

THE MATCHUP:

Series History

- Vanderbilt leads all time 3-2 in a series that began in 2017 with an 11-7 Commodore victory in Conway, South Carolina
- The two teams last meet in the regular season of 2025 with Vanderbilt earning a 19-7 win on the road where Nancy Halleron and Molly Krestinski each recorded four goals
- This will be the third contest in Music City and Vandy is 1-1 overall at The Plex

The Opponent

- Coastal Carolina is 5-2 on the season, coming off a 13-9 victory at Brooks Stadium behind Gabrielle Beaudet who scored four goals. Beaudet scored the game's first goal just 59 seconds into the contest and added another less than two minutes later to help Coastal take a 3-1 lead after the first quarter
- The Chants lead the ASUN in scoring defense and save percentage while are second-best in score margin

Scouting Report

- Alexandra Horn has a team-high 30 points off 15 goals and 15 assists for the Chants. Horn leads the conference in assists and is 29th nationally in the category
- Sophie Kingsborough tied for team-lead with 15 goals off 22 shots on target while picking up eight draw controls. Kingsborough leads the conference with free position percentage (.625) and ranks 29th nationally in the category
- Nikki Seven leads the way with nine caused turnovers and has added 10 goals and 10 assists for 20 points for the Chants in seven games of action
- Charlotte Sadler has earned the start in goal for every game this season, posting 50 saves with a .467 save percentage which leads their conference

STORYLINES:

Putman Named Midfielder of the Week

- The American Conference released its weekly honors, highlighted by Vanderbilt freshman Gabby Putman who was named midfielder of the week on Monday afternoon
- In two games this week, Putman won 12 draw controls, including tying a career best with nine in the Commodores' 11-8 win over Eastern Michigan. In the same contest, the Cicero, New York, native picked up three ground balls and caused a turnover after scoring her third career goal. At Ohio State, Putman dished an assist and had three draws

Last Time Out

- Kate Tyack led all scorers with four goals as Ohio State defeated Vanderbilt 16-4 on Saturday afternoon at Ohio State Lacrosse Stadium in a game that was suspended due to inclement weather. Vanderbilt (3-4) struck first after Bailey Lower scored in the first few minutes but the Buckeyes went on to score three consecutive to take an early 3-1 lead. Molly Krestinski and Lower each added another goal in the first quarter before Tyack registered a first-quarter hat trick
- Brooke Baker added Vandy's final goal in the fourth quarter off a free position attempt. Baker collected a game-high tying three ground balls and caused a turnover. On the circle, Gabby Putman and Kiera Runski each registered three draw controls
- Ohio State (5-2) had eight different scorers, with four players tallying multiple goals. Abby Boyle tallied a game-high

Draw DOMINATION

- During the Dores game against Cincinnati, there were multiple school records:
 - On the draw, Kiera Runke set a new single game school record, winning 14 draw controls. Brianna Gross was the previous record holder with 11 in a single game and Gross holds the career record of 282
 - As a team, the Commodores won 22 draw controls, topping the previous team record of 20 which was set against Coastal Carolina in 2023

Goals on goals on goals

- During Vandy's performance against Cincinnati, the Commodores posted 22 goals which is the 12th time in program history with at least 22 goals and the most since 2019
- Graduate Nancy Halleron posted seven goals for the first time in her career, tying the third best single game record with Bri Gross who reached the feat in 2020, its also the most goals an individual scored since then
- Sophomore Bailey Lower had six scores, also a career best, tying herself for fifth most in a single game

A New Draw Queen in Town

- Freshman Gabby Putman put on a show in the Commodores' 14-11 win over Mercer on Wednesday afternoon finishing with not only her first career goal but tallying nine draw controls in the win

Preseason Honors

- Graduates Brooke Baker and Nancy Halleron along with junior Alex Gladding were unanimously named All-Conference Preseason Team
- Baker, who was named all-conference first team last season, had the third-most goals with 41 and dished a career-high eight assists for the second-most points on the team at 49. The graduate picked up 29 ground balls, won 25 draws and caused nine turnovers during the regular season. The Raleigh, North Carolina, native was named AAC Midfielder of the Week twice during 2025 and honorable mention once
- Gladding, named 2025 all-conference second team, was named AAC Defensive Player of the Week on Tuesday, helped anchor a defense that picked up 281 ground balls and caused 135 turnovers. The native of Pompano Beach, Florida, scored her first collegiate goal this season and dished out two assists
- After missing the 2024 season due to injury, Halleron scored a career-best 43 goals off 62 shots on frame and dished four assists to total 47 points, third-most on the team. Halleron received weekly honorable mentions five times after scoring 16 goals during conference play to earn an all-conference second team selection
- Out of the seven teams in the conference, Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth while James Madison, South Florida and East Carolina were picked ahead of Vandy, respectively, by the coaches

 - Logan Risenhoover (second season captain)
 - Nancy Halleron (first season captain)
 - Alex Gladding (first season captains)

Additions to the Staff

- Vanderbilt lacrosse head coach Beth Hewitt announced the addition of Morgan Barlow to her coaching staff on in July of 2025. Barlow will join the program as an assistant coach, draw specialist coach and assist in player development
- Barlow comes to Vandy after spending the last three seasons at Lindenwood where she served as the team's

defensive coordinator and draw specialist coach as the program transitioned to Division I

- In her time with the Lions, Barlow coached some of the most elite draw specialists in the country, including Ryleigh Cavanaugh, who set Lindenwood's single-season draw control record (169), single-game record (19) and average draw control wins per game record (9.39). Cavanaugh finished the season ranked No. 1 in the ASUN Conference and No. 7 nationally in total draw control wins
- Prior to Lindenwood, Barlow had a two-year stint at Saint Michael's College where she served as an assistant coach before being elevated to the interim head coach. Some of Barlow's responsibilities included managing all recruiting efforts, planning and executing practice plans, providing individual instruction to draw specialists and coordinating team travel
- The Gloucester, Massachusetts, native began her collegiate playing career at Roanoke College, where she was named Rookie of the Year by both the Virginia Sports Information Directors and Old Dominion Athletic Conference. She also landed on the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association All-Chesapeake Region second team while netting 24 goals with 23 draw controls. Barlow helped the Maroons go 6-2 in the ODAC and earn a postseason berth

New Faces, New Season

- Ahead of the 2026 season, the Commodores welcomed new faces including a nine-person recruiting class and:
 - Francie Taylor, Regan Torrisi, Cora Betten, Gabby Putman, Hayden Miller, Gianna Frieri, Cristina Love and Waters Lloyd
- Additionally, the Commodores welcome transfer Chloe Bethea-Jones who spent her first two seasons at Syracuse

The Canadians with the Bling

- Junior duo Avery Morton and Morgan White spent their offseason representing Canada Lacrosse at the 2024 World Lacrosse Women's U20 Championship in Hong Kong
- After winning the B Pool, Team Canada advanced to the championship game against the United States. The Canadians fell in the finals to earn a Silver Medal
- In Hong Kong, Morton posted the eighth-most points of all participants throughout the tournament, finishing with 28 points off 19 goals and nine assists. White posted 14 points off 11 goals and three assists

One Medal Wasn't Enough for White

- Following the events in Hong Kong, Morgan White was also apart of the inaugural Women's Box Lacrosse Championships with Lacrosse Canada in Utica, New York this past fall
- Lacrosse Canada came away with a silver medal against the US in the finals
- Morgan White posted seven points off three goals and four assists in the tournament



Each star represents one of the **three** head coaches in program history and is a nod to the **three** stars on the Tennessee flag.





An integral part of Vanderbilt lacrosse for more than a decade, Beth Hewitt was named the program's third head coach on Aug. 7, 2018.

At Vanderbilt, Hewitt has honed a culture synonymous with consistent performance on the field and lifelong growth for the student-athletes who choose to be Commodores.

On the field, Hewitt's teams have ended an 11-year NCAA Tournament drought, played for the American Athletic Conference title for the first time in program history and regularly challenge for postseason play in the most competitive era in Division I women's lacrosse.

Hewitt led the Commodores to a winning record in her first season as head coach, ending a stretch of nearly a decade without one. Entering 2026, she's led the Commodores to five non-losing records in six full seasons. It's just the second time the program maintained that level of consistency across six seasons in its 30-year history.

Hewitt has coached 13 first-team all-conference honorees and nearly 30 all-conference selections in all. In 2022, Bri Gross and Gabby Forina became the first Dores to earn All-America recognition in the same season since 2010.

Focused on developing elite lacrosse players and well-rounded individuals ready for lifelong success, Hewitt has been innovative in leveraging Vanderbilt's collaborative culture. For instance, she formed a leadership counsel in which student-athletes receive mentorship from retired U.S. Army Brig. Gen. Scott Brower, who leads Vanderbilt's Bass Military Scholars program. Vanderbilt student-athletes have been named to the IWLCA Academic Honor Roll on more than 70 occasions in Hewitt's times as head coach.

Prior to being named head coach, Hewitt served as Vanderbilt's associate head coach from 2014-18.

Hewitt received her first head coaching job in 2009 when, not yet 30, she led Le Moyne through the NCAA reclassification process and made the Dolphins a Division II national power.

During her five seasons at Le Moyne, Hewitt compiled an impressive record of 71-20 (.789) with a 43-5 (.896) mark in Northeast-10 Conference action. She guided the Dolphins to two Final Fours, including the first in school history, three NCAA Tournaments, two Northeast-10 regular season championships and conference tournament titles.

After graduating from North Carolina with a degree in communication studies, Hewitt helped launch Oregon's Division I lacrosse program in 2005. She spent three years at Oregon, holding the title of defensive coordinator in addition to helping recruit the program's first classes. Hewitt also earned a master's degree in educational leadership during her time in Eugene.

An All-American and All-ACC selection during her college career as a mid-fielder at North Carolina, Hewitt led the Tar Heels to a conference title and an NCAA Final Four appearance. She led the Tar Heels in scoring in each of her final two seasons.

In 2021, the Liverpool, N.Y. product was inducted into the Upstate Lacrosse Foundation Hall of Fame.

Hewitt has also worked extensively with Ameriprise Financial as a recruiter, Harrow Sports Inc. in the field of consulting, and with Brine in the area of marketing and sales.
