Weekend Preview: Vanderbilt concludes the regular season with a three-game home series against South Carolina beginning Thursday.

- Vanderbilt trails South Carolina 41-65 all-time. The home team has won each of the last four series with the Commodores winning two of three in both 2021 and 2023 in Nashville.

Brodie Barrels: Brodie Johnston is sixth in the SEC in hits, eighth in total bases, fifth in doubles and eighth in runs scored.

- Johnston also ranks top-45 in the SEC in batting average, home runs, RBI and slugging.
- He was ranked as the No. 3 third baseman in D1Baseball's Week 12 position rankings.
- He has a team-leading 21 multi-hit games this season including one four-hit performance and eight three-hit games.
- Defensively, Johnston has 11.58 defensive runs saved, good for sixth nationally among third basemen according to D1Baseball's Synergy Leaderboard.
- Johnston's 15 long balls in 2025 were the most by a Vanderbilt freshman since Pedro Alvarez hit 22 in 2006.
- He was named MVP of the 2025 SEC Tournament as a freshman.

Be Like Mike: Mike Mancini has hit nine home runs in SEC games, fifth-most in the league.

- In SEC play, he ranks 20th in RBI, fourth in stolen bases, 34th in slugging and is 16th in OPS.
- For the season, Mancini leads the team in stolen bases with 18 on 18 attempts and is second in OPS at 1.056. His 39 walks lead the team and rank fifth among SEC batters.
- Mancini is the first Commodore since Jeren Kendall in 2017 with 15 or more home runs and 15 or more stolen bases.

Holc Smash: Braden Holcomb leads Vanderbilt in doubles with 17 and is second in home runs with 14.

- Holcomb's 72 hits is tied for fourth in the SEC. He ranks third in doubles and 11th in RBI.
- His 21 multi-hit games are tied for first on the team and his 12 multi-RBI games is second.
- Holcomb was ranked as the No. 24 outfielder by D1baseball in their Week 12 position rankings.

Power Surge: Vanderbilt has hit a program record 106 home runs this season.

- The Commodores rank fifth in DI and have homered in all but 11 games.
- Vanderbilt's .927 team OPS ranks 20th in DI.
- Vandy's seven homers in the win over North Dakota State on March 6 was the most in a game for the Dores since 2018.

Brooks Wallace Award Semifinalist: Ryker Waite was named one of 50 semifinalists for the Brooks Wallace Award on April 22.

- He is hitting .299 this season with 20 extra-base hits, 36 RBI and 38 walks.
- Defensively, Waite has 12.59 defensive runs saved, good for fourth nationally among shortstops according to D1Baseball's Synergy Leaderboard.
- His 38 walks are second on the team and seventh in the SEC.
- The award honors the nation's top shortstop and will be presented by the College Baseball Foundation later this year.

Walk This Way: Vanderbilt's 282 walks rank 27th among DI programs and fifth in the SEC.

- Mike Mancini's 39 walks lead the team and rank fifth in the league. Ryker Waite is second with 38 walks, seventh-most in the conference. Logan Johnstone's 37 walks rank eighth.
- After drawing 10 walks last season, Brodie Johnston has surpassed that total as a sophomore, currently sitting at 30.

Strong Side: Vanderbilt has arguably the nation's best defensive duo on the left side of the infield.

- Brodie Johnston (3B, 11.58) and Ryker Waite (SS, 12.59) each rank top-10 in defensive runs saved for their respective positions according to D1Baseball's Synergy Leaderboard.
- D1Baseball ranked Johnston as the No. 3 third baseman in their Week 12 position rankings while Waite came in at No. 25 for shortstops.

Korbin Cannon: Freshman catcher **Korbin****Reynolds** has thrown out 15 runners on the basepaths this season on just 33 attempts.

- He leads all SEC catchers in runners caught stealing. His 10 runners caught on 27 attempts in SEC contests also leads the league.

TGoodi on the Mic: In just 71 at-bats in SEC play, **Tommy Goodin** has hit seven home runs.

- In SEC contests, Goodin ranks 16th in home runs.
- The sophomore has 12 homers on the season in just 131 at-bats.
- With Vanderbilt trailing Tennessee by three runs in the ninth on March 29, Goodin launched a pinch-hit grand slam to lead the Dores past the Vols.
- A musician off the field, Goodin's walk-up music is self-made.

Turning Two: Vanderbilt has turned 44 double plays this season, more than any SEC team and 25th in DI.**Barczy Bombs:** **Colin Barczy** belted three home runs in the season-opener against No. 10 TCU to become the first Commodore since Connor Kaiser in 2018 with a three-homer game.

- Barczy's homers traveled a combined 1,340 feet with each surpassing 430 feet.
- After missing time due to injury, Barczy again hit three home runs in a game at Texas A&M on April 2 to become the first Commodore in program history with multiple three-home run games.
- Six of his 11 homers this season have come in two games, both in the state of Texas.
- Barczy has left the yard five times in his last 10 games played

SEC Freshman of the Week: **Wyatt Nadeau** was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on March 16.

- Nadeau earned his first collegiate win in just his second start, shutting down LSU over seven innings on March 14.
- The freshman totaled 10 strikeouts and only allowed one run over the first six innings of his outing.

SEC Player of the Week: **Braden Holcomb** was named the SEC Player of the Week on Feb. 24.

- The center fielder hit .579 (11-for-19) over five games with five extra-base hits and 10 RBI.
- Holcomb belted three home runs and a pair of doubles to slug 1.158. He also scored nine times and worked three walks in 19 at-bats.
- Holcomb had four multi-hit games and helped power Vandy to four consecutive run-rule wins.

The 2026 VandyBoys: Vanderbilt's 2026 roster features 23 returners and 16 newcomers.

- Seventeen states and two countries are represented on the roster. Tennessee leads the way with eight Commodores followed by California with five and Georgia with four.
- There are three graduate students, two seniors, 11 juniors, 14 sophomores and nine freshmen on the squad.
- Of the 16 newcomers, seven transferred in during the offseason.
- Former Commodore **Jason Esposito** returned to Nashville in the offseason as the program's new hitting coach. Esposito played under Tim Corbin from 2009-11 before being selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the third round of the 2011 MLB Draft. He most recently worked in the Cleveland Guardians organization as the MLB assistant hitting coach.

Unrivaled Consistency: Since head coach **Tim Corbin** took charge in 2003, no program has enjoyed more consistent success than the Commodores.

- Vanderbilt has been to 20 of the last 22 NCAA Tournaments including 19 consecutive appearances since 2006.
- Vandy has been to the College World Series five times, the finals four times and has won it all twice (2014, 2019).
- More than 50 Commodores have been named All-America, including 18 first-teamers.
- Corbin has tutored more than 30 future MLB players.
- Corbin reached 1,000 career wins on March 5, 2024, vs. Eastern Michigan. He recorded his 900th Vandy win on March 16, 2024, vs. Auburn.
- Among active D1 coaches, Corbin ranks sixth by most wins. He is second in the SEC behind Arkansas' Dave Van Horn (1,338).
- The Dores were crowned SEC Tournament Champions in 2025 for the third time in the last six tournaments. Four of the program's five SEC Tournament titles have come under Corbin.

Dores in the Pros: Eight former Commodores made their respective club's Opening Day rosters.

- Walker Buehler (Padres), Sonny Gray (Red Sox), Jack Leiter (Rangers), Austin Martin (Twins), Bryan Reynolds (Pirates), Kumar Rocker (Rangers), Dansby Swanson (Cubs) and Mike Yastrzemski (Braves) all started the 2026 season in The Show.
- Spencer Jones was called up to the Yankees in May, becoming the 37th big leaguer under Tim Corbin.
- Vanderbilt is tied for third-most alums on MLB active rosters.

The Fennell Factor: Preseason All-American **Connor Fennell** was one of the most electric pitchers in all of college baseball in 2025.

- Fennell totaled 84 strikeouts over 53.1 innings to just 11 walks. The righty struck out 40-percent of the batters he faced, good for third-best in Division I.
- Fennell allowed just one run over his final four outings, working 14 scoreless frames against Tennessee, Kentucky, Tennessee at the SEC Tournament and Louisville in the NCAA Regional.
- He tossed a seven-inning, complete-game shutout at Ole Miss, posting 12 strikeouts to earn SEC Pitcher of the Week.
- Fennell received Third Team All-America honors from the NCBWA and was Second Team ABCA All-Region.

Preseason Honors: Multiple Commodores received recognition ahead of the 2026 season.

- **Connor Fennell** was selected to two preseason All-America teams, garnering third-team honors from both D1Baseball and the NCBWA.
- **Fennell** and **Braden Holcomb** were each voted by the league's coaches to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team.
- **Miller Green** and **Alex Kranzler** were named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List.

Dores in the Draft: Seven Commodores heard their names called in the 2025 MLB Draft, highlighted by three Dores selected in the first three rounds.

- There have been multiple Commodores taken in every draft since 2004 with six or more players being selected in five consecutive drafts.
- All-time, Vanderbilt has more than 200 players selected in the MLB Draft including an NCAA-leading 158 since 2003.
- Vandy's 81 draft picks since 2015 also leads all collegiate programs.
- With four pitchers taken in the 2025 draft, more than 80 Commodore arms have been drafted since 2003.

Upgrades to The Hawk: Construction at Hawkins Field began in the fall to expand and upgrade spaces and amenities at the home of the two-time national champions.

- In total, the Hawkins Field footprint will encompass approximately 50,000 square feet of new or enhanced space, including student-athlete resources, additional capacity, premium seating and expanded food and beverage options.
- The project also prioritizes player development, with more than 10,000 square feet devoted to a new weight room and pitching lab.
- During the construction, the right field fence has been temporarily moved in while also being heightened. The temporary dimensions are 320 feet down the line and 360 feet in right-center.

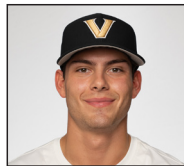

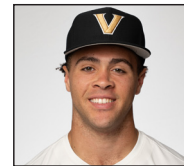
