TIP-OFF (TL;DR)

- CU is led by 10th-year head coach **JR Payne**, who has led the Buffs to a **186-127 (.594)** record as CU's eighth head women's basketball coach. Coach Payne has been extended through the 2031 season and has led the Buffs to now four NCAA appearances, two WNIT appearances and one WBIT appearance.
- Colorado was awarded one of the 37 at-large berths into the 2026 NCAA tournament and will make its 17th appearance in the national tourney. The Buffs received the 10-seed in one of the two Fort Worth quadrants of the bracket and will face Illinois (21-11, 9-9 Big 10) in a first-round game.
- In its second year back in the Big 12, Colorado finished sixth in the conference. Colorado is **120-156 (.435)** overall in Big 12 conference play. The Buffs boasted an **11-7** record in conference play this season, and they were a six-seed in the conference tournament.
- CU is receiving votes in the USA Today/WBCA (**33rd**) poll for the third week in a row and in the AP poll for the second time this season (**29th**). The Buffs are **46th** in the NET rankings and **41st** in the WAB.
- The Buffs return four from the 2024-25 roster: Sr. F Jade Masogayo, So. G Kennedy Sanders, 5th C JoJo Nworie and So. F Tabitha Betson. Colorado has 10 newcomers on the squad for the 2025-26 season, five transfers and five freshmen.
- Jr. G Desiree Wooten** received All-Big 12 Honorable Mention. Wooten is ranked 18th in the Big 12 Conference for scoring, averaging 13.3 points per game. She also ranked 20th in free throw percentage, shooting 72.2% from the line, and tied for 19th in assists per game with 2.6. Wooten led the Buffs in scoring in the Big 12 Tournament, averaging 150 points per game and collecting 45 total points.
- Named to both the Big 12 All-Defensive Team and All-Big 12 Honorable Mention, **Jr. G Zyanna Walker** is third overall in the conference with 67 steals in 30 regular season games played. Walker is tied for fourth overall in the conference with 2.1 steals per game. She is ranked 22nd in the conference in free throw percentage with 68.5%. This is Walker's second All-Defensive Team selection, as well as second in the Big 12, having earned it at the end of last season at Kansas State. Walker had the second most points for Colorado in the Big 12 Tourney, finishing with 41 and averaging 13.7 points per game. She also led CU in assists with eight total, 2.67 per game.
- Sr. F Jade Masogayo** was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team. Masogayo is ranked 21st in conference for blocks per game with 0.8, and she is 18th for free throw percentage with 75.5%. This marks Masogayo's second All-Conference award in the Big 12 after being named honorable mention at the end of last season. Masogayo had 19 regular season games with double-digit points, and had a stretch of 10 double-digit point games in a row during conference play. In the Big 12 Tournament, she had 18 points (6.0 ppg), 15 rebounds (5.0 rbg), four assists, two blocks and two steals.
- Fr. F Logyn Greer** was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team. Greer had 15 regular season games this season with double-digit points and recorded a double-double against Miami (OH) with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Greer shot 52.6% in the Big 12 Tournament, averaging 8.3 points per game and totaling 25. She also had 13 rebounds and six blocks in the tourney.
- Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat** leads the Big 12 in offensive rebounds per game (3.9) and total offensive rebounds (128), and she is tied for second in conference for rebounds per game (8.1). Dutat led the Buffs in offensive, defensive and total rebounds in the Big 12 Tournament with 11, 14 and 25, respectively, averaging 8.3 per game.
- As a team, the Buffs are second in the Big 12 for offensive rebounds per game (13.2), third for rebounding margin (6.9), sixth for scoring defense (60.7), sixth for rebounds per game (38.2), and seventh for scoring margin (7.1).

- 10th year as CU head coach, 17th season overall as a head coach
- **186-127 (.594)** record at CU
- Career record of **287-240 (.545)**
- Record since 2020-21: **118-64 (.648)**
- Earned the No. 5 seed in the 2024 NCAA Tournament, marking CU's third straight appearance
- Women's NIT appearance in 2014 at Southern Utah, 2016 at Santa Clara and 2017 and 2021 at Colorado
- Women's BIT No. 1 seed and host in 2025
- Has coached three All-Americans, three

conference players of the year, 45 all-conference players and 45 all-academic team members as an assistant and head coach

• Has been a part of three NCAA Tournament teams (2007 as assistant at Boise State, 2022, 2023 at CU) and seven Women's NIT teams as an assistant and head coach

At Colorado

- Named the eighth head coach in CU history on March 28, 2016
- Had contract extended in the spring of 2023
- Replaced Linda Lappe, who was at CU for five seasons
- Had career win No. 100 at CU against Western Michigan (Nov. 30, 2021) and career win No. 200 overall against Chicago State (Nov. 27, 2022)
- Coached five players who've earned postseason awards from the Pac-12, including Kennedy Leonard (2017-18), Mya Hollingshed (2021-22), Quay Miller (2022-23), Jaylyn Sherrod (2022-23, 23-24) and Aaronette Vonley (2023-24).
- In 2021-22, led CU to its first 20 win season since 2012-13 and its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017
- Upset No. 1 Stanford 77-72 in overtime, claiming CU's first win over a No. 1 opponent in school history (1/17/21)
- Opened 2019-20 with a 12-game winning streak, CU's best start since the 2011-12 season
- Guided the Buffs to one of the best single-season turnarounds in school history in 2016-17 as they more than doubled their win total from the previous year, finishing the year 17-16 overall and tied for ninth in the Pac-12, a year after a last-place finish in the conference in 2015-16.
- The Buffs also reached the third round of the WNIT in 2016-17, their first postseason appearance since 2014.
- CU started the 2016-17 season 10-0 for just the fifth time in school history, including a win over No. 15/19 Kentucky
- Became just the second CU coach to begin her career with 10 straight wins and the first since 1980.
- In Pac-12 play, the Buffs' signature win came on Feb. 12 when they upset No. 24 California on the road, their first win over a ranked team on the road since 2007.

- Led Colorado to the second round of the WBIT in 2025

At Santa Clara

- Spent two seasons at Santa Clara and had a 34-27 record
- Led SCU to a 23-9 record in 2015-16, tying for third in the West Coast Conference with a 13-5 league mark
- Santa Clara reached its first postseason appearance in 10 years in 2016, qualifying for the Women's NIT
- Signature wins included defeating No. 13 Stanford 61-58 in 2015-16 and LSU 69-67 in 2014-15, SCU's first win over an SEC team in 19 years
- SCU ranked third in the nation in steals (12.6), sixth in forced turnovers (21.7) and 29th in rebounding margin (+7.2) in 2015-16

At Southern Utah

- Spent five seasons at Southern Utah
- Her second season at SUU went 16-14 in 2010-11, the first winning season in seven years
- Led SUU to a school record for wins and a share of the Big Sky Conference regular season championship in her final season in 2013-14 with a 23-10 record and reached the postseason for the first time in school history, playing in the Women's NIT

Assistant Coaching Experience

- Served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Gonzaga under Kelly Graves (current Oregon head coach), helping the Bulldogs go from 5-23 in her first season (2000-01) to 28-4 in her last (2004-05)
- Moved to Boise State as an assistant for three seasons (2005-06 through 2007-08)
- Was the top assistant at Santa Clara for one season in 2008-09 before becoming head coach at Southern Utah the following season
- Helped Gonzaga to two Women's NIT appearances and Boise State to an NCAA Tournament in 2007 and an NIT appearance in 2006

Education/Personal

- Earned bachelor's degree in French at Saint Mary's (Calif.) in 1999
- Earned four letters for the Gaels and helped them to a 26-7 record and their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament as a senior in 1998-99
- Was named first-team all-West Coast Conference and led the team in with 131 assists as a senior
- Guided Saint Mary's to two WCC Tournament championships
- Born in Jackson, Tenn., but her family moved to North Vancouver, B.C., when she was a toddler
- Husband Toriano Towns is the team's associate head coach
- "JR" is not her given name; her birth name is Ali-Marie, but she earned the nickname from her dad after J.R. Ewing because he was tough and she would fight with her older brothers (she does not use the periods between letters, however)

seeded Bufs will match up with seven-seed Illinois (21-11, 9-9 Big Ten) on Mar. 21 at 7:30 p.m. MT in the first round of the tournament.

ROAM WITH THE BUFFS: The Bufs' game versus [7] Illinois will be broadcast on ESPN2. The Bufs are on the radio via the CUBuffs.com website and Varsity app for every game. The pregame show, Bufs Warm-up, starts a half-hour before tip and includes a pregame interview with Coach Payne. At halftime, stay tuned for a get-to-know interview with players and coaches. Colorado will broadcast NCAA tournament games on Colorado's News, Talk & Sports Station, KOA 850AM / 94.1FM. Available on the Varsity app. Fans can also follow Colorado games through live stats with links available at CUBuffs.com.

LAST TIME OUT: Colorado fell to No. 15 second-seeded West Virginia (26-6, 14-4 Big 12), 48-47, at T-Mobile Center in the semifinals of the 2026 Phillips 66 Big 12 Women's Basketball Tournament on Saturday, Mar. 7. The Buffaloes played a close first quarter with the Mountaineers, coming within one after going down by five. After holding West Virginia to four points, Colorado tied the game heading into halftime. WVU went up by as many as 12 in the third, but the Bufs came back to end the third quarter down by four. CU trailed by one throughout most of the fourth, and the Mountaineers took the game, 48-47.

FIGHTING ILLINI: The Bufs meet the Fighting Illini for the seventh time in program history on Saturday and for the first time since 2013. CU sports a two-game winning streak versus Illinois, beating the Illini by 23 points in their last meeting in Boulder, 79-56 (Dec. 7, 2013). This will be the teams' first meeting in the NCAA Tournament.

NCAA TOURNEY BITES: The Bufs make their first appearance in the postseason tournament since the 2023-24 season, and the program's 17th overall. The Black and Gold have reached three Elite Eights and are 21-16 (.568) in NCAA tournament games. Since the program's inception, Colorado has advanced to eight regional championship games (Sweet Sixteens), 12 second-round appearances, and 16 first-round appearances (two first-round byes). In 2024, the Bufs reached their second Sweet Sixteen in as many years, defeating 12-seed Drake (86-72) and four-seed Kansas State (63-50) in the first and second rounds, respectively. Colorado fell in the round of 16 to top-seeded Iowa, 89-68 (Mar. 30, 2024). The Bufs are 5-8 as the lower seed in March Madness, and 9-12 in games played outside Boulder. See pages 8-10 for more NCAA lore.

LET'S TALK ABOUT 10-SEEDS: Since the NCAA Tourney expanded to 64 teams in 1994 (31 tournaments), No. 10-seeds are 43-81 (.347) in the first round. In 18 of those 31 tournaments, there were two 10-seeds that beat the seven-seed. In 25 of those 31 tournaments, at least one 10-seed beat the seven-seed.

BACK TO NASHVEGAS: The Bufs are playing on Commodore turf for the fifth time in the last 25 years. Three of the last four times Colorado played in Memorial Gymnasium were in 2001 – twice in the NCAA tournament at the end of the 2000-01 season, and once in nonconference play in the 2001-02 season. The Bufs won in their most recent outing in Nashville – a 62-51 victory over Vanderbilt on Dec. 9, 2007.

BIG 12 TOURNEY DIGEST: The Bufs played three Big 12 Tournament games two weeks ago, beating Kansas (55-48, Mar. 5) and No. 20 Baylor (62-53, Mar. 6), and falling by just one point to No. 15 West Virginia (48-47, Mar. 7). After taking on West Virginia, Colorado is 12-16 in Big 12 Tournament play and 43-39 in conference tournament games overall. The Black and Gold have four Big Eight Championships (1989, 1992, 1995, 1996) under their belt, as well as a Big 12 Championship in 1997. This was the Bufs' third time being a six seed in program history, having also been in the 1987 Big Eight Tournament and the 2021 Pac-12 Tournament.

BIG 12 TOURNEY INDIVIDUAL: Wooten led the Bufs in scoring in the Big 12 Tournament, averaging 150 points per game and collecting 45 total points. Walker had the second most points for Colorado in the Big 12 Tourney, finishing with 41 and averaging 13.7 points per game. She also led CU in assists with eight total, 2.67 per game. Dutat led the Bufs in offensive, defensive and total rebounds in the Big 12 Tournament with 11, 14 and 25, respectively, averaging 8.3 per game. Greer shot 52.6% in the Big 12 Tournament, averaging 8.3 points per game and totaling 25. She also had 13 rebounds and six blocks in the tourney. Masogayo had 18 points (6.0 ppg), 15 rebounds (5.0 rbg), four assists, two blocks and two steals.

MILESTONE WATCH: So. F Tabitha Betson has 195 rebounds, five away from 200, and 273 points, 27 away from 300. Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat has 775 points, 25 away from 800. Sr. F Jade Masogayo has 1,296 career points, four away from 1,300. Jr. G Maeve McErlane has 199 points, one away from 200.

MILESTONE CHECK: Jr. G Desiree Wooten reached 1,000 career points against West Virginia in the Big 12 Tournament (Mar. 7), and 300 career rebounds. Jr. G Zyanna Walker reached 900 points in the Big 12 Tournament. Jr. G Maeve McErlane reached 100 rebounds in the Big 12 Tournament. Fr. F Logyn Greer reached 300 career points in the Big 12 Tournament. Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat reached 117 offensive rebounds on the season, setting the program record for offensive boards in a single season (vs. BYU, Feb. 28).

BUFFS (ALMOST) IN THE POLLS: CU is receiving votes in the USA Today/WBCA (33rd) poll for the third week in a row and in the AP poll for the second time this season (29th). The Bufs are 46th in the NET rankings and

41st in the WAB.

ME OH MY OH MASOGAYO: Sr. F Jade Masogayo was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team. Masogayo is ranked 21st in conference for blocks per game with 0.8, and she is 18th for free throw percentage with 75.5%. This marks Masogayo's second All-Conference award in the Big 12 after being named honorable mention at the end of last season. In this season alone, Masogayo averaged 11.2 points, 4.9 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 1.0 steals per game. Additionally, Masogayo had 19 regular season games with double-digit points, and had a stretch of 10 double-digit point games in a row during conference play. She has had at least one rebound and one assist in all but one game this season, and has had five or more rebounds 16 times, as well as having three or more assists six times.

WALK 'EM DOWN WOOTEN: Jr. G Desiree Wooten received All-Big 12 Honorable Mention. Wooten is ranked 18th in the Big 12 Conference for scoring, averaging 13.3 points per game. She also ranked 20th in free throw percentage, shooting 72.2% from the line, and tied for 19th in assists per game with 2.6. Wooten scored double-digit points off the bench in 24-of-30 regular season games this season, and tied her career high in points with 25 against BYU (Feb. 28). In all but one game, Wooten recorded at least one assist, including three or more assists in 11 games. She also grabbed at least one rebound in every conference game except one, with four or more rebounds in seven games.

DEFENSE!: Named to both the Big 12 All-Defensive Team and All-Big 12 Honorable Mention, Jr. G Zyanna Walker is third overall in the conference with 67 steals in 30 regular season games played. Walker is tied for fourth overall in the conference with 2.1 steals per game. She is ranked 22nd in the conference in free throw percentage with 68.5%. This is Walker's second All-Defensive Team selection, as well as second in the Big 12, having earned it at the end of last season at Kansas State. This season, she has had five or more steals three times and four or more steals six times. Walker also averaged 42.3% from the field this season.

BIG 12 FROSH: Fr. F Logyn Greer was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team. Greer had 15 regular season games this season with double-digit points and recorded a double-double against Miami (OH) with 12 points and 12 rebounds. She has also recorded at least one assist in 21 regular season games, has grabbed at least one rebound in all but two games, and finished with five or more rebounds in 17 games. Greer has shot 45.4% from the field and has averaged 9.3 points, 4.9 rebounds, 1.2 assists and 0.6 steals per game. Greer is 22nd in conference for blocks per game with 0.7.

BIG 12 STATS RANKINGS: Sr. F Jade Masogayo is ranked 21st in conference for blocks per game with 0.8, and she is 18th for free throw percentage with 75.5%. Jr. G Desiree Wooten is ranked 18th in the Big 12 Conference for scoring, averaging 13.3 points per game. She also ranked 20th in free throw percentage, shooting 72.2% from the line, and tied for 19th in assists per game with 2.6. Jr. G Zyanna Walker is tied for fourth overall in the conference with 2.1 steals per game. She is ranked 22nd in the conference in free throw percentage with 68.5%. Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat leads the Big 12 in offensive rebounds per game (3.9) and total offensive rebounds (128), and she is tied for second in conference for rebounds per game (8.1). Fr. F Logyn Greer is 22nd in conference for blocks per game with 0.7.

BIG 12 POWS: Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat (Cesson, France/Lyceé Victor Hugo) was named to the Big 12 Women's Basketball Starting Five as a Top Performer this week, the Conference announced Tuesday, Feb. 17. Dutat earns her first conference weekly recognition of her career, and her first in the Big 12, as well as the Buffs' third in the 2025-26 season. This is the 35th conference player of the week (non-freshman) recognition earned by a WBB Buff, which includes honors earned in the Big Eight, Big 12 and Pac-12. Dutat recorded back-to-back double-doubles in her games last week, including a career-high 19 points coupled with 10 rebounds in the Buffs' win over BYU (Feb. 14). She also managed three assists and three steals versus the Cougars. Dutat had 12 points, 13 rebounds, three steals, and an assist in their victory at Houston as well (Feb. 11). These double-doubles were her fifth and sixth this season, 11th and 12th of her career. Last week, Dutat averaged 32.3 minutes per game, 55.6% from the field, 11.5 rebounds per game, 15.5 points per game and 3.00 steals per game. This is the first time in program history that the Buffs have been awarded three consecutive conference weekly honors, and it's the first time doing so with three different athletes. Last week, senior forward Jade Masogayo was awarded Big 12 Women's Basketball Starting Five Top Performer as well for her performances against then-No. 20 West Virginia and then-No. 14 TCU (Feb. 4, Feb. 8). The week prior, junior guard Zyanna Walker was awarded Big 12 Women's Basketball Starting Five Top Performer as well for her performances against her former school, K-State, and Kansas (Jan. 29, Feb. 1).

BIG 12 BUFFS: In its second year back in the Big 12, Colorado was finished sixth in the conference. Colorado is **120-156 (.435)** overall in Big 12 conference play. The Buffs boasted an **11-7** record in conference play this season, and they were a six-seed in the conference tournament. CU finished the 2025-26 regular season 11-7 and sixth overall in conference (picked to finish ninth in preseason poll).

WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER: As a team, the Buffs are second in the Big 12 for offensive rebounds per game (13.2), third for rebounding margin (6.9), sixth for scoring defense (60.7), sixth for rebounds per game

ASSISTED BY: The Buffs have had double figures in assists in all but five games this season. CU has had 20 or more assists three times -- 20 versus Boise State (Nov. 18), 20 against Arizona (Dec. 31), and 20 at Houston (Feb. 11). Colorado is averaging 13.8 assists per game as a team.

GIMME THAT!: Colorado has had 17 games this season with 10 or more steals as a team, averaging 9.5 steals per game.

FIGURE THAT: Four Buffs scored in double-figures against the Lady Raiders (Feb. 21), the 16th time this season CU has had four or more players with double-digit points. The Buffs are 13-3 in games where four or more players are in double-digits. Versus then-No. 20 Texas Tech, Jr. G Zyanna Walker had 18 points, Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat had 11 points, Jr. G Desiree Wooten had 16, and Fr. F Logyn Greer had 13.

ONE OF THE FEW: CU is one of 20 teams in the country to have 21-plus wins in each of the last five seasons (If Columbia wins in its WBIT game on Mar. 19, CU is one of 21 teams).

ROLLING DEEP: The Buffs have seen six different starting lineups through the 24 games so far this season, with 10 of the 14 rostered players seeing starts.

STACKED SCHEDULE: During the nonconference schedule, the Buffs saw opponents from eight conferences outside of the Big 12: ACC, A-10, Big Sky, CAA, MAC, Mountain West, WAC and SEC. CU finished nonconference play with a 9-3 record, ending on a four-game win streak.

PORTAL PROWESS: Colorado introduces five transfer to the 2025-26 roster in Jr. G Zyanna Walker (Kansas State), Jr. G Desiree Wooten (North Texas), Jr. G Claire O'Connor (Gonzaga), Jr. G Maeve McErlance (DePaul) and Sr. F Anaëlle Dutat (Rhode Island).

BABY BUFFS: The Buffs welcome five new freshmen to the squad this season in G Erianna Gooden (Fork Smith, Ark./Northside H.S.), C Jade Cook (Albury, Australia/Basketball Australia Center of Excellence/Lake Ginninderra College), G Isa Hämäläinen (Lorentzweiler, Luxembourg/European School of Luxembourg 1), F Logyn Greer (HometownLansdowne, Pa./Friends' Central School) and F Sophie Zadel (San Antonio, Texas/Alamo Heights H.S.).

NEW TO THE HERD: The Colorado Buffalo coaching staff made the addition of Jordynn "Jojo" Hernandez for the 2025-26 season. Hernandez is the newest assistant coach for the Black and Gold. Hernandez joins the Buffaloes bench after spending the last two seasons as an assistant at Stephen F. Austin. Prior to SFA, Hernandez spent two years at UT Arlington, starting as a graduate assistant during the 2021-22 season. She was promoted to the Director of Player Development for the 2022-23 season, and prior to coaching, was an athlete at UTA.

RETURNING BUFFS: The Buffs return three others besides Sr. F Jade Masogayo from last year's roster-- So. G Kennedy Sanders, 5th C JoJo Nworie and So. F Tabitha Betson. Sanders started in one and played in 29 games for the Buffs last season, making her CU debut at Wyoming on Nov. 4, 2024. She registered her first career start against Baylor (Feb. 19, 2025) and scored a season-high 18 points against Houston (Feb. 15, 2025). Sanders averaged 4.9 points, 2.3 assists and 1.7 rebounds on the season, and she averaged 9.7 points, 3.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists in the Big 12 Tournament. She also had a season-high six assists at Texas Tech (May 1, 2025). Nworie saw action in 10 games for CU, making her Colorado debut against Southern Utah on Dec. 7, 2024. She averaged 2.5 points per game on the season. Betson played in 30 games for the Buffs and started in 13, averaging 5.4 points per game and 1.3 assists per game. She totaled 163 points, 115 rebounds, 39 assists, 16 steals and 10 blocks in her freshman campaign (2024-25). She also had double-digit points four times -- 10 against Southern University (Nov. 17), 11 against Texas Tech (Feb. 2), 15 at Utah (Feb. 12) and 16 against Arizona (Mar. 6).

#0 GOODEN: Fr. G Erianna Gooden is not the only athlete in her family. Gooden's dad attended Kansas State, where he played football. Alongside basketball, Gooden also competed in football, track and field and wrestling. Gooden plans to pursue a professional career after graduating. Off the court, Gooden also enjoys reading and cooking.

#1 WALKER: Transfer Jr. G Zyanna Walker highlights her most thrilling sports moment as beating Iowa at Iowa when they were ranked top-5 in the nation. Walker's mom was also an athlete -- Patricia ran cross country and track at Cloud Country College in Kansas and

#2 SANDERS: So. G Kennedy Sanders' big brother, Peyton, played football at Southwest Minnesota State. Beyond basketball, Sanders has multiple hobbies, including traveling, hiking, running, being on the lake and spending time with family and friends. After basketball, Sanders would like to be a chiropractor.

#3 WOOTEN: Transfer Jr. G Desiree Wooten is looking forward to her first season with the Buffs. Wooten chose CU for its great culture, development opportunities and new beginnings. Wooten hopes to own or start multiple clothing brands after CU.

#4 NWORIE: 5th C JoJo Nworie is stoked about her second season as a Buff. A fun fact about Nworie is that she can speak four different languages. After graduation, Nworie plans to continue her basketball career professionally.

#7 O'CONNOR: Transfer Jr. G Claire O'Connor had an incredible sophomore year at Gonzaga, accumulating 261 points, 118 rebounds and 42 assists. O'Connor is excited for her first year as a Buffalo and to make an immediate impact on the court.

#8 CROOK: Fr. C Jade Crook, from Albury, Australia, is one of three international players for the Buffs. Crook is not the only basketball powerhouse in the family. Her dad played basketball at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh and played in NBL1 and SEABL. Crook's biggest sports hero is Lauren Jackson because they grew up in the same town and she has played alongside and against her.

#10 HÄMÄLÄINEN: Fr. G Isa Hämäläinen is a freshman guard for the Buffs from Lorentzweiler, Luxembourg. Hämäläinen competed on the Luxembourg Youth National Team from U14-U18. She helped Luxembourg win the silver medal in the 2023 U18 European Championship, which was the first medal for Luxembourg. A fun fact about Hämäläinen is that her favorite artist is Bad Bunny.

#11 GREER: Fr. F Logyn Greer is excited for her first year with the Buffs and is most proud of her 1,000 career points and McDonald's All-American nomination in high school. Dutat transferred to CU this fall and is pursuing a degree in Biomedical Engineering. In high school, one of her biggest accomplishments was being a member of the U18 France championship team twice.

#17 BETSON: So. F Tabitha Betson returned to the Buffs towards the end of nonconference games. After spending some much-needed time at home, Betson was on the CU the bench against Miami (OH) in her first game back -- coming in for seven minutes versus the RedHawks. In 2024-25, Betson was the Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year, and prior to her time at CU, she represented Australia in the U17 World Cup (2022). In high school, she was ranked No. 48 in ESPN's Top 100 for the class of 2024 and she was a McDonald's All-America nominee.

#22 ZADEL: Fr. F Sophie Zadel's dad attended Wake Forest University for football before being drafted to the National Football League by the Dallas Cowboys in 1998. Zadel's dad passed down his love of sports to her as she not only played basketball, but also competed in cheer and track growing up. Outside of sports, Zadel was in orchestra for nine years, where she played the violin.
