeyes to three NCAA Tournaments and the 2001 Big Ten Tournament title. She remains the only player in program history ranked in the top 10 in points, rebounds, assists, steals and blocks.

She earned her bachelor's degree in communication studies from Iowa in 2004 and received the Big Ten's Medal of Honor. Baranczyk earned a master's degree in counseling and student development from Kansas State in 2006. She and her husband Scott have a son Eli and two daughters Jordi and Hope.
