Last Time Out

The Pirates fell on the road to Virginia Tech, 14-10, on Tuesday afternoon.

The Pirates threw the first punch in the game, leading 5-4 after what was a terrific opening 15 minutes of lacrosse. That period was bookended by ECU goals; first on a Sarah Goodison buzzer-beating effort, then on a customarily impressive solo effort from Kayla Wilkes—more on her later.

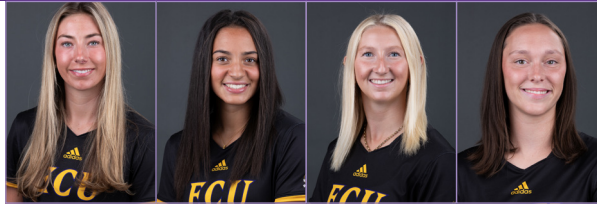
Then there was that second quarter. Four goals for Virginia Tech, and ECU simply couldn't buy one. The team fired six shots in the period, only one fewer than the Hokies, and three of them were on goal, but none of them found the net. For Tech, Lauren Render led the way with a pair of scores in that period.

Into the second half, the Pirates were able to get back within a goal on Rachel Chesscock and Riley Matthiesen tallies but were answered by another pair of Virginia Tech goals which made the third quarter a wash. Each team put up two goals on three shots on goal in the third to send the teams into the fourth quarter with the math looking much the same as it had coming out of the halftime locker room.

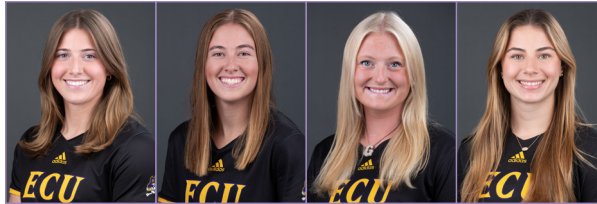
This time, ECU did not have an answer. Virginia Tech scored the first two goals of the period, its run broken up only by a Katelyn Sclafani goal before putting two more on the board for what was a 14-8 run with 5:44 to play after Cassandra Montgomery scored the Hokies' final goal of the day.

Wilkes gave ECU one last gasp attempt at a comeback with two more goals. The Pirates even won the draw control after her last goal with 2:44 remaining—the team fared well on the draw on Tuesday with a 15-11 margin—but were unable to get the goal to cut the deficit to three as the ensuing possession ultimately resulted in a turnover.

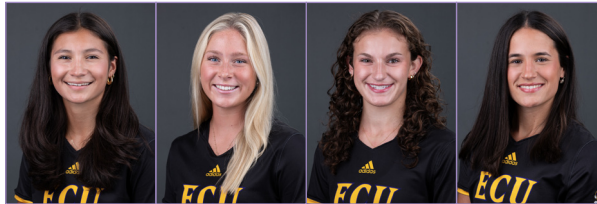

On Vanderbilt...

The Commodores enter the game at 6-6 and 2-0 in American Conference play after a dominant 16-7 win over Charlotte last Saturday. On the year, Vanderbilt is led offensively by Shea Panzik's 33 points on 17 goals and 16 assists, pacing four players with 20-or-more points. Defensively, Alex Gladding's 17 caused turnover leads four players with 10-or-more CTOs and has a team high 19 ground balls as well. Gabrielle Putnam leads the team on the draw with 71 draw controls. As a team, the Commodores rank near the top of the conference in most categories, including draw control percentage in which they rank 28th nationally at .571.

O Captain, My Captain

Bella Askey, Rachel Chessock, Emma Magazu and Kayla Wilkes have been named Team Captains for the 2026 season. All four are first-time captains.

Preseason Accolades

The Pirates cleaned up on preseason honors this year, having two players earn preseason Player of the Year nods for the first time with Kayla Wilkes being named Preseason Midfielder of the Year and Jaime Behar being named Preseason Goalkeeper of the Year. They were joined on the Preseason All-Conference team by Emma Magazu and Rachel Chessock. Magazu and Wilkes were unanimous selections.

First-Place Vote

For the first time in program history, the Pirates earned a first-place vote in the American Conference Preseason Poll.

In The Community

As a team, the Pirates logged 595.5 hours of community service in the fall.

Aspire

Assistant coach Kaelin Hogan graduated from the IWLCA's Aspire Program this spring. According to the organization, "The IWLCA Aspire program was designed to enhance coaches' professional skills, capabilities, and self-awareness through the dynamic blended learning approach."

National Lead

The Pirates are currently first in the NCAA in turnovers per game with just 8.44 giveaways per game (as of 3/30).

League Leading Magazu

Emma Magazu leads the American Conference in ground balls per game with 3.20 per game.

Dual Threat

Kayla Wilkes is currently second in the American conference in caused turnovers per game at 2.20. Wilkes is also 10th in the conference in goals per game with 1.90.

Kayla Wilkes

Put up four goals, one assist, three draw controls, three caused turnovers and three ground balls against Virginia Tech. It was a unique stat line which she had never quite done in her career. It was her 11th career game with a hat trick and three draw controls, but the first of her career also adding three caused turnovers.

Wilkes is the third player in program history with a hat trick and 3+ each of draw controls, ground balls and caused turnovers (Ellie Bromley 2x; Nicole LeGar). She is the second with 4+ goals and 3+ draw controls, ground balls and caused turnovers (Bromley, 3/23/22; 4 G, 5 GB, 3 CTO, 5 DC).

The Program



Head Coach Brittany Dipper

Brittany Dipper was named head coach of the East Carolina lacrosse program on July 21, 2023.

The Pirates took a major leap forward in Dipper's second season. The team finished with an overall record of 7-10 while setting a program record for American Athletic Conference wins with a 4-2 mark in league play. In so doing, the Pirates made the 2025 conference tournament where they faced South Florida. The team made a habit of playing close games on the year with eight one-goal games, nearly working their way to an even better record. The Pirates broke several records on the year, including single season assists (92), single game draw controls (21) and single game caused turnovers (17).

In 2025, Dipper also guided several individuals to historical accolades. Emma Magazu and Kayla Wilkes became the first ECU players ever to win player of the year honors as they were named American Defensive Player of the Year and American Midfielder of the Year, respectively. Both players were named unanimously to the All-Conference First Team while four other players earned Second-Team nods. Additionally, Magazu became just the third player in program history to earn IWLCA All-Region honors with South Region Second Team recognition.

In Dipper's first season at the helm for the Pirates, the team compiled a 4-12 final record while breaking numerous records along the way, including the program's single-season ground ball record and many individual career marks. Dipper helped guide three players to All-Conference recognition with Caroline Kimel taking First-Team honors and Ellie Bromley and Alexandra Giacalone taking Second-Team accolades. Throughout the season, individuals were also named to the AAC Weekly Honor Roll on eight occasions.

Dipper came to Greenville after stops at Elon, Boston, and Virginia.

Dipper began her coaching career at Stetson after an illustrious playing career at the University of Maryland. She played four years in goal for the Terrapins, helping the team to four-straight ACC titles, four-straight Final Four appearances and the 2010 NCAA Championship. The Clarksboro, N.J., native also racked up her fair share of individual accolades including being named the IWLCA, Synapse Sports and WomensLax.com National Goalkeeper of the Year in 2011 while leading the nation in goals against average (6.54) and save percentage (.522).

The Staff

Assistant Coach **Sierra Cockerille**

Cockerille joins the Pirates after two seasons at UMBC where she helped the Retrievers earned consecutive berths in the American East Conference Championships.

Prior to UMBC, Cockerille concluded a decorated career as a midfielder at Syracuse. With the Orange, she finished with 76 career goals and 53 career assists in 73 games played, earning All-American recognition as a senior. Outside of her collegiate career, Cockerille is a member of the Haudenosaunee Women's National Team.

Assistant Coach **Kaelin Hogan**

Hogan came to ECU in Nov. 2023 after a stop at her alma mater, Roger Williams University, where she was a standout performer as a player.

At RWU, Hogan helped guide the team to three consecutive Commonwealth Coast Conference Tournament titles and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2021, '22 and '23. Hogan also helped coach RWU players to IWLCA All-American honors in 2021 and 2023, the first two All-American recognitions in program history.

Assistant Coach **Alexandra Giacalone**

Giacalone was named as an assistant coach in May 2024. She joined the Pirates coaching staff after an illustrious playing career in Purple and Gold. She finished her time on the field as the program record holder in career caused turnovers (90) and ground balls (146) in 67 games played, starting 65.

On the field, Giacalone was a three-time All-Conference performer and along with Caroline Kimel was one of the first two East Carolina lacrosse players named to the IWLCA All-Region team.
