**Weekend Preview:** Vanderbilt travels to the Bluegrass State to face Kentucky for a three-game series beginning Friday.

- Vandy leads the all-time series 159-152-5 since 1905 and is 45-20 against the Wildcats in regular-season games under head coach Tim Corbin.
- The Commodores own a 20-12 record in Lexington under Corbin.
- Vanderbilt swept Kentucky at home last season but the Wildcats won two of three games in Lexington in 2024.

**Power Surge:** Vanderbilt has hit 81 home runs this season, surpassing last season's total of 66.

- The Commodores rank second in DI and have homered in all but seven games.
- Vanderbilt's .960 team OPS ranks 13th in DI.
- The program record for home runs in a season was set in 2019 with 100. This year's total is the most since the team hit 92 in 2021.
- Vanderbilt has hit five grand slams, already surpassing last season's total.
- Vandy's seven homers in the win over North Dakota State on March 6 was the most in a game for the Dores since 2018.

**Be Like Mike:** Mike Mancini leads the team and is 12th in the SEC in OPS at 1.142.

- In SEC play, he is hitting .321 with a league-leading eight home runs. His 18 RBI is fourth in the SEC and he is fifth in walks with 13.
- On the season, the senior is 13th in the SEC in slugging and ninth in walks.
- Mancini is tied for the team lead in home runs with 12 and leads the team in stolen bases with 11 in 11 attempts.

**Turning Two:** Vanderbilt has turned 34 double plays this season, more than any SEC team and 11th in DI.

**Brooks Wallace Award Watch List:** Ryker Waite was named to the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List on March 4.

- Waite is one of 100 shortstops on the list. He is hitting .301 this season with 15 extra-base hits, 26 RBI and a team-leading 31 walks.
- Defensively, Waite has 8.26 defensive runs saved, good for eighth nationally among shortstops according to D1Baseball's Synergy Leaderboard.
- Waite's 33 walks are fourth in the SEC, 36th in DI.
- The award honors the nation's top shortstop and will be presented by the College Baseball Foundation later this year.

**Walk This Way:** Vanderbilt's 218 walks rank 14th among DI programs.

- **Ryker Waite** leads the team with 33 walks.
- Second on the team is **Logan Johnstone** and **Mike Mancini** with 29. Waite is fourth in the SEC while Johnstone and Mancini rank ninth.
- After drawing 10 walks last season, **Brodie Johnston** has already surpassed that total as a sophomore, currently sitting at 21.

**Brodie Barrels:** Brodie Johnston leads the SEC in hits and is third in doubles.

- The sophomore has 14 two-baggers this season. He leads the team in total bases (104), good for fourth in the SEC and 20th in DI.
- He has a team-leading 18 multi-hit games this season including one four-hit performance and seven three-hit games.
- Defensively, Johnston has 8.38 defensive runs saved, good for seventh nationally among third basemen according to D1Baseball's Synergy Leaderboard.
- Johnston's 15 long balls in 2025 were the most by a Vanderbilt freshman since Pedro Alvarez hit 22 in 2006.
- He was named MVP of the 2025 SEC Tournament as a freshman.

**Barczy Bombs:** Colin Barczy belted three home runs in the season-opener against No. 10 TCU to become the first Commodore since Connor Kaiser in 2018 with a three-homer game.

- Barczy's homers traveled a combined 1,340 feet with each surpassing 430 feet.
- After missing time due to injury, Barczy again hit three home runs in a game at Texas A&M on April 2 to become the first Commodore in program history with multiple three-home run games.
- All six of his homers this season have come in two games, both in the state of Texas.

**TGoodi on the Mic:** In just 33 at-bats in SEC play, Tommy Goodin has hit five home runs.

- In SEC contests, Goodin ranks second in slugging and seventh in home runs.
- The sophomore has eight homers on the season in just 82 at-bats.
- With Vanderbilt trailing Tennessee by three runs in the ninth on March 29, Goodin launched a pinch-hit grand slam to lead the Dores past the Vols.
- A musician off the field, Goodin's walk-up music is self-made.

**Maldo Mash:** Chris Maldonado hit his first home run since 2023 on March 4 against Troy.

- Maldonado then left the yard in each of the following two games. He also hit a pinch-hit, 3-run homer in Vandy's win over No. 13 LSU on March 14.
- The senior missed the majority of the past two seasons due to injuries.

**SEC Freshman of the Week:** Wyatt Nadeau was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on March 16.

- Nadeau earned his first collegiate win in just his second start, shutting down LSU over seven innings on March 14.
- The freshman totaled 10 strikeouts and only allowed one run over the first six innings of his outing.

**SEC Player of the Week:** Braden Holcomb was named the SEC Player of the Week on Feb. 24.

- The center fielder hit .579 (11-for-19) over five games with five extra-base hits and 10 RBI.
- Holcomb belted three home runs and a pair of doubles to slug 1.158. He also scored nine times and worked three walks in 19 at-bats.
- Holcomb had four multi-hit games and helped power Vandy to four consecutive run-rule wins.

**Longest Active Tournament Streak:** Vanderbilt owns DI's longest active NCAA Tournament appearance streak at 19, making every postseason since 2006.

- There are seven players on this year's roster who were not yet born the last time Vandy didn't make the tournament.

**The 2026 VandyBoys:** Vanderbilt's 2026 roster features 23 returners and 16 newcomers.

- Seventeen states and two countries are represented on the roster. Tennessee leads the way with eight Commodores followed by California with five and Georgia with four.
- There are three graduate students, two seniors, 11 juniors, 14 sophomores and nine freshmen on the squad.
- Of the 16 newcomers, seven transferred in during the offseason.
- Former Commodore **Jason Esposito** returned to Nashville in the offseason as the program's new hitting coach. Esposito played under Tim Corbin from 2009-11 before being selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the third round of the 2011 MLB Draft. He most recently worked in the Cleveland Guardians organization as the MLB assistant hitting coach.

**Unrivaled Consistency:** Since head coach **Tim Corbin** took charge in 2003, no program has enjoyed more consistent success than the Commodores.

- Vanderbilt owns the nation's longest active NCAA Tournament streak at 19 consecutive appearances.
- Vandy has been to the College World Series five times, the finals four times and has won it all twice (2014, 2019).
- More than 50 Commodores have been named All-America, including 18 first-teamers.
- Corbin has tutored more than 30 future MLB players.
- Corbin reached 1,000 career wins on March 5, 2024, vs. Eastern Michigan. He recorded his 900th Vandy win on March 16, 2024, vs. Auburn.
- Among active D1 coaches, Corbin ranks sixth by most wins. He is second in the SEC behind Arkansas' Dave Van Horn (1,329).
- The Dores were crowned SEC Tournament Champions in 2025 for the third time in the last six tournaments. Four of the program's five SEC Tournament titles have come under Corbin.

**The Fennell Factor:** Preseason All-American **Connor Fennell** was one of the most electric pitchers in all of college baseball in 2025.

- Fennell totaled 84 strikeouts over 53.1 innings to just 11 walks. The righty struck out 40-percent of the batters he faced, good for third-best in Division I.
- Fennell allowed just one run over his final four outings, working 14 scoreless frames against Tennessee, Kentucky, Tennessee at the SEC Tournament and Louisville in the NCAA Regional.
- He tossed a seven-inning, complete-game shutout at Ole Miss, posting 12 strikeouts to earn SEC Pitcher of the Week.
- Fennell received Third Team All-America honors from the NCBWA and was Second Team ABCA All-Region.

**Preseason Honors:** Multiple Commodores received recognition ahead of the 2026 season.

- **Connor Fennell** was selected to two preseason All-America teams, garnering third-team honors from both D1Baseball and the NCBWA.
- **Fennell** and **Braden Holcomb** were each voted by the league's coaches to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team.
- **Miller Green** and **Alex Kranzler** were named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List.

**MLB Opening Day:** Eight former Commodores made their respective club's Opening Day rosters.

- Walker Buehler (Padres), Sonny Gray (Red Sox), Jack Leiter (Rangers), Austin Martin (Twins), Bryan Reynolds (Pirates), Kumar Rocker (Rangers), Dansby Swanson (Cubs) and Mike Yastrzemski (Braves) all started the 2026 season in The Show.
- Vanderbilt is tied for third-most alums on MLB active rosters.

**Dores in the Draft:** Seven Commodores heard their names called in the 2025 MLB Draft, highlighted by three Dores selected in the first three rounds.

- There have been multiple Commodores taken in every draft since 2004 with six or more players being selected in five consecutive drafts.
- All-time, Vanderbilt has more than 200 players selected in the MLB Draft including an NCAA-leading 158 since 2003.
- Vandy's 81 draft picks since 2015 also leads all collegiate programs.
- With four pitchers taken in the 2025 draft, more than 80 Commodore arms have been drafted since 2003.

**Upgrades to The Hawk:** Construction at Hawkins Field began in the fall to expand and upgrade spaces and amenities at the home of the two-time national champions.

- In total, the Hawkins Field footprint will encompass approximately 50,000 square feet of new or enhanced space, including student-athlete resources, additional capacity, premium seating and expanded food and beverage options.
- The project also prioritizes player development, with more than 10,000 square feet devoted to a new weight room and pitching lab.
- During the construction, the right field fence has been temporarily moved in while also being heightened. The temporary dimensions are 320 feet down the line and 360 feet in right-center.

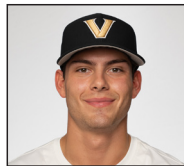

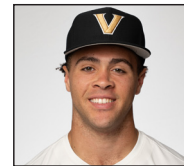
