## THE RUNDOWN

- Cincinnati is coming off a 9-3 victory over Robert Morris on Feb. 22 at Joe Walton Stadium.
- In the victory over CMU, UC narrowly led 4-3 heading into the fourth before going on a 5-0 run in the final period to seal the victory. The late push was led by sophomore Paige Selhorn who recorded three goals and an assist in the fourth period.
- Lexie Wolfe and Morgan Handzel earned honors in week three of the Big 12 weekly awards, with Wolfe named Midfielder of the Week and Handzel earning her second Draw Specialist of the Week honor.
- Wolfe scored a game-high four goals against CMU, adding five caused turnovers and four ground balls; she tallied a goal, four ground balls, and a caused turnover against Robert Morris.
- Handzel won 12 draws against Central Michigan and eight against Robert Morris.
- Selhorn, a Westbury, N.Y., native, has quickly established herself as one of the nation's premier offensive threats. She leads the country in total assists (21) and points (39) and ranks fourth nationally in goals (18). Within the Big 12, she sits first in assists per game (3.5), second in points per game (6.5) and third in goals per game (3.0).
- Led by Handzel the Bearcats have controlled the draw, averaging 15.8 draws won per contest — 14th nationally, first in Big 12 — while posting a .646 draw percentage that ranks 10th in the country, first in Big 12.
- Handzel has totaled 62 draw controls this season — 10.3 per game, which ranks fifth nationally — including 14 against Xavier, the second-most in a single game in program history, and 13 against Ohio State, tied for the fourth-most in a single game in program history.
- Head coach Gina Thomas begins her 14th year at the helm as the Bearcats embark on their second season in the Big 12 Conference. Thomas recently signed a contract extension through 2030.
- The Bearcats return 20 letterwinners, including seven starters. Among the returning players are three of last season's top five scorers: Paige Selhorn (20 goals), Lexie Wolfe (16 goals), and Paige Counts (15 goals), providing a strong offensive foundation for the upcoming season.
- Last season, UC finished first in the Big 12 and 27th nationally in caused turnovers per game (9.53).
- The Bearcats welcome 11 freshmen and four transfers to the 2025 roster.
- Junior Brooke Peck and sophomore Morgan Handzel add experience to the program. Peck spent two seasons at Youngstown St., and Handzel spent one season up the road at Xavier.
- Sophomore Paige Selhorn returns for Cincinnati after impressing during her freshman campaign, as she was selected to the Big 12 All Newcomer Team (Unanimous Decision). Selhorn finished the season tied for the most points (65) on the team, first in assists (45), third in goals (20) and third in ground balls (25).
- Senior Lexie Wolfe comes back for the Bearcats after a strong defensive campaign, finishing second on the team in draw controls (42) and causing 18 turnovers to disrupt opposing offenses.

**202** Cincinnati outscored their opponents 202-193 last season with .721 shots on goal percentage. The Bearcats also recorded 501 shots compared to their opponents 406.

**19** UC recorded a game-high and season high 19 goals against Big 12 rival San Diego State on 4/12/25. The Bearcats also notched 25 points, 6 assists and 34 SOG against the Aztecs. All are also game and season-highs.

**37** The Bearcats will roster 37 student athletes for the 2026 season. The 37 is made up of 22 returning players, four transfers and 11 freshman. Six of the 37 players are native Ohioians.

## LAST TIME OUT

**MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa.** — The Cincinnati lacrosse team used a dominant 5-0 fourth-period run to pull away from Robert Morris, earning a 9-3 road victory Sunday afternoon at Joe Walton Stadium.

The Bearcats raced out to a 3-0 lead after the first quarter but stalled offensively over the next two periods, allowing Robert Morris to claw back within one at 4-3 entering the final frame. Cincinnati rediscovered its rhythm in the fourth, however, erupting for five unanswered goals — highlighted by Paige Selhorn scoring all three of her goals in the period to secure her hat trick — to seal the win.

Selhorn paced the attack with three goals and two assists, while Kozina recorded her second hat trick of the season. Defensively, Paige Counts and Lexie Wolfe each collected four ground balls, helping anchor a unit that limited the Colonials to just three goals.

Cincinnati controlled the stat sheet, holding a commanding 32-16 advantage in shots and a 10-4 edge in draw controls behind eight from sophomore Morgan Handzel.

Sophomore Alyse Keels opened the scoring at the 10:07 mark of the first quarter. After a competitive stretch, Kozina found the back of the net and struck again just a minute later to give UC a 3-0 cushion heading into the second.

Defense dictated the second quarter. Goalkeeper Bell Kerr tallied seven saves in the period, though Lea Otts capitalized on a power-play opportunity for Robert Morris to account for the lone goal of the period.

Mia Berthoff cut the deficit to 3-2 with 10:58 remaining in the third before junior Hailey Joy Simpson restored Cincinnati's two-goal advantage. Taylor Burkett answered late in the quarter, trimming the lead to 4-3 and setting the stage for the decisive fourth.

Cincinnati took control from there. Selhorn ignited the surge with a goal in the opening minute of the final period, added another shortly after and later capped the scoring with her third of the afternoon as the Bearcats closed out the 9-3 victory

## BIG 12 WEEKLY HONORS

- After leading Cincinnati to a 17-9 season-opening win over Xavier, sophomores Alyse Keels and Morgan Handzel earned Week 1 Big 12 honors.
- Keels was named Big 12 Midfielder of the Week; Handzel earned Draw Specialist of the Week honors.
- Keels scored a career-high six goals on six shots, highlighted by a behind-the-back finish to the bottom-left corner.
- Handzel recorded 14 draw controls against her former team in the victory.
- Sophomore Paige Selhorn was named the Week 2 Big 12 attack player of the week, the conference announced Wednesday, after she totaled 13 points over the week, recording seven assists and six goals across two impressive performances. Against Wofford, she put together a career-high eight-point outing — four goals and four assists — helping lead the Bearcats to a 17-7 road victory. Both marks are tied for 10th in program history for a single game. She followed that up with two goals and three assists in Cincinnati's matchup against Ohio State.
- Lexie Wolfe and Morgan Handzel earned honors in week three of the Big 12 weekly awards, with Wolfe named Midfielder of the Week and Handzel earning her second Draw Specialist of the Week honor.
- Wolfe scored a game-high four goals against CMU, adding five caused turnovers and four ground balls; she tallied a goal, four ground balls, and a caused turnover against Robert Morris.
- Handzel won 12 draws against Central Michigan and eight against Robert Morris.

## DOMINATING THE DRAW

- Led by sophomore Morgan Handzel, the Bearcats have dominated the draw this season.
- Handzel has totaled 62 draw controls this season — 10.3 per game, which ranks fifth nationally — including 14 against Xavier, the second-most in a single game in program history, and 13 against Ohio State, tied for the fourth-most in a single game in program history.
- The Bearcats are averaging 15.8 draws won per contest — 14th nationally, first in Big 12 — while posting a .646 draw percentage that ranks 10th in the country, first in Big 12.

## DISHING OUT DIMES

- Sophomore Paige Selhorn recorded a school-record seven assists and three goals for 10 points leading the Cincinnati lacrosse team to a dominant 14-6 victory over Central Michigan on Feb. 20.
- Selhorn, a Westbury, N.Y., native, has quickly established herself as one of the nation's premier offensive threats. She leads the country in total assists (21) and points (39) and ranks fourth nationally in goals (18). Within the Big 12, she sits first in assists per game (3.5), second in points per game (6.5) and third in goals per game (3.0).

## CROSTOWN BRAGGING RIGHTS

- The Bearcats opened their 2026 season with a commanding 17-9 victory over crosstown rival Xavier.
- The Bearcats dominated possession with 21 draw controls to Xavier's seven, while forcing 11 turnovers and outshooting the Musketeers 40-31.
- UC showcased a balanced offensive attack led by sophomore Alyse Keels' perfect six-goal performance, including a highlight-reel behind-the-back finish.
- Keels led the charge with six goals, sophomore Morgan Handzel (Xavier transfer) recorded 14 draw controls — the second-most in UC history, senior Lexie Wolfe tied her career high with four goals and added two assists, and senior Paige Counts contributed two goals and three ground balls.
- Cincinnati controlled the game from start to finish, fueled by a blistering 9-1 first-half run, a commanding 29-20 edge in shots on goal, and Handzel's dominance in the circle that gave the Bearcats possession after possession to seal the eight-goal victory.

## 2025 YEAR IN REVIEW

- During the 2025 season, Cincinnati opened a new chapter as the program completed its transition to the Big 12 Conference in head coach Gina Thomas' 13th season at the helm. The Bearcats finished the regular season at 8-9 and remained in contention for a spot in the inaugural Big 12 Championship until the final slate of games, closing the year on Senior Day against Colorado in the program's first-ever meeting. Cincinnati leaned on a balanced offensive attack that produced 202 goals (11.8 per game), with at least five different scorers in 13 contests. Graduate student Lauren Ottensmeyer led the way with 58 goals, ranking among the nation's leaders, while Camryn Callaghan added 45 goals and continued her rise as a dual-threat attacker. Freshman Paige Selhorn made an immediate impact, finishing among the national leaders in assists and becoming the only freshman inside the Division I top 15. Defensively, the Bearcats led the Big 12 in caused turnovers per game (9.53), highlighting a strong debut season in the league and setting the foundation for continued growth entering 2026.

## BACK FOR MORE

- Sophomore Paige Selhorn returns for Cincinnati after impressing during her freshman campaign, as she was selected to the Big 12 All Newcomer Team (Unanimous Decision).
- Selhorn finished the season tied for the most points (65) on the team, first in assists (45), third in goals (20) and third in ground balls (25).
- Senior Lexie Wolfe comes back for the Bearcats after a strong defensive campaign, finishing second on the team in draw controls (42) and causing 18 turnovers to disrupt opposing offenses.
- Junior Hailey Joy Simpson is back for UC after an impressive campaign in the circle, leading the team in draw controls (46) and giving the Bearcats a consistent edge in possession battles.

## NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- The Bearcats welcome 11 freshmen and four transfers to the 2025 roster.
- Junior Brooke Peck and sophomore Morgan Handzel add experience to the program. Peck spent two seasons at Youngstown St., and Handzel spent one season up the road at Xavier.
- Peck played and started in all 15 matches at Youngstown State, finishing the season with 26 goals and five assists while posting a .818 shot-on-goal percentage. She was the team's third-leading scorer and found the back of the net in 14 of 15 games. Peck recorded six multi-goal outings, including four hat tricks.
- Handzel saw action in all 15 games with 10 starts for the Musketeers. She totaled 107 draw controls, three assists, three ground balls and a caused turnover for Xavier. The Woodstock, Ga., native broke XU's program record with 14 draw controls against Cincinnati on Feb. 26, 2025.
- Freshman Haley Mario closed her high school career with back-to-back seasons of 90+ goals, earning SCC Player of the Year honors in both her junior and senior seasons and finishing as a USA Lacrosse All-American.
- Freshman Kyva Holloway was a three-time All-County Player of the Year and Inside Lacrosse Top 100 recruit, earning GHSA First Team All-State honors in three straight seasons after being named State MVP as a freshman.

## GUARDING THE GOAL

- After the departure of sophomore Hailey Darko, sophomore Bella Kerr moves into the starting goalie role for the 2026 season.
- Kerr appeared in six games last season; She recorded eight saves during her time on the field.

**HELLO BIG 12, FAREWELL AAC**

- The 2025 season marked a new era for Cincinnati lacrosse, as the Bearcats joined the Big 12 Conference alongside Arizona State, Colorado, Florida, San Diego State, and UC Davis. The move completed Cincinnati's athletics-wide transition to the Big 12.
- Cincinnati finished its inaugural Big 12 campaign with an 8-9 overall record (1-4 Big 12). Florida captured the conference championship in dominating fashion, posting a perfect 5-0 conference record and finishing 20-3 overall.
- The Bearcats previously competed in the American Athletic Conference from 2019-24, after spending nearly a decade in the Big East (2009-18). Cincinnati launched its lacrosse program as an independent in its inaugural 2008 season.

**AYE AYE CAPTAIN**

- Seniors Devon Cherry and Thea Work were named the 2026 team captains, the program announced earlier this fall.
- Cherry and Thea are both first time captions.
- The Bearcats three captains from the 2025 season departed.

**REPPIN' THE RED WHITE AND BLUE**

- Head coach Gina Thomas, who is entering her 14th year at the helm, made the USA Lacrosse training team in 2005 and later played in the 2009 and 2013 World Cups.
- The 42 players named to the training team (out of 99 at the event) come from high schools from 12 states and the District of Columbia and represent 20 colleges with their current enrollment or commitment.

**SHAMROCK STRONG**

- Senior Gillian Smith competed with Ireland's Senior National Team at the North American Invitational (LAXNAI) in Utica, NY., this summer.
- Smith's squad finished fourth to earn a coveted scroll invite to the inaugural Traditions Cup in 2026.
- The Richmond, Va., native first represented Ireland in 2024, when she took the field with the country's senior team during the Women's Senior European Cup in Portugal.
- She also Irish danced competitively for 8 years, and has competed at two World Irish Dance Championships

**SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM**

- UC has earned team academic honors (3.2 GPA or higher) in 11 of Head Coach Gina Thomas' 14 years at the helm as well. This past fall, the team earned a 3.6 team GPA with 28 Dean's List recipients and 11 TopCats (4.0 GPA).

**THE BOSSES**

- All-American and two-time World Champion Gina Thomas is heading into her 14th season as the head coach at the University of Cincinnati in 2025.
- Jamie Redding enters her fifth season on the Bearcats staff after joining in August 2021. Redding also serves as an assistant on the Puerto Rico's women's lacrosse team.
- Zach Tamburello enters his second season with Cincinnati.

**PRESEASON HONORS**

- Sophomore Paige Selhorn was named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team, the league announced Jan. 28, 2026.
- The Bearcats were ranked fifth overall, as 2025 Big 12 champion, Florida taking the top spot, as it calimed 25 of the 26 first-place votes.

# HEAD COACH GINA THOMAS | 14TH SEASON

## ALL-AMERICAN AND TWO-TIME WORLD CHAMPION

All-American and two-time World Champion Gina Thomas is heading into her 14th season as the head coach at the University of Cincinnati in 2026 after signing a contract extension in January that will keep her with the Bearcats through 2030.

Thomas, in May 2021, was elected as vice president of the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Association (IWLCA), which includes a three-year service term. She has mentored 26 All-Conference selections over her Bearcat tenure, including seven in 2019 and four in 2024 and 2021. In 2021 her and assistants Shannon Witzel and Caitlin Prince named the AAC's Coaching Staff of the Year. Prior to the 2019 campaign, Cincinnati had just five conference postseason honors, all since 2015.

UC has earned team academic honors (3.2 GPA or higher) in 10 of her 13 years at the helm as well.

During the 2025 season, Cincinnati opened a new chapter as the program completed its transition to the Big 12 Conference in head coach Gina Thomas' 13th season at the helm. The Bearcats finished the regular season at 8-9 and remained in contention for a spot in the inaugural Big 12 Championship until the final slate of games, closing the year on Senior Day against Colorado in the program's first-ever meeting. Cincinnati leaned on a balanced offensive attack that produced 202 goals (11.8 per game), with at least five different scorers in 13 contests. Graduate student Lauren Ottensmeyer led the way with 58 goals, ranking among the nation's leaders, while Camryn Callaghan added 45 goals and continued her rise as a dual-threat attacker. Freshman Paige Selhorn made an immediate impact, finishing among the national leaders in assists and becoming the only freshman inside the Division I top 15. Defensively, the Bearcats led the Big 12 in caused turnovers per game (9.53), highlighting a strong debut season in the league and setting the foundation for continued growth entering 2026.

During the 2024 season, the Bearcats continued to shine as they recorded 10 total wins including four against Ohio opponents. Cincinnati standouts Camryn Callaghan, Lauren Ottensmeyer, Alexis Rich and Hailey Joy Simpson received All-AAC Honors alongside Callaghan and Ottensmeyer grabbing the program's first national award after being named USA Lacrosse Honorable Mention All-Americans. Against Kent State, the program recorded its largest-ever margin of victory. The 25 goals also matched a March 8, 2020 win over Kent State for the most in program history. It was also the first-ever Leap Day win for the team and first-such contest since its inaugural 2008 season.

The 2023 season saw a breakthrough for the Bearcats, improving their win total by four from the previous season. Their 11 regular-season wins matched the program record from 2019 as well. Camryn Callaghan was named the AAC Freshman of the Year, UC's second since 2019, and Dani Mlkvy and Ava Goeller joined her on the AAC's First Team. Callaghan's 56 goals helped her to a USA U20 Team tryout as well. Cincinnati also earned a road overtime win at Louisville, its first-ever over the Cardinals or an ACC foe, while defeating Vanderbilt, 19-6, for its largest-ever margin of victory against the Commodores.

In 2022, the Bearcats claimed their eighth team IWLCA Academic Award out of Thomas' 10 years at the helm, while Kylie Nause was named the AAC's Lacrosse Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Nause, en route to also earning First-Team All-AAC honors, broke the single-season school records for goals (63) and hat tricks (15). Dani Mlkvy's prowess at midfield also earned her First-Team honors, while sophomore transfer attacker Ava Goeller made the Second Team.

The Bearcats also had four All-AAC members in 2021 (Alyssa Adams, Monica Borzillo, Morgan Dukes, Sam Mlkvy) after COVID wiped out much of the 2020 season. Borzillo's career numbers reached incredible heights over her five seasons with 197 goals and 145 assists, among others.

The 2019 campaign, coming off the best season in its then-12-year program history that saw the Bearcats reach the postseason for the first time as well as finish as the runners-up in the inaugural American Athletic Conference season.

In 2018, the Bearcats strung together six wins in a row early in the year for the longest streak in program history on their way to records for wins (8) and winning percentage (.471). To get there, UC produced solid stats on both sides of the ball throughout the year, including 501 ground balls and an average of 29.47 per game, both of which led the NCAA. Offensively, the Bearcats broke single season program records for points (287), goals (201), assists (86), shots (504), shots on goal (371), man-up goals (12) and free-position goals (43). Along with their ground ball numbers, the defense also caused 187 turnovers, also a program record. Individually, several Bearcats were solid once again, including Monica



Borzillo, who was named All-BIG EAST Second Team for the second year in a row after accumulating 69 points on 42 goals and 27 assists, all of which ranked in the Top 10 of the conference. Two players recorded nearly 50 ground balls each on the year with freshman Morgan Dukes leading the way with 49 and Sam Mlkvy posting 48. Also on the defensive end, Giuliana Durso turned in a single-season record 161 saves and a 44.7 save percentage to help the Bearcats to several big wins, most notably a 17-12 win over Ohio State, the first victory in the series in program history.

UC increased its win total in 2017 and had Borzillo and Amanda Donovan named Second-Team All-BIG EAST Conference. Borzillo finished the season with 39 goals, a school-record 34 assists and 73 total points, leading the team in all categories, and ranking fourth in the BIG EAST with 2.00 assists per game, was second on the team with 33 points off 25 goals and seven assists while also ranking first in caused turnovers (28), fourth in ground balls (33) and fourth in draw controls (26).

The 2016 season saw the Bearcats double their win total from a season ago, while defender Kyara Byner became the first player in program history to earn first team All-BIG EAST honors, as well as All-Region honors from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association.

The 2015 campaign saw a UC player earn postseason honors from the BIG EAST Conference for the first time in program history. Courtney Curtis was named second team All-BIG EAST after leading the team in goals at 37.

In 2014, Thomas coached the Bearcats to six victories, including a program record five-game winning streak that saw the team receive votes in the Brine/Inside Lacrosse Media Poll for the first time ever. This was after losing the team's top scorer, Megan Bell, to injury in just the seventh game of the year. Five different Bearcats earned weekly honor from the BIG EAST Conference during the season, including Bell as Offensive Player of the Week and goalie Meg Gulmi as Defensive Player of the Week.

Her debut season in Cincinnati saw the 2013 Bearcats match the program record with seven wins, highlighted by the school's first-ever BIG EAST victory over Rutgers to cap the season. Bell led the team in scoring, while Gulmi started every game as a rookie and averaged a league-best 8.88 saves per game. The win totals in 2013 and 2014 marked the best consecutive seasons in program history until the 2017-18 campaigns came along when UC won six and eight, respectively.

Thomas spent the previous five seasons at Duquesne (2008-2012) as the Dukes' defensive coordinator, where she produced a 2012 Atlantic-10 Defensive Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year. During her time at Duquesne, Thomas coached six IWLCA All-Region players, 21 all-conference honorees, 13 members of the A-10 All-Rookie Team and 12 student-athletes who won academic all-conference accolades.

A 2005 graduate of Ohio State, Thomas spent the 2006 and 2007 seasons on the Buckeyes staff, working under OSU head coach Sue Stimmel. While in Columbus, Thomas served as co-director of the Ohio State Women's Lacrosse Camp, while also assisting with recruiting, budgeting and scholarship duties, as well as travel and team practice planning.

Thomas was one of 18 players on the U.S. Women's National Team that won gold at the Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL) World Cup in 2013. Playing as a defender at the World Cup, Oliver recorded 10

ground balls and caused seven turnovers. The highlight came as she was named the player of the game in Team USA's 21-8 semifinal win over England after causing three turnovers and picking-up four ground balls. It was the second FIL World Cup gold for Oliver, who also won the World Cup in June 2009 and was named to the All-World Team, which is awarded to the best 12 players in the world.

A standout midfielder at Ohio State (2002-05), Thomas was a four-year letter winner for the Buckeyes and earned All-America honors three times. During her career, she collected All-America honors from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (second team in 2003 and third team in 2004), WomensLacrosse.com (first team in 2003 and third team in 2005) and Warrior/Inside Lacrosse (first team in 2003). She was the American Lacrosse Conference Player of the Year in 2003 as Ohio State won the American Lacrosse Conference Championship and the league's rookie of the year in 2002. Oliver was also a four-time, First-Team All-ALC selection.

The Pottstown, Pa., native closed out her time at OSU as the program's career leader in ground balls (236) and caused turnovers (201) and was second in draw controls (121). She also was third in career points with 166 while ranking second in goals scored (125) and sixth in assists (41).

Thomas earned her bachelor's degree in education from Ohio State in 2005.
