Weekend Preview: Vanderbilt got back in the win column Wednesday with a 4-1 win over Troy at Hawkins Field.

- The Commodores own a 7-1 record in home games this season and will welcome North Dakota State to West End for the first meeting between the two schools.
- Vanderbilt is in the midst of a 10-game homestand with upcoming contests against Indiana State, LSU and Indiana.

Power Surge: Vanderbilt's 31 home runs is second among DI programs, trailing only Georgia's 43.

- The Doers are slugging .581, good for third in the SEC and ninth nationally.
- **Braden Holcomb** leads the team with seven long balls followed by **Brodie Johnston** with six. Holcomb ranks seventh among DI players while Johnston ranks 16th. Johnston hit 15 out of the park last season to lead the team as a freshman.
- **Colin Barczy** belted three home runs in the season-opener against No. 10 TCU to become the first Commodore since Connor Kaiser in 2018 with a three-homer game. Barczy's homers traveled a combined 1,340 feet with each surpassing 430 feet.
- Vanderbilt has hit four grand slams this season, already surpassing last season's total.
- Six of Vanderbilt's eight wins have come by way of the run-rule.
- The Commodores have homered 12 of 14 games this season.

SEC Player of the Week: **Braden Holcomb** was named the SEC Player of the Week last Monday.

- The center fielder hit .579 (11-for-19) over five games with five extra-base hits and 10 RBI.
- Holcomb belted three home runs and a pair of doubles to slug 1.158. He also scored nine times and worked three walks in 19 at-bats.
- Holcomb had four multi-hit games and helped power Vandy to four consecutive run-rule wins.

Brooks Wallace Award Watch List: Ryker Waite was named to the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List on Wednesday.

- Waite is one of 100 shortstops on the list. He is hitting .359 through 13 games this season with six extra-base hits, 13 RBI and 14 walks.

- The Arizona native has two homers, a triple and three doubles.
- He currently ranks third on the team in batting average and second in walks and OBP while starting all 13 games at shortstop.
- The award honors the nation's top shortstop and will be presented by the College Baseball Foundation later this year.

Walk This Way: Vanderbilt's 86 walks ranks 18th among DI programs. The Doers own a .431 OBP, good for 33rd nationally.

- **Logan Johnstone** leads the team with 16 walks. Johnstone is second in the SEC and ninth in D1. The transfer is sporting a .516 OBP.
- Second on the team in walks is **Ryker Waite**. The shortstop ranks third in the SEC and 14th nationally with 15 free passes. Waite's .517 OBP leads the team.
- After drawing 10 walks last season, **Brodie Johnston** has already tallied eight free passes this season.

The 2026 VandyBoys: Vanderbilt's 2026 roster features 23 returners and 16 newcomers.

- Seventeen states and two countries are represented on the roster. Tennessee leads the way with eight Commodores followed by California with five and Georgia with four.
- There are three graduate students, two seniors, 11 juniors, 14 sophomores and nine freshmen on the squad.
- Of the 16 newcomers, seven transferred in during the offseason.
- Former Commodore **Jason Esposito** returned to Nashville in the offseason as the program's new hitting coach. Esposito played under Tim Corbin from 2009-11 before being selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the third round of the 2011 MLB Draft. He most recently worked in the Cleveland Guardians organization as the MLB assistant hitting coach.

Preseason Honors: Multiple Commodores received recognition ahead of the 2026 season.

- **Connor Fennell** was selected to two preseason All-America teams, garnering third-team honors from both D1Baseball and the NCBWA.
- **Fennell** and **Braden Holcomb** were each voted by the league's coaches to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team.
- **Miller Green** and **Alex Kranzler** were named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List.

Unrivaled Consistency: Since head coach **Tim Corbin** took charge in 2003, no program has enjoyed more consistent success than the Commodores.

- Vanderbilt owns the nation's longest active NCAA Tournament streak at 19 consecutive appearances.
- Vandy has been to the College World Series five times, the finals four times and has won it all twice (2014, 2019).
- More than 50 Commodores have been named All-America, including 18 first-teamers.
- Corbin has tutored more than 30 future MLB players.
- Corbin reached 1,000 career wins on March 5, 2024, vs. Eastern Michigan. He recorded his 900th Vandy win on March 16, 2024, vs. Auburn.

- Among active D1 coaches, Corbin ranks seventh by most wins. He is third in the SEC behind South Carolina's Paul Mainieri (1,539) and Arkansas' Dave Van Horn (1,310).
- The Dores were crowned SEC Tournament Champions in 2025 for the third time in the last six tournaments. Four of the program's five SEC Tournament titles have come under Corbin.

The Fennell Factor: Preseason All-American **Connor Fennell** was one of the most electric pitchers in all of college baseball in 2025.

- Fennell totaled 84 strikeouts over 53.1 innings to just 11 walks. The righty struck out 40-percent of the batters he faced, good for third-best in Division I.
- Fennell allowed just one run over his final four outings, working 14 scoreless frames against Tennessee, Kentucky, Tennessee at the SEC Tournament and Louisville in the NCAA Regional.
- He tossed a seven-inning, complete-game shutout at Ole Miss, posting 12 strikeouts to earn SEC Pitcher of the Week.
- Fennell received Third Team All-America honors from the NCBWA and was Second Team ABCA All-Region.

Brodie Brings the Boom: **Brodie Johnston** made an immediate impact as a freshman last season, launching 15 homers and driving in 55 runs, both team-highs.

- Johnston's 15 long balls were the most by a Vanderbilt freshman since Pedro Alvarez hit 22 in 2006.
- The freshman was named MVP of the SEC Tournament. His two-run homer in the first inning of the title game vs. Ole Miss helped lead the Dores to their third championship in the last six tournaments.

Breaking Down the Schedule: Vanderbilt will once again face one of the nation's toughest schedules this season after finishing the 2025 slate with the No. 2 strength of schedule according to WarrenNolan.com.

- Vanderbilt's 2026 schedule features 30 games against 14 teams that made an NCAA Regional last season.
- Nine of Vandy's opponents are ranked in the D1Baseball preseason poll, including five in the top 10 and three in the top five.

MLB Spring Breakout: Eleven former Commodores were named to the MLB Spring Breakout preliminary 40-man player pools. The 27-man teams will be named on March 18.

- RJ Schreck (Blue Jays), Dom Keegan (Rays), Spencer Jones (Yankees), Patrick Reilly (Orioles), Enrique Bradfield Jr. (Orioles), Bryce Cunningham (Yankees), JD Thompson (Brewers), Cody Bowker (Phillies), Hunter Owen (Royals), Davis Diaz (Athletics) and RJ Austin (Orioles) are all in the preliminary pools for their respective clubs.

Dores in the Draft: Seven Commodores heard their names called in the 2025 MLB Draft, highlighted by three Dores selected in the first three rounds.

- There have been multiple Commodores taken in every draft since 2004 with six or more players being selected in five consecutive drafts.
- All-time, Vanderbilt has more than 200 players selected in the MLB Draft including an NCAA-leading 158 since 2003.
- With four pitchers taken in the 2025 draft, more than 80 Commodore arms have been drafted since 2003.

The Price is Right: David Price was inducted in the 2025 class of the College Baseball Hall of Fame on Feb. 12 in Overland Park, Kansas.

- The Golden Spikes Award winner led Vanderbilt to the SEC regular season and tournament titles in 2007 before being selected by the Tampa Bay Rays as the No. 1 overall pick in the 2007 MLB Draft.
- In 2007, he went 11-1 with a 2.63 ERA and 194 strikeouts over 133.1 innings, Vandy's season records for both punchouts and innings pitched.
- The southpaw swept the top national awards. Price was the consensus National Player of the Year and a consensus first-team All-American. He won the Dick Howser Trophy, Brooks Wallace Award and Roger Clemens Award and was the SEC Pitcher of the Year.
- The Murfreesboro, Tennessee, native finished his career with 441 strikeouts, the most by a Commodore. His 155 strikeouts in 2006 rank fifth in school history.



Upgrades to The Hawk: Construction at Hawkins Field began in the fall to expand and upgrade spaces and amenities at the home of the two-time national champions.

- In total, the Hawkins Field footprint will encompass approximately 50,000 square feet of new or enhanced space, including student-athlete resources, additional capacity, premium seating and expanded food and beverage options.
- The project also prioritizes player development, with more than 10,000 square feet devoted to a new weight room and pitching lab.
- During the construction, the right field fence has been temporarily moved in while also being heightened. The temporary dimensions are 320 feet down the line and 360 feet in right-center.
